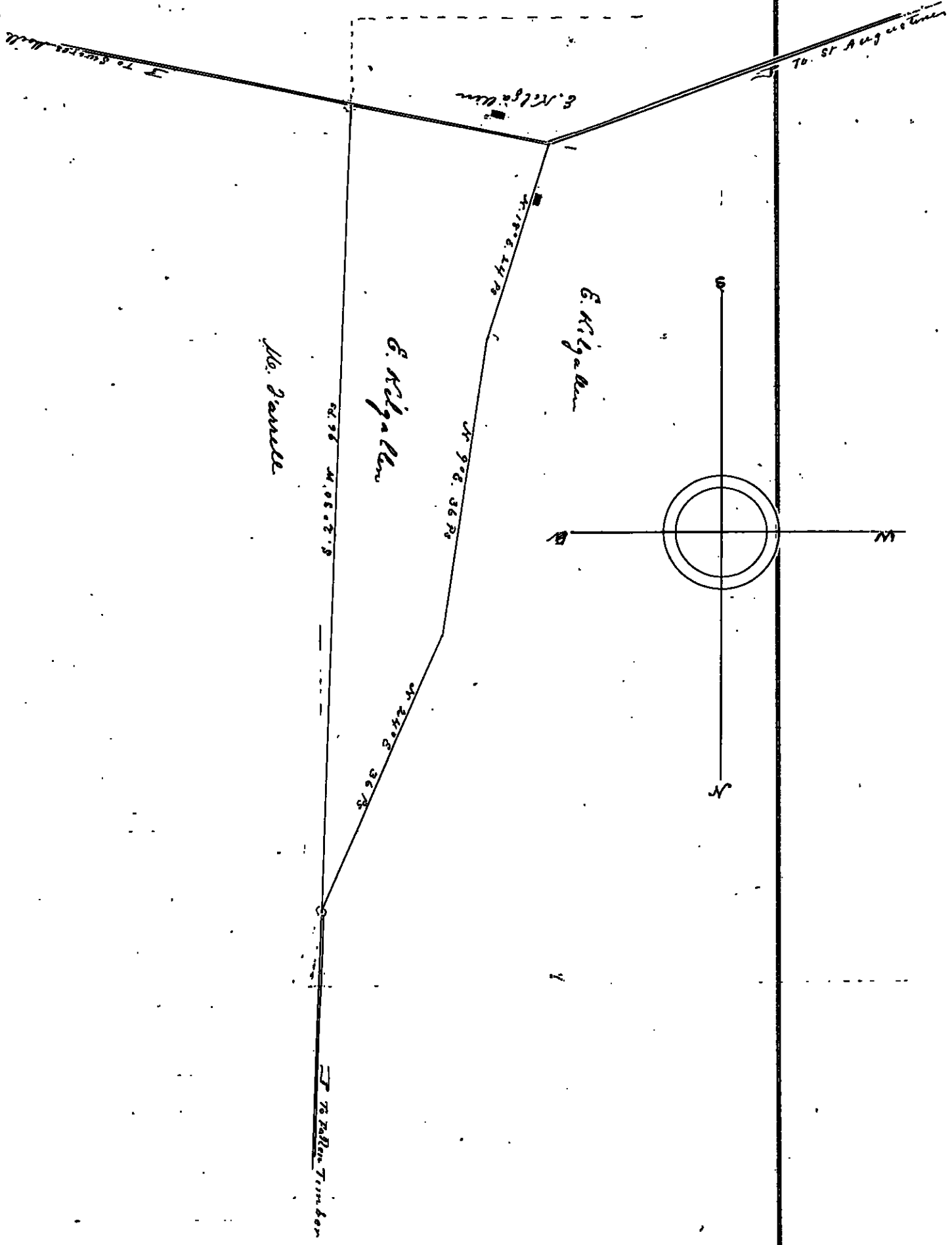

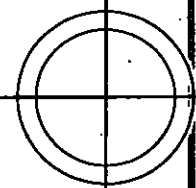

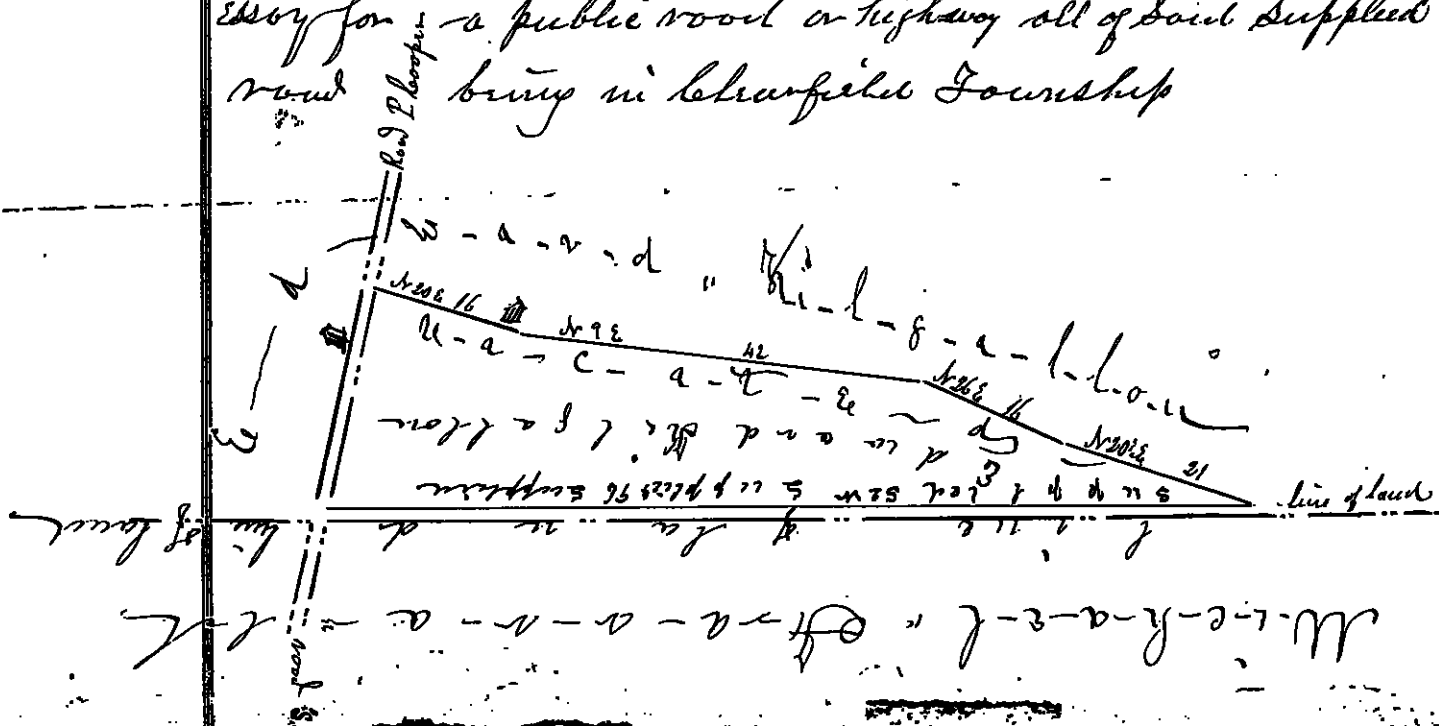

We the undersigned
Jurors appointed by said Court do report that
we gave we gave due and timely notice of the time
and place of review by posting three written notices of
time and place of meeting of the Jurors in three
public places adjacent to said road a copy of
said notice is herewith attached. And we do
further report that having met at time and place
designated by said notices and after all being
first sworn according to law we proceeded to the
discharge of our appointment and did view
and locate the following parts of said road mentioned
in Order of view viz Beginning at a point on road leading
from Philip Coopers to Swains Mills at or near the
residence of Edward Kilgallon in Clearfield Township
thence North twenty degrees East sixteen perches thence North
nine degrees East forty two perches thence North twenty six
degrees East sixteen perches thence North twenty and
one half degrees East twenty one perches to point
near line of land of Edward Kilgallon and Michael James
which above mentioned parts we do locate as adjacent to
lands of Edward Kilgallon and supply the same
as follows in compromise between Edward Kilgallon

and Michael Small viz beginning at a point on road leading from Edward Kilgallon to Hall's Trench on land of Edward Kilgallon thence south two degrees west thirty six perches to Point on road leading from Philip Rogers to Swine Mills this supplied road is laid and buried on land of Edward Kilgallon taking no part of Michael Small's land for said road and by compromise Edward Kilgallon is to receive no damages whatever by reason of opening said road See draft several parts in black and supplied part in red ink which in our opinion is necessary for a public road or highway all of said supplied road being in Clewfield Township
