REPORT OF VIEWERS.

To the Honorable, the Judges of the Court of Quarter Sessions of Cambria County Pennsylvania.

We, the undersigned members of the Board of Viewers of Cambria County, appointed by your Honorable Court upon the attached order, for the purposes therein stated, respectfully report:

That having given due notice of the view and of the time and plave of meeting of the viewers, to the Commissioners of Cambria County and to the Supervisors of Cambria Township by having them accept service of notices hereto attached and to the public by printed handbills posted in public and conspicuous places at and near the termina; and in the neighborhood of the piece of goad to be viewed: All of us met in accordance with the notices so given, and having been first duly qualified according to law to perform the duties of our appointment faithfully, impartially and to the best of our judgment; we proceeded to view the piece of road referred to in the attached order andthen adjourned to a later day to take what ever testimony the parties interested might have to offer, of which adjournment they had due notice, and accordingly we again met, in tz the Court House at Ebensburg and heard all the testimony relative to the matter in question, which the parties had to offer; and after carefully viewing the road and hearing and considering the testimony offered, We are of opinion that the road in question is not necessary for a public road and should be vacated.

NOTE. "It shall be the duty of all persons appointed in the several counties of this Commonwealth to view and review any public or private road or bridge, if they shall decide in favor of locating said road or bridge, to endeavor to procure from the person or persons over whose land such location may be made releases from all claims for damages that might arise from the opening of such road or the building of such bridge; and in every case where said viewers shall fail to procure such releases, and it shall appear to them that any damages will be sustained, it shall be their duty to assess the damages and make report thereof signed by a majority of their number, and return the same, together with all releases obtained, to the Court of Quarter Sessions, and the damages so assessed shall be conclusive, or may be subject to appeal, review or modification, as may be provided by existing laws in the different counties of this Commonwealth."

"The persons appointed as aforesaid shall view such ground, and if they shall agree that there is occasion for a road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance, and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the petitioners."
