We, the Undersigned Surveyors appointed by the Court  
of Quarter Sessions of Cambria County to assess damages  
and award Contributions by reason of opening and  
fixing width of Brown Alley in the Fourth Ward  
of the Borough of Johnstown in pursuance of the  
Annexed Order of said Court do report that after having  
given due notice of the time and place of our meeting,  
A copy of which said notice is hereto annexed and  
made part of this report, and after being duly sworn  
and affirmed according to law to perform our duties  
under the Act of the General Assembly to incorporate  
Boroughs, and its supplements with impartiality and  
Fidelity did proceed to view the premises described  
in said order of Court; and found that the opening  
and fixing of the width of said Alley did not take  
any part or portion of any of the lots of ground or  
properties along and adjoining the boundary lines  
of said Alley; and we further report that none  
of the lots of ground or properties along and adjoining  
the boundary lines of said Alley are damaged by  
reason of opening and fixing the width of said  
Alley, and therefore assess no damages for disadvantages.  
And the said Surveyors further report that some of the  
lots of ground or properties along and adjoining the  
boundary lines of said Alley are benefited over and  
above the disadvantages by reason of opening and  
fixing the width of said Alley, and therefore neither  
award nor assess Contributions for advantages.

All of which said lots of ground along and adjoining  
the boundary lines of said alley are more particularly  
designated on a plat of said alley which is hereto-  
unto attached and made part of this report.

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace held at Ebensburg in and for the said County on the Fifth day of September A.D. 1887 before the Honorable R. L. Johnson President Judge of said Court, the居民 of St. M. Story Burgers of the Borough of Johnstown were presented setting forth "That the Town Council of said Borough of Johnstown on the Twenty first day of June 1887 passed the following Ordinance viz; Be it ordained and enacted by the Burgers and Town Council of the Borough of Johnstown; and it is hereby ordained and enacted by the authority of the same Section 1. That the alley commencing at the Southerly side of Coal Alley and extending in a Southerly direction One hundred and ten feet to the run or natural water course in the Faugh Ward of the Borough of Johnstown be and the same is hereby opened to the width of twelve feet, and declared a public Alley of the Borough, and shall be designated and known on the plat or map of the streets and alleys of the Borough as Brown Alley. Section 2. That the Westerly boundary of said Alley shall commence at the North Western corner of said Coal Alley and extend in a Southerly direction

one hundred and ten feet to said river or  
natural course of waters, That the Easterly  
boundary line shall commence at the South  
Easterly corner of said Canal Alley, twelve feet  
from Easterly boundary line and extend  
parallel therewith in a Southerly direction  
One hundred and ten feet to said river or  
natural water Course. Section III That all  
ordinances of the Borough relating to Alley-  
es and the same are hereby extended to and  
over the said Braun Alley. Your petitioners  
therefore pray your Honor to appoint Seven  
disinterested freeholders of said Borough  
who after being duly sworn or affirmed to  
perform their duties under the Act of Assem-  
bly in such case made and provided with  
impartiality and fidelity shall proceed  
to view the premises described in said  
Ordinance and petition having regard  
both to the advantages and disadvantages  
caused to the several proprietaries along the  
line of and adjoining said Braun Alley  
and shall assess and allow to all per-  
sons injured thereby such damages as they  
shall have sustained respectively over and  
above all advantages, and who shall also  
make assessments for contributions upon all  
such proprietaries as shall be benefited by  
opening said alley of the Borough such  
sums respectively as they may have been

benefited own and above all disadvantages  
and the said review shall make a report  
of their proceedings in writing to the next  
sessions of said Court describing the  
provisions upon which assessments have  
been made specifically stating whether  
for contribution or for damages. The  
Court upon due consideration had of the  
provision appointed William Thompson  
John Thomas, Lewis Wahn, Samuel Lickart  
Thomas Lane, John Brady, and E. H. Fron-  
heiser as reviewers who after giving due and  
legal notice of the time and place of meeting  
shall proceed to view the premises and make  
a full report of their proceedings as herein  
stated for, to the next Court of Quarterly Session  
of said County and in which report they  
shall state distinctly that they had been  
sworn or affirmed according to law.



The petition of H. M. Storey, Burgess of the  
Borough of Johnstown respectfully represents  
that the Town Council of said Borough of  
Johnstown on the twenty-fifth day of June 1887 passed  
the following Ordinance, viz: Be it ordained and  
enacted by the Burgess and Town Council of the  
Borough of Johnstown, and it is hereby ordained  
and enacted by the Authority of the same.

Sec. I. That the Alley commencing at the southerly  
side of Coal Alley, and extending in a southerly  
direction one hundred and ten feet to the River  
or Natural Water Course in the Fourth Ward  
of the Borough of Johnstown, be and the same is  
hereby opened to the width of twelve feet, and  
declared a public alley of the Borough, and  
shall be designated and known on the plot or  
map of the Streets and Alleys of the Borough as  
Brown Alley.

Sec II. That the westerly boundary line of said  
alley shall commence at the north western corner  
of said Coal Alley and extend in a southerly direction  
one hundred and ten feet to said river or natural  
course of water; that the easterly boundary line  
shall commence at the south easterly corner of said  
Coal Alley, twelve feet from the westerly boundary  
line, and extend parallel therewith in a southerly  
direction one hundred and ten feet to said river  
or natural water course.

3. Sec'th That All ordinances of the Borough relating to  
4. Alleys be and the same are hereby extended to and  
5. over the said Brown Alley.
