At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Cambria held at Ebensburg, in the said County, on the Seventh day of August A. D. 1917, before the Honorable Judge of the said Court: Upon the petition of divers inhabitants of the Township of Susquehanna, in the said County, setting forth that they labor under inconvenience for want of a Public to be vacated and supplied ~~road or highway, to be laid from~~
That a public road has long since been laid out and opened, leading from Barnesboro to Cherrytree by way of Shazen, and usually known as Johnston Hill road; that a part of said road through the said Township of Susquehanna, beginning at a point in said road 1800 feet southwardly from the public road leading from Emeigh Run to Plattsville and ending at a point 1700 feet southwardly from the public road leading from Garmantown to Plattsville, has become inconvenient and burdensome because of a very steep grade, and the said road would be much improved by a change of its route between said points

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law. The Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

surveyor, and

Adam Shuman and J. D. Ritter

viewers, to view the ground proposed for said road, and if they view the same, and shall agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be as far as practicable, agreeable to the desires of the petitioners, and that they make a report of their proceedings to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said County, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, and references to the improvements through which it may pass.

NOTE. "It shall be the duty of all persons appointed in the several counties of this Commonwealth to view and review any public or private road or bridge, if they shall decide in favor of locating said road or bridge, to endeavor to procure from the person or persons over whose land such location may be made releases from all claims for damages that might arise from the opening of such road or the building of such bridge; and in every case where said viewers shall fail to procure such releases, and it shall appear to them that any damages will be sustained, it shall be their duty to assess the damages and make report thereof signed by a majority of their number, and return the same, together with all releases obtained, to the Court of Quarter Sessions, and the damages so assessed shall be conclusive, or may be subject to appeal, review or modification, as may be provided by existing laws in the different counties of this Commonwealth."

"The persons appointed as aforesaid shall view such ground, and if they shall agree that there is occasion for a road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance, and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the petitioners."

"The viewers, as aforesaid, shall make report at the next term of said Court, and in the said report shall state particularly: First, who of them were present at the view, second, whether they were severally sworn or affirmed; third, whether the road desired be necessary for a public or private road; they shall also annex and return to the Court a plot or draft thereof, stating the courses and distances, and noting briefly the improvements through which it may pass; and, whenever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said roads at an elevation not exceeding five degrees (except at the crossing of ravines and streams), where, by moderate filling and bridging, the declination of the road may be preserved within that limit."

REPORT OF VIEWERS.

To the Honorable, the Judges of the Court of Quarter Sessions of
Cambria County, Pennsylvania.

We, the undersigned members of the board of viewers of Cambria County, appointed by your honorable Court; upon the attached order; and therein directed to view and determine as to the propriety of vacating and supplying a certain piece of public road in Susquehanna township, said county and state, respectfully report:-

That having given due notice of the view and of the time and place of meeting of the viewers, to the Commissioners of Cambria county and the Supervisors of Susquehanna township by having them accept service of notices hereto attached, and to the traveling public by printed hand bills posted in public and conspicuous places at and near the terminal points of the roads to be viewed; and having been first duly qualified according to law to perform the duties of our appointment faithfully impartially and to the best of our judgment and ability; all of us met at the time and place appointed, in accordance with the notices so given and having carefully viewed the premises are all of the opinion that the whole piece of road as represented on the plot or draft, hereto attached and made apart of this report, between points marked "A" and "C" should not be vacated and a new road supplied instead thereof; but that that portion of the road between points marked "A" and "C" which is comprised between points "A" and "B", and which takes the following courses and distances, viz: N. 28° E. 170 ft., N. 42° E. 700 ft., N. 39°45' E. 272 ft., N. 41°05' E. 255 ft., N. 88° E. 90ft., N. 59° E. 89 ft., N. 4°30' W. 178 ft., N. 8° E. 206 ft., N. 23° 50' W. 194 ft., N. 22°30' W. 278 ft. and N. 6° E. 196 ft., should be vacated and instead thereof the piece of road taking the following courses and distances, viz: S. 30°30' W. 205 ft., S. 63°30' W. 252 ft., S. 23° W. 85 ft., S. 17° 30' W. 54 ft., thru and over land of Miss. Clara Johnston and S. 7° 30' W. 438 ft., S. 13° 30' W. 472 ft., S.

20° 35' W. 256 ft., and S. 24° 25' W. 676 ft. thru and over lands of Norris Swank and the Swank School property, should be supplied.

Having failed to obtain releases of damages we have assessed damages to Norris Swank in the sum of One Hundred Dollars and to Miss Clara Hohnston Forty Dollars damages.

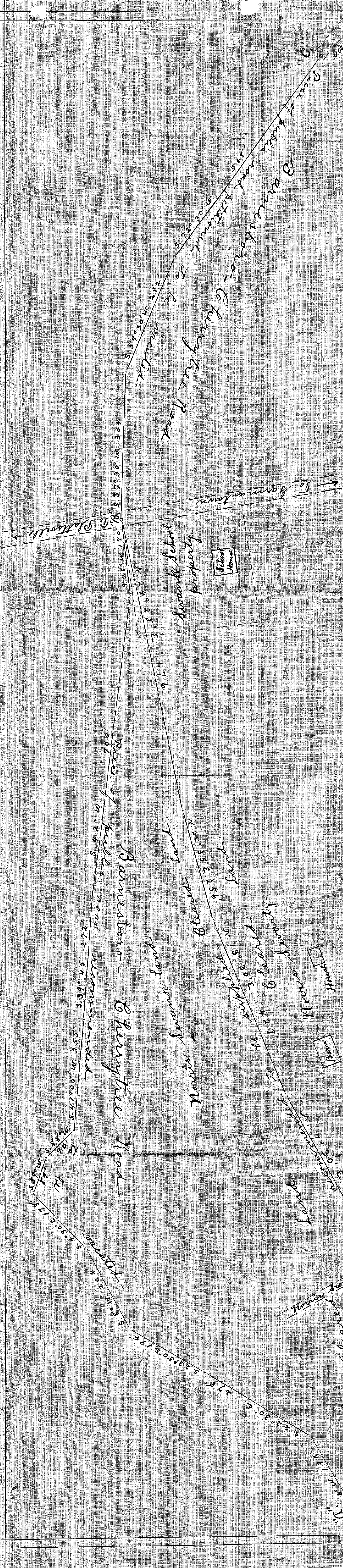
