The petition of the undersigned respectfully represents, That a Road to lead from a point on the line of lands of Peter Riban and Wm. J. Kearney on the township road leading from the Old Portuguese to Munster And extending to a public street at or near Lilly Borough at Corner of lands of Joseph Rainey, laid out by order of this Court and Confirmed on the first day of July A.D. 1889, has been opened in part, and that part of the said road commencing at a point on George Street in what is known as the George Extension of Lilly Borough in said County, thence across and through the lands of Providence M. And Rachel C. George to a point on Laurel Man at or near Thomas Brown's ^{house}, is useless, inconvenient burdensome and does very great injury to private property in this, that the said Providence M. And Rachel C. George have had the ground over which said road passes laid out in lots with proper streets and alleys donated to public use on better ground than where said road has been laid out. The petitioners further represent that the part of said road for which the petition is presented to vacate and supply is in the Township of Warrenton.

The Petitioners therefore pray your

Honor to appoint Vicens to Vacate that part of the said
road above described and supply the same by a
road between the same points following the streets and
Alleys so laid out as aforesaid

The undersigned Reviewers do report that having given due and timely notice by three written and printed notices posted in three public places adjacent to said road of time and place of Review in Washington Township

And we do further report that having met at time and place designated by said Notice and after all being first sworn according to law we proceeded to the duties of our appointment and in consequence of the destruction to a number of lots of heretofore laid out being an extension of lots to Lilly Borough as said road as laid out crosses through said lots as laid out by Prudence & Rochael L. George and a portion of said road being laid on low flat swampy ground we do in our opinion to accommodate the public travel to locate Beginning at Post at Bridge across North branch of Cauraugh River South thirty four degrees West Eight perches Post thence South fifteen degrees West thirty five perches to Post in Street which in our opinion should be vacated.

And supplied as follows for
a Public Road by a street of forty feet laid out with lots in.

the Extension of lots to be annexed to Lily Borough
by Providence and Rochefort George in Washington
Township as said Street is on higher dryer
ground thence by said Street North
forty perches to Post on Street thence by
said Street East fourteen perches to
Post at Bridge at North branch of Cummough
river which said supplied would better accommo-
date public travel being better ground for a road
and doing no damage to owners of land, see
draft herewith annexed all of which is
respectfully submitted for a Public Road or high-
way

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Cambria
held at Cheshburg in the said County, on the second day of
September A. D. 1889, before the Honorable the Judges of the same
Court: Upon the petition of divers inhabitants of the township of Washington
in the said County, setting forth that ~~they labor under inconvenience for want of a~~
~~road~~ ^{road or highway}, to lead from
a road to lead from a point on the line of lands of Peter Reister
to Mc J. Harting on the Township Road leading from the
Old Portage Road to Minuta and extending to a public
street at or near Lilly Borough at corner of lands of
Joseph Ramey laid out by order of the Court and
confirmed on the first day of July A. D. 1889 has been
opened as part and that part of the said road commencing
at a point on George Street in what is known as Georg
Extension of Lilly Borough in said County, then across
and through the lands of Pandemicell & Rachael C. Georg
to a point on Candell River at a near Thomas Browne
house is useless, inconvenient, burdensome and
does very great injury to private property in that
that the said Pandemicell & Rachael C. Georg have had the ground on which
said road has been laid out in lots and high streets & alleys devoted to public use on
the ground that when said road has been laid out by petition of the
representatives of the tract mayed to be vacated & repaid in a Washington town
and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the
said road ~~and~~ ^{same} according to law. The Court upon due consideration had of the premises, do
order and appoint H. Scoulan SURVEYOR,
and N. L. Parrish & A. F. Fick

road, they shall proceed ~~to lay out the same~~ ^{to lay out the same}, having respect to the shortest distance
and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to
private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the
petitioners, and that they make a report of their proceedings to the next Court
of Quarter Sessions to be held for said County, stating particularly whether they
judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft
thereof, and the courses and distances, and references to the improvements through
which it may pass.
