To the Honorable the Judges of the Court of Quarter Sessions for the County of Cambria:-

The undersigned inhabitants of Franklin Borough, East Conemaugh Borough, and the townships of Conemaugh & Taylor, Respectfully represent:-

That a report of viewers locating a bridge over the Conemaugh river between the boroughs of Franklin and East Conemaugh, ^{formerly Tylerman,} is now pending in said Court. We re-monetate against the confirmation of said report, because the location reported by the viewers is not in accordance with the points of location mentioned in the order of Court: and for the additional reason that the place fixed upon for the erection of said bridge is dangerous in reference to the crossing of the Pennsylvania rail road, and will cost a much larger amount of money than a bridge built at the location directed to be viewed by the Order of Court for that purpose: We therefore pray that the Court will refuse to confirm the report of viewers aforesaid.

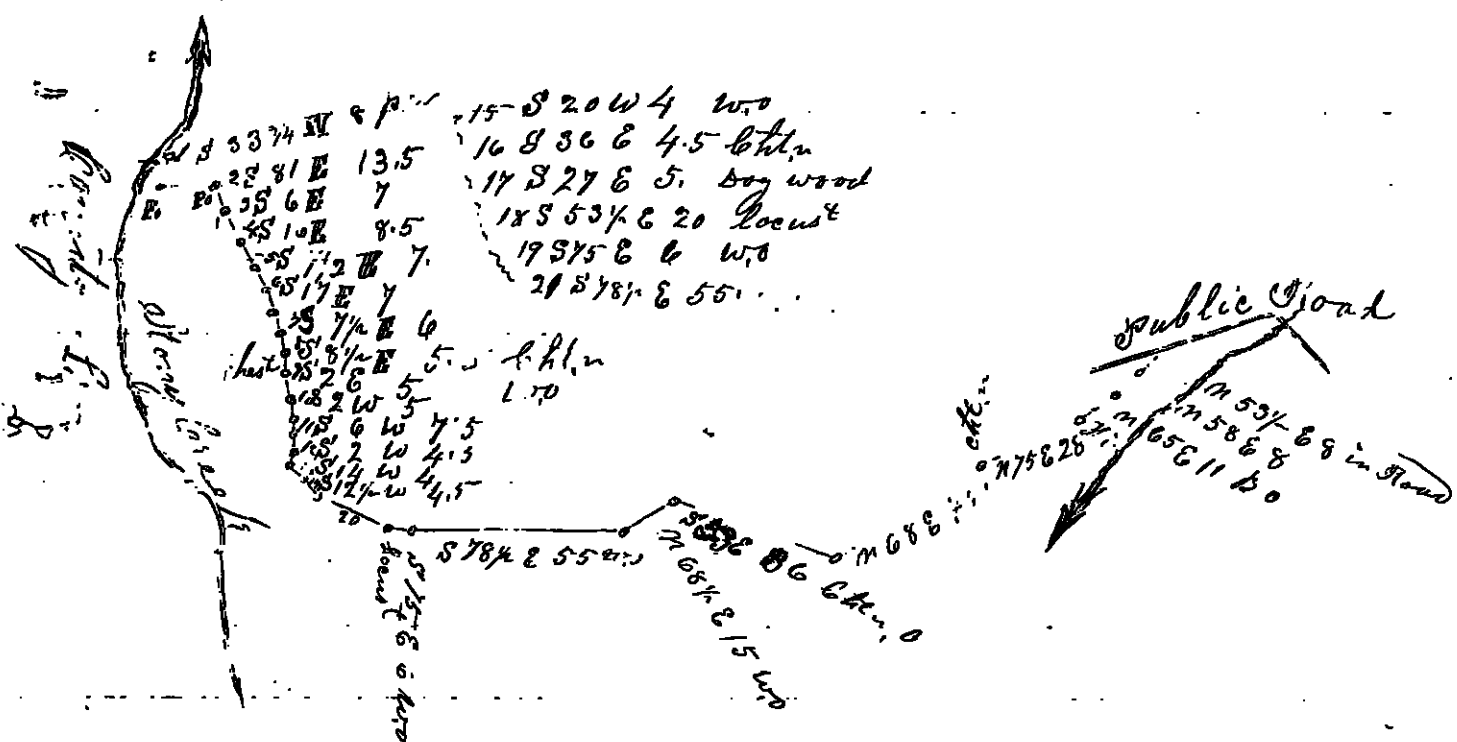
