

Exceptions to the report of reviewers appointed
to review road leading from Peter Gordons in
Susquehanna Township to William Gitting
in Cambria Township. —

1st The reviewers exceeded their authority when they undertook to vacate part of the road and to make a private road of the balance. — especially as they did not state for whose use the private road should be maintained. —

2^d The amended report is vague and uncertain and indefinite inasmuch as it does not name the persons, whom "the road bed is to be graded and kept in repair and fenced on the Western side." now does it indicate who said persons are with sufficient certainty to enable the Court to compel them to perform their duties at the premises, or to enable Michael Kirsch to protect his property. —

3^d The report of reviewers, if confirmed, would result in great injustice to Michael Kirsch, inasmuch as it would compel him to build and keep in repair fences for a private road through his own land, for which road he did not petition, does not need, and which would be injurious to his property and not necessary for the accommodation of others. —

4th The report should be set aside because the reviewers report

W^t. the undersigned, were appointed by the written
order of Court to review the road therin mentioned Respectfully
report, That having given due notice to the land owners along said
road we met at the view of the same and having all been first
duly sworn did view the said road. The courses and distances, we
found as follows: Beginning at a point in the public road near
John G. Beaver's old saw mill, thence on newly cleared land of
Daniel Gray south 62 $\frac{1}{2}$ degrees west 14 rods south 80 degrees east
13 rods south 31 degrees east 14 rods south 58 degrees east 28 rods. Thence
on fields of Thomas Beach south 35 degrees east 22 rods, south 17 $\frac{1}{2}$ de-
grees east 10 rods south 7 degrees east 47 rods, thence on uncultivated and
cleared land of Richard Naylor south 26 $\frac{1}{2}$ degrees east 65 rods, south
20 $\frac{1}{2}$ degrees east 39 rods. Thence on fields of Joseph Lemerier south 10
degrees west 50 rods south 5 degrees west 50 rods. Thence on field
of Michael Kirsch south 31 degrees west 10 rods south 34 degrees west
34 rods and south 8 degrees east to a point in the public road near
the barn of said Michael Kirsch as shown by the annexed draft.

On account of the very small number of Citizens that can be accom-
modated by the aforesaid road we are of opinion that the same is unnec-
essary for a public road. At the same time we believe that part
of said road beginning near the dwelling of Richard Naylor and
running thence to the public road near Mr. Kirsch's barn (as shown by
red lines on draft) is necessary for a private road. And further we
consider that part of said road shown on draft by black lines
and running from the point near J. G. Beaver's old saw mill to a
point near Richards Naylor's dwelling as being injurious to
private property and useless as a public or private road.



NOTE.—“It shall be the duty of all persons appointed in the several counties of this Commonwealth to view and review any public or private road or bridge, if they shall decide in favor of locating said road or bridge, to endeavor to procure from the persons over whose land such location may be made releases from all claims for damages that might arise from the opening of such road or the building of such bridge; and in every case where said viewers shall fail to procure such releases, and it shall appear to them that any damages will be sustained, it shall be their duty to assess the damages and make report thereof signed by a majority of their number, and return the same, together with all releases obtained, to the Court of Quarter Sessions, and the damages so assessed shall be conclusive, or may be subject to appeal, review or modification, as may be provided by existing laws in the different counties of this Commonwealth.”
