

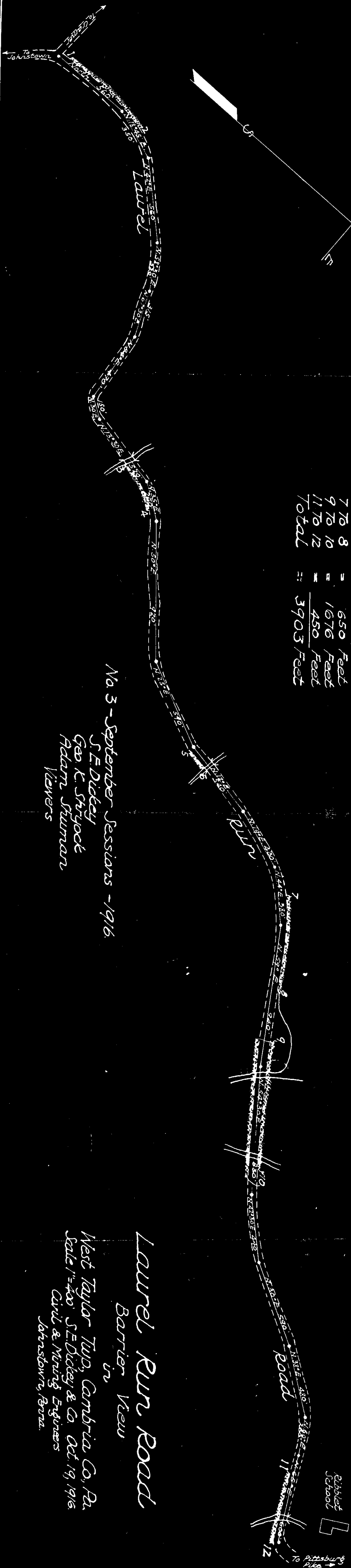

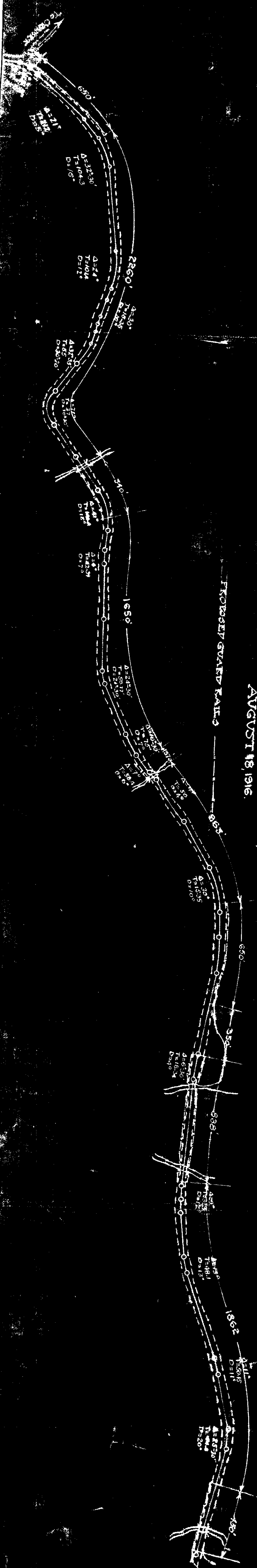

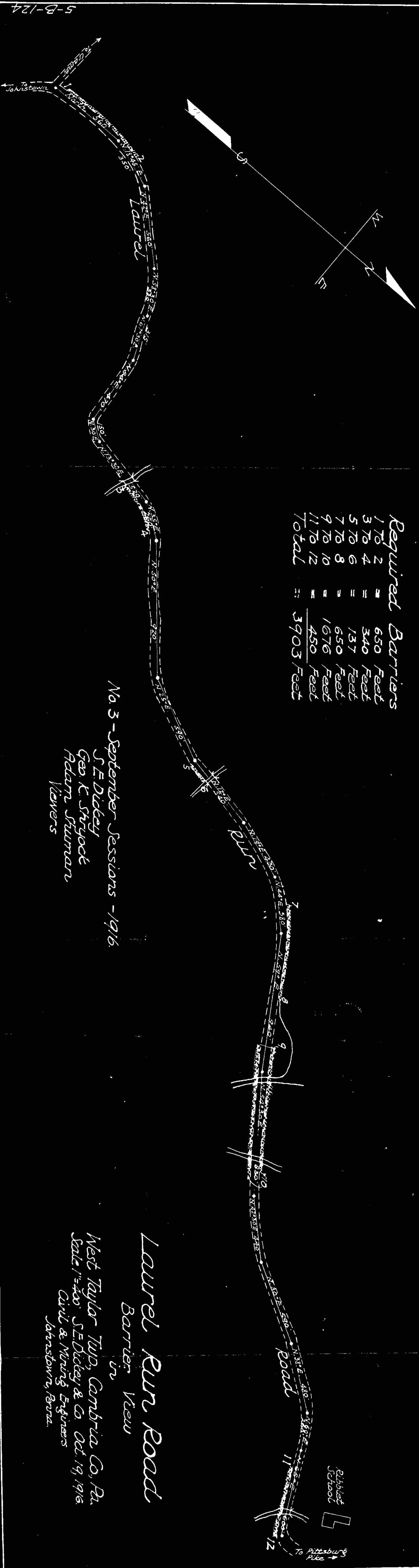

Sealed with our seals. Dated the day of August, in the year of our Lord, One thousand, nine hundred and sixteen (1916).

WHEREAS, the Obligors above named as Supervisors of the Township of West Taylor in said County of Cambria, are about to have presented to the Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace in and for the County aforesaid, their Petition praying for the appointment of a Jury to View and to report on the necessity for guards or barriers to be erected for the protection of the traveling public upon that part of the Laurel Run Road in said Township of West Taylor which begins at the point marking the intersection of the said Laurel Run Road with the Cramer Pike and ends at the point marking the intersection of same with the Red Run Road at the Riblett School House, etc.,

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CONDITION OF THIS OBLIGATION IS SUCH, that if the above bounden Obligors, their heirs, executors or administrators, or any of them shall and do well, truly and promptly pay into the Treasury of said Obligee, when said proceedings are concluded, such amount of money as the said Court may hereafter by order lawfully direct the Petitioners aforesaid to pay, for, toward or on account of defraying and discharging the pay or compensation and mileage of said Viewers and other persons, appointed or employed in said proceedings, as required by the Act of the General Assembly of Pennsylvania, in such case made and provided, without any fraud or further delay, then the above obligation to be void, or else to be and remain in full force and virtue.

REPORT

To the Honorable the Judges of the above mentioned court;
We the undersigned viewers appointed by the annexed order of the court to view the road within mentioned, respectfully report; That we have been duly sworn as members of the permanent board of viewers as shown by the records of the court, that having given due public notice of the said view and of the time and place of meeting of the viewers by posting notices along the route and at the termini of said road as required by law and by service of such notices on the Commissioners of Cambria County and the Supervisors of West Taylor Township, evidence of which is shown by the copies of said notices hereto attached. We met in accordance with the notice given on the 10th day of October A. D. 1916 at 10 o'clock A. M. and proceeded with the duties of our appointment. We viewed the site and location for proposed guard rails or barriers making a personal inspection of the points mentioned in the within order and find same to be very abrupt, banks or precipices and steep slopes. A representative of the Supervisors and others were present and heard.

After due consideration of all the matter before us we are of the opinion that guard rails or barriers are necessary at the points indicated on the map attached hereto and made a part hereof as follows:

1 to 2	-	650	feet	
3 to 4	-	340	"	
5 to 6	-	137	"	
7 to 8	-	650	"	
9 to 10	-	1676	"	one-half on either side of road
11 to 12	-	450	"

The location of the above barriers is definitely shown by courses and distances shown on the above mentioned blue prints. In our opinion the guard rails or barriers recommended by us are of such public necessity that the township should have assistance in the erecting of same by the County.

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Cambria held at Ebensburg, in the said County, on the fourth day of September, A. Shryock and Adam Shuman, viewers to view the ground and road for proposed guards or barriers, and if they view the same, and shall agree that there is occasion for such guards or barriers along said road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance at points suggested along the said road for such guards or barriers, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be as far as practicable, agreeable to the desires of the petitioners, and that they make a report of their proceedings to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said County, stating particularly whether they judge the same guards or barriers along said public road necessary, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, and references to the improvements through which it may pass.
