to law and they will ever pray...

Asd your petitioners would respectfully
further shew that a road has long since
been laid out from the Johnstown Road to
to Beulah bridge which road or part beginning
at a white Oak tree in said Road near the
line of land of Elisabeth Nees and Isaac Mahan
To a point on said Road wher said Road

connects with the road leading from the
Blay-Ride before described being a distance
of about one-half mile which your petitioners
conceive is now become useless and incon-
venient and furthermore to the inhabitants
of said Township being supplied by the proposed
new road therefore your petitioners pray
the court that the said road may be
vacated agreeable to the act of the general
Assembly in such case made and provided
and they will ever pray &c

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To the Honorable judges of the
Court held in Ebensburg for the County
of Cambria, State of Pennsylvania. We the
subscribers, persons appointed by the Court to vacate
and supply a road in Blacklick Township,
do respectfully report, that after giving
due and legal notice of the time and place of meeting,
We met at said place on the 16. day of August 1887.
And having all been sworn or affirmed, proceeded to
view the road to be vacated and the ground for a
supply... in our judgement, believe your ^{petitioners} and nei-
ghbor-hood ^{petit} are laboring under great disadvantage for the
want of the proposed change in the road. We laid
out for a publick road, viz. Beginning at said
White Oak tree, near line of the land Elizabeth Rees
and Isaac Mahan, on road leading from Johnstown road
to Beulah Bridge - running ~~at~~ ^{near} oak tree N 35 E, 16 perches
Thence South 72 E. 26 perches to Maple tree, Thence South 69 E, 13 perches,
Thence S 66 E, 17 perches, Thence North 81 E, 11 perches to a point on
the Beulah and Bettel road ^{near} to Chestnut ^{tree} standing by bars on
Elizabeth Rees's land.

And do recommend the same to be opened for public use. Find annexed a draft of the above described road.

Also Vacated a corresponding portion, the road leading from the Johnstown road beaten to Beulah Bridge, begining at or near said White Oak Tree. - Running South 12° 25 perches Thence, South 9° 11 perches to large rock

Thence, South 86° 75 perches to a point on the road leading from Beulah to Bethel on Clay Pike. We annex a plot or map of road to be vacated

Believing this said portion of the road to be of no practical use to your petitioners or neighbors do recommend that it be vacated as a public road.

We further report that the road laid out for a supply runs through Elizabeth Newland and failed to procure a release from damages, and we assessed damages for the said Elizabeth Rees to the amount of eight dollars.



At a court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Cambria
held at Ebensburg in the said County, on the 27 day of
June A. D. 1817, before the Honorable the Judges of the same
court: Upon the petition of divers inhabitants of the township of Blacklick
in the said county, setting forth that they labor under inconvenience for want of a
road or highway, to lead from
they labor under great inconvenience for want of a
public road or highway to lead from the public road
laid out from Johnstown road to Burmah Bridge at or
near a White Oak tree in said road near the line of
land of Elizabeth Reese and Isaac Mahan to a point
on the road leading from the Clay Pike near Beech Creek
to said Burmah road at a point on said road at or
near a Chestnut tree that stands close by said road near
said road on land of Elizabeth Reese. Your petitioners
further show that a road has long since been
laid out from the Johnstown road to Burmah Bridge
which road or path beginning at a White Oak tree on
said road near the line of land of Elizabeth Reese
and Isaac Mahan to a point on said road where
said road connects with the road leading from the Clay Pike before described being
a distance of about one half mile which your petitioners conceive is useless
and in consequence
and therefore praying the court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the
same according to law. The Court upon due consideration had of the premises, do
order and appoint, William S. Ledyard SURVEYOR,
and Ellsworth Rawland, John Stiles

~~suppli~~ ^{to be measured} VIEWERS, to view the ground proposed for said
road, and if they view the same, and shall agree that there is occasion for such
~~change~~ they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance
and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to
private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the
petitioners, and that they make a report of their proceedings to the next Court
of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, stating particularly whether they
judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft
thereof, and the courses and distances, and references to the improvements through
which it may pass.

NOTE.—"It shall be the duty of all persons appointed in the several counties of this Commonwealth to view and review any public or private road or bridge, if they shall decide in favor of locating said road or bridge, to endeavor to procure from the persons over whose land such location may be made releases from all claims for damages that might arise from the opening of such road or the building of such bridge; and in every case where said viewers shall fail to procure such releases, and it shall appear to them that any damages will be sustained, it shall be their duty to assess the damages and make report thereof signed by a majority of their number, and return the same, together with all releases obtained, to the Court of Quarter Sessions, and the damages so assessed shall be conclusive, or may be subject to appeal, review or modification, as may be provided by existing laws in the different counties of this Commonwealth."

"The persons appointed as aforesaid shall view such ground, and if they shall agree that there is occasion for a road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance, and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the petitioners."

"The viewers, as aforesaid, shall make report, at the next term of said Court, and in the said report shall state particularly: first, who of them were present at the view; second, whether they were severally sworn or affirmed; third, whether the road desired be necessary for a public or private road; they shall also annex and return to the Court a plot or draft thereof, stating the courses and distances, and noting briefly the improvements, through which it may pass; and whenever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said roads at an elevation not exceeding five degrees, (except at the crossing of ravines and streams) where, by moderate filling and bridging, the declination of the road may be preserved within that limit."
