

IN THE COURT OF QUARTER SESSIONS OF CAMBRIA COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA.

TO THE HONORABLE THE JUDGES OF SAID COURT:

The petition of the undersigned, inhabitants of the Township of Croyle, in the County aforesaid, respectfully represents:-

That they labor under great inconvenience for want of a public road to begin at a point in the Summerhill-Ebensburg road, located by running from the intersection of the Main Line of the Pennsylvania Railroad with the Street in Summerhill Borough, which leads to the said Summerhill-Ebensburg road; thence North $17\frac{1}{2}$ degrees West 222 feet; thence North $68\frac{1}{2}$ degrees East 401 feet; thence North $18\frac{1}{2}$ degrees West 323.5 feet; thence North 3 degrees East 285.4 feet; thence North $5\frac{1}{2}$ degrees East 200 feet; thence North 23 degrees East 522 feet; thence North 5 degrees East 334.5 feet; thence North $5\frac{1}{2}$ degrees East 392.5 feet to the point of beginning, at a small bridge over a stream crossing said Summerhill-Ebensburg road in Croyle Township, in said County, and ending in the same road at a point located by running from the intersection of said Summerhill-Ebensburg road with the public road leading from Wilmore to the Pittsburgh Pike, at a point just North of the New Germany Church, and thence South $15\frac{1}{2}$ degrees West 225.5 feet; thence South 31 degrees West 1,274.5 feet; thence South 25 degrees West 400 feet; thence South 00 degrees 30 minutes East 415 feet; thence South $1\frac{1}{2}$ degrees 655 feet; thence South 7 degrees East 275 feet to the point of ending on the land of the heirs of Philip McCall, in said Township of Croyle, and County of Cambria.

The petitioners therefore pray the court to appoint three persons qualified according to law, to view the ground proposed for such road, and if they see occasion to lay out the same, (to inquire of and vacate the public road now opened,) from a point in the Summerhill-Ebensburg road, located by running from the intersection of the

Main Line of the Pennsylvania Railroad with the Street in Summerhill Borough, which leads to the said Summerhill-Ebensburg road; thence North $17\frac{1}{2}$ degrees West 222 feet; thence North $68\frac{1}{2}$ degrees East 401 feet; thence North $18\frac{1}{2}$ degrees West 323.5 feet; thence North 3 degrees East 285.4 feet; thence North $5\frac{1}{2}$ degrees East 200 feet; thence North 23 degrees East 522 feet; thence North 5 degrees East 334.5 feet; thence North $5\frac{1}{2}$ degrees East 392.5 feet to the point of beginning, at a small bridge over a stream crossing said Summerhill-Ebensburg road in Croyle Township, in said County, and ending in the same road at a point located by running from the intersection of said Summerhill-Ebensburg road with the public road leading from Wilmore to the Pittsburgh Pike, at a point just North of the New Germany Church, and thence South $15\frac{1}{2}$ degrees West 225.5 feet; thence South 31 degrees West 1,274.5 feet; thence South 25 degrees West 400 feet; thence South 00 degrees 30 minutes East 415 feet; thence South $1\frac{1}{2}$ degrees 655 feet; thence South 7 degrees East 275 feet to the point of ending on the land of the heirs of Philip McCall, in said Township, on the line of the proposed road in the Township of Croyle, (which said last mentioned road will, by reason of the laying out of the proposed road become useless, and make report thereof to the next court.
