

To The Honorable The Judges of the Court
of Quarter Sessions for the County of Cambria.

This petition of the Hon. W. M. Storey,
Burgess of the Borough of Johnstown, humbly
represents that the Town Council of said
Borough on the 15th day of December, 1885,
passed the following Ordinance, viz.:

Be it ordained and enacted by the
Burgess and Town Council of the Borough
of Johnstown, and it is hereby ordained and enacted
by authority of the same.

Sec. 1. That a public Alley twelve feet wide,
extending from Railroad Street to the Conemaugh
Borough line, in the Third Ward of the Borough
of Johnstown, called Wakefield Alley, is hereby or-
dained and laid out: That the Southeastern
boundary line of said Alley shall commence at
the intersection of Railroad Street and the
boundary line between the Borough of Conemaugh
and the Borough of Johnstown and extend
along said Boundary line north thirty and
three-fourth degrees east one hundred and
sixty two feet to a Street twenty feet wide
at said Boundary line; That the Northwestern
boundary line of said Alley shall be twelve feet
northwest from and parallel with said
southeastern boundary line.

Sec. 2. That all Ordinances of the Borough re-
lating to Streets and Alleys be and they are hereby
extended to and over said Alley.

Passed finally in Council Dec. 15, 1885.

At a Court of General Quarter Sessions
of the Peace held at Eversham in and
for said County on Monday the first
day of March A.D. 1886 before the
Honorable Judge of said Court.

The Petition of the Burgesses and Jurors Council of
Johnston Borough Respectfully represents; that the Town Council
of said Borough on the 15th December 1885 passed the following
Ordinance to wit;

Be it Ordained and enacted by the Burgesses and
Jurors Council of the Borough of Johnston and it is hereby Ordained
and enacted by the Authority of the same

Section 1. That a public Alley twelve feet wide extending
from Rail Road Street to the Cammerough Borough line in the Third
Ward of the Borough of Johnston, called Wakefield alley is
hereby Ordained and laid out. That the South Eastern
boundary of said alley shall commence at the intersection
of Rail Road Street and the boundary line between the Borough
of Cammerough and the Borough of Johnston, and extend along
said boundary line with thirteen and three fourth degrees East
One hundred and sixty two feet to a street twenty feet wide
at said boundary line. That the North Western boundary line
of said alley shall be twelve feet North West from and
parallel with said South Eastern boundary line.

Section 2. That all Ordinances of the Borough relating to
streets and alleys be and they are hereby extended over said
alley.

Your petitioners therefore pray your Honorable Court to appoint
seven disinterested Free Holders of said Borough, who after
being duly sworn Or affirmed to perform their duties under
the Act of Assembly in such Case made and provided.

with impartiality and fidelity, shall proceed to view the premises described in said Ordinance or Petition, having regard both to the advantages and disadvantages caused to the several properties along the line of and adjoining said Wakefield Alley, and shall assess and allow to all persons injured thereby such damages as they shall have sustained respectively over and above the advantages. And who shall make assessments for Contribution upon all such properties as shall be benefited by the Opening of said Alley, such sums respectively as they may have been benefited over and above all disadvantages. And the said Viewers shall make a Report of their proceedings in coming to the next session of said Court describing the properties upon which Assessments have been made, specifically stating whether for Contribution or for damages, with the amounts respectively.

The Court upon due consideration had of the premises appointed Samuel Lenthart, Jacob Suran, John Stearns, James Quinn, E. Lang, Thomas Gore and John Bradley as Viewers who after giving due and legal Notice of the time and place of meeting shall proceed to view the premises and make full Report of their proceedings as herein prayed for, to the next Court of Quarter sessions of said County, and in which Report they shall state distinctly that they had been sworn as aforesaid according to law.

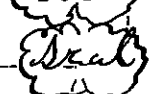

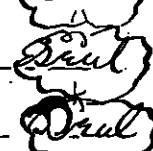

We the Undersigned Viewers Appointed by
the Court of Quarter Sessions of Cumberland
County to assess damages and award contri-
butions by reason of ^{opening and} fixing the width of Wakefield

in pursuance of the ~~said~~ order of said Court, do
report; That having given the owners, or reputed
owners, of lots along and adjoining the boundary
