a new road.

In the Court of Quarter Sessions of Cambria County
To the Honorable R. L. Johnston, President Judge
of the above named Court.

The petition of citizens of
Portage and Munster Townships in said County
respectfully represents, That a view was recently
made by an Order of this Court to vacate and supply
part of a public road leading from the H.C & I. Turnpike
near Mullins Bridge in Munster Township to the public
road leading from Munster to Wilmore near the resi-
dence of John Stel in Portage Township. That the
Report of the Viewers appointed to vacate and supply
said road was filed to A.S. June Sessions 1888. R.
I on 4th Dec. 1888. by which it appears that part
of said Road was vacated and supplied by a
new road. Your petitioners further represent
that they are familiar with the road proposed
to be vacated as well as the proposed new
route and do remonstrate against the absolute
confirmation of the Report of Viewers in this case
for the following reasons.

- First The road proposed to be vacated is not useless,
inconvenient and burdensome to the inhabitants
thereabouts but is convenient and necessary in its
present location to those who must use it.
- Second There is no heavy hauling requiring light grades
over said road, being used principally by persons
travelling from Portage and Munster Townships

to O'Harrow's Mill and to Ebensburg, the road proposed to be vacated being the direct route from Portage to Ebensburg.

- Third The route supplied is nearly three quarters of a mile longer than the road proposed to be vacated from one Wilmore road to the other.
- Fourth All the travel from Portage to Ebensburg onto O'Harrow's Mill will have ^{over} one and a fourth miles farther by the proposed Road than by the road as it is now located and travelled.
- Fifth The road proposed to be vacated accommodates a larger ^{portion} of the community, than can be accommodated by the new route proposed, say as the proportion is of five to one.
- Sixth The expense of opening the new road would be very great and more than the township of Munster should be called on to bear.

Your petitioners therefore pray the Court to not confirm said Report of Surveyors absolutely but to refuse to confirm the same so as to leave said road in its old location.
And they will ever pray.

To the Hon. Robert D. Johnston President Judge of the Court of General Quarter Sessions of the Peace of Cambria Co. Pa.

The petition of the undersigned citizens of Munster township in said County and vicinity respectfully represents; That a public road, beginning on the H. C. & Indiana Turnpike near Mullens bridge, ^{in Munster township} and ending on the public road leading from Munster to Wilmore, near the residence of John Nel in Portage township, has long since been laid out by an Order of this Court, and that part of said road, to wit: that part "commencing at a point near the house of Alexander Parrish (formerly Patrick Storni) to the public road near John Nel above mentioned," in its present location has become inconvenient and burdensome; and would better accommodate the travelling public by being changed so as to begin and end at or nearly the same points.

The petitioners therefore pray the Court to inquire of and change that part of said road, and for such purpose appoint persons qualified according to law to view that part of said road proposed for the said change, and inquire of the premises, and make report of their proceedings at the next term of this Court. And they will pray to.



The undersigned Surveyors
appointed by order of a Court of Quarter Sessions
in and for the County of Lancashire do report that we
gave due and timely Notice by three written Notices
posted in public places in Muncaster & Portage Townships
of time and place of Meeting of Surveyors a Copy of Notice is
herunto annexed And we do further report that
having met at time and place designated by said
notices and after all being first sworn according
to law we proceeded to the duties of our appointment
and did view the said Road the following parts
of said road began at Post on public road leading from
Muncaster on farm of John Stil in Portage Township thence by
Private road of John Stil North Sixty Eight degrees West thirty
seven perches to Post on Public road not opened thence North
one half degree West fifty two perches thence North Thirty four
degrees East fourteen perches thence South Sixty Eight and
one half degrees West sixteen perches thence South Seventy
five degrees West twelve perches thence South fifty Eight
degrees West eight perches thence South forty seven and one
half degrees West six perches thence South Twenty Nine degrees West Eight
perches thence thence South forty two and one half degrees West
Eight perches thence South fifty five degrees West fourteen per-
ches thence North forty five degrees West three perches to point
in public road leading from Ottamars Hill to Wilmore on

form of Alexander Parish in Mecosta Township
which said posts we do locate in consequence of steep
and dangerous hill in our opinion useless and incon-
venient and burdensome to the inhabitants therobt
and Supply the same as follows viz Beginning at
a Post on public road leading from Ottertail Mill to

Township thence North forty four degrees East Seventy
six perches thence North fifty three degrees East sixteen
perches thence North thirty four degrees East twenty per-
ches thence North Seventy nine degrees East six perches
thence South Eighty Eight degrees East twenty four
perches to improved land of Cornelius Kiven thence Nor-
th Eighty three degrees East fourteen perches thence South
Eighty one degrees East fourteen perches thence North Sixty
one degrees East ten perches thence South Seventy five and
one half degrees East ten perches thence South Seventy one
degrees East twelve perches thence South Eighty six
degrees East fourteen perches thence North Eighty three
degrees East twelve perches thence North Seventy degrees

East twelve perches thence South Twenty Eight degrees East

At a court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Cambria,
held at Pittsburgh in the said County, on the sixth day of
June A. D. 1881, before the Honorable the Judges of the same
court: Upon the petition of divers inhabitants of the township of Munster
in the said county, setting forth that they labor under inconvenience for want of a
public road beginning on the road or highway, to lead from
St. C & Indiana Turnpike near Mullens Bridge in Munster
Township and ending on the public road leading from
Munster to Wilmer near the residence of John Stile no Passage
has long since been laid out by an order of this Court for
that part of said road to wit: that part commencing at a
point near the house of Alexander Parshall (formerly Patrick
Storm) to the public road near John Stiles above mentioned
in its present location has become inconvenient and
hazardous and would better accommodate the trav-
eling public by being changed so as to begin and
end at nearly the same point,

and therefore praying the court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the
same according to law. The Court upon due consideration had of the premises, do
order and appoint Henry Scanlon SURVEYOR,
and John J. Shugrue & Edward H. Gray

~~vacuum supply~~ ^{to} VIEWS, to view the ground proposed for said
road and if they ^{vacuum supply} view the same, and shall agree that there is occasion for such
road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance
and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to
private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the
petitioners, and that they make a report of their proceedings to the next Court
of Quarter Sessions to be held for said county, stating particularly whether they
judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft
thereof, and the courses and distances, and references to the improvements through
which it may pass.

NOTE.—“It shall be the duty of all persons appointed in the several counties of this Commonwealth to view and review any public or private road or bridge, if they shall decide in favor of locating said road or bridge, to endeavor to procure from the persons over whose land such location may be made releases from all claims for damages that might arise from the opening of such road or the building of such bridge; and in every case where said viewers shall fail to procure such releases, and it shall appear to them that any damages will be sustained, it shall be their duty to assess the damages and make report thereof signed by a majority of their number, and return the same, together with all releases obtained, to the Court of Quarter Sessions, and the damages so assessed shall be conclusive, or may be subject to appeal, review or modification, as may be provided by existing laws in the different counties of this Commonwealth.”

“The persons appointed as aforesaid shall view such ground, and if they shall agree that there is occasion for a road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance, and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the petitioners.”

“The viewers, as aforesaid, shall make report, at the next term of said Court, and in the said report shall state particularly: first, who of them were present at the view; second, whether they were severally sworn or affirmed; third, whether the road desired be necessary for a public or private road; they shall also annex and return to the Court a plot or draft thereof, stating the courses and distances, and noting briefly the improvements, through which it may pass; and whenever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said roads at an elevation not exceeding five degrees, (except at the crossing of ravines and streams) where, by moderate filling and bridging, the declination of the road may be preserved within that limit.”
