



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

REPORT OF VIEWERS

To the Honorable, the Judges of the above mentioned Court. We the undersigned Viewers appointed by the annexed order of the above Court to view the road within mentioned, respectfully report.

That we have been duly sworn or affirmed as members of the permanent board of Viewers of Cambria County as shown by the records of the Court, that having given due public notice of the said view and of the time and place of meeting by posting notices as required by law along the route and at the termini of said road to be vacated and by service of such notice on the Commissioners of Cambria County and the Supervisors of East Taylor Township, acceptance of said notice of the Commissioners and Supervisors being hereto attached; that we met in accordance with the notice given on the 17th day of August A. D. 1920 at 1:30 o'clock P. M. and proceeded with the duties of our appointment and viewed the premises and route of the proposed road to be vacated, that we find said proposed road to be vacated has become useless, inconvenient and burdensome to the tax payers.

A plot or draft hereto attached shows the improvements and the owners of adjacent property along the route of said road, said road passing through the property of the Cambria Steel Company and Hiram Ribblett Estate. We were unable to secure a release of damages from the abutting property owners along the route of the portion of the proposed road to be vacated, therefore taking into consideration the damages sustained and the benefits

to be derived by the vacating of said road, we assessed no benefits and no damages to any of the abutting property owners.

During the view on the ground a representative of the Supervisors and the Petitioners were present. Therefore after due consideration of all the matter before us, we are of the opinion that the portion of road proposed to be vacated has become useless, inconvenient and burdensome, therefore we recommend that the prayer of the Petitioners be granted.



viewers, to ^{to be vacated} view the ground proposed for said road, and if they ^{to be vacated} view the same, and shall agree that there is occasion for such road, ^{vacate} they shall proceed to ~~mark out~~ the same, having respect to the shortest distance and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be as far as practicable, agreeable to the desires of the petitioners, and that they make a report of their proceedings to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said County, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, and references to the improvements through which it may pass.

NOTE. "It shall be the duty of the several counties of this Commonwealth to view and review any public or private road or bridge, and decide in favor of locating said road or bridge, to endeavor to procure from the person or persons over whose land such location may be made releases from all claims for damages that might arise from the opening of such road or the building of such bridge; and in every case where said viewers shall fail to procure such releases, and it shall appear to them that any damages will be sustained, it shall be their duty to assess the damages and make report thereof signed by a majority of their number, and return the same, together with all releases obtained, to the Court of Quarter Sessions, and the damages so assessed shall be conclusive, or may be subject to appeal, review or modification, as may be provided by existing laws in the different counties of this Commonwealth."

"The persons appointed as aforesaid shall view such ground, and if they shall agree that there is occasion for a road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance, and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property; and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the petitioners."

"The viewers, as aforesaid, shall make report at the next term of said Court, and in the said report shall state particularly: First, who of them were present at the view, second, whether they were severally sworn or affirmed; third, whether the road desired, be necessary for a public or private road; they shall also annex and return to the Court a plot or draft thereof, stating the courses and distances, and noting briefly the improvements through which it may pass; and, whenever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said roads at an elevation not exceeding five degrees (except at the crossing of ravines and streams), where, by moderate filling and bridging, the declination of the road may be preserved within that limit."
