At a Court of Quarter Sessions
of the Peace held at Eber-
burg in and for the County
of Cambria on Monday the
Fifth day of September A.D.
1887, before Honorable Robert L. Johnston Pres-
ident Judge of said Court the petition of
H. H. Stoney Burgess of the Borough of John-
stown was presented setting forth, That
the Town Council of said Borough of John-
stown on the 21st day of June 1887, passed
the following Ordinance viz: Whereas the
following described Alley located in the
South Ward of the Borough of Johnstown
has been used by the public twenty-one
years and upwards viz: The Southern
boundary line commencing on Bedford
Street, at the North East corner of the property
of Henry Perkins and extending North
64.30 degree East One hundred and seventy-
one feet and three inches to the South East
corner of Brown Alley, the Northern bound-
ary line commencing on Bedford Street at
the South Western corner of the property of Eben
Michael and extending in an Easterly di-
rection along line of said property thirty-eight
feet and eight inches, thence in a Southerly
direction two feet and six inches thence
North 62.45 degree East One hundred and

twenty-five feet and six inches to and across and to the Southeastern corner of an unnamed twelve foot alley as shown by the accompanying draft. Therefore be it ordained and enacted by the Burgess and Town Council of the Borough of Johnston and it is hereby ordained and enacted by the authority of the same.

Section 1. That the said alley described in the foregoing preamble be and the same is hereby declared a public Alley of the Borough and shall be known and designated on the plat or map of the streets ^{and} alleys of the Borough as Coal Alley.

Section, 11: That all ordinances of the Borough relating to Alleys be and the same are hereby extended to and over said Alley.

Your petitioner therefore prays your Honor to appoint seven disinterested freeholders of said Borough, who, after being duly sworn or affirmed to perform their duties under the Act of Assembly in such case made and provided with impartiality ^{and} fidelity shall proceed to view the premises described in said ordinance and petition having regard both to the advantages and disadvantages caused to the several properties along the line of and adjoining said Coal Alley and shall assess and allow to all persons injured thereby such damages as

they shall have sustained respectively over and above all advantages and who shall also make assessments for contributions upon all such properties as shall be benefited by declaring said Alley a public Alley of the Borough such sums respectively as they may have been benefited over and above all disadvantages; and the said viewers shall make a report of their proceedings in writing to the next Court of Quarter Sessions describing the properties upon which assessments have been made specifically stating whether for contribution or for damages. The Court upon due consideration had of the premises appointed Harvard J. Roberts, Charles Lewis, John Lee, C. J. Frazar, P. C. Salinger, G. F. Randolph, D. F. Speedy as viewers who after giving due and legal notice of the time and place of meeting shall proceed to view the premises and make report of their proceedings as herein prayed for, to the next Court of Quarter Sessions of said County and in which report they shall state distinctly that they had been sworn or affirmed according to law.

of Johnston respectfully represents that the
Town Council of said Borough of Johnston on
the 21st day of June 1887, passed the following
ordinance viz: *nam*

Whereas the following described alley located
in the Fourth Ward of the Borough of Johnston
has been used by the public twenty-one years
and upwards viz: The southern boundary line
commencing on Bedford Street at the north-east
corner of the property of Henry Perkins, and extend-
ing north 64.30 degrees east one hundred and
seventy one feet and three inches to the south-east
corner of Brown Alley, the northern boundary line
commencing on Bedford Street at the north-west
corner of the property of Peter Michael, and extending
in an easterly direction along line of said property
thirty-eight feet and eight inches, thence in a southerly
direction two feet and six inches, thence north 62.45-
degrees east one hundred and twenty-five feet
and six inches to and across and to the south-
east corner of an unnamed twelve foot alley
as shown by the accompanying sketch. Therefore
Be it ordained and enacted by the Burgess and
Town Council of the Borough of Johnston, and
it is hereby ordained and enacted by the authority
of the same

Section 1. That the said alley described in

the foregoing preamble be and the same is hereby
declared a public alley of the Borough, and
shall be shown and designated on the plan
or map of the streets and alleys of the Borough as local
alley.

See 11. That all ordinances of the Borough
relating to alleys, be and the same are hereby
extended to and over said alley.
