formerly of David Ketner in Summerhill Township, has become
inconvenient in its present location, and is very injurious
to private property, and would better answer the ends of the
public, by being changed, so as to begin and end at same
points by adopting other ground for the same, from below the
Saw Mill of David E. Davis to the house of Patrick Storm."
