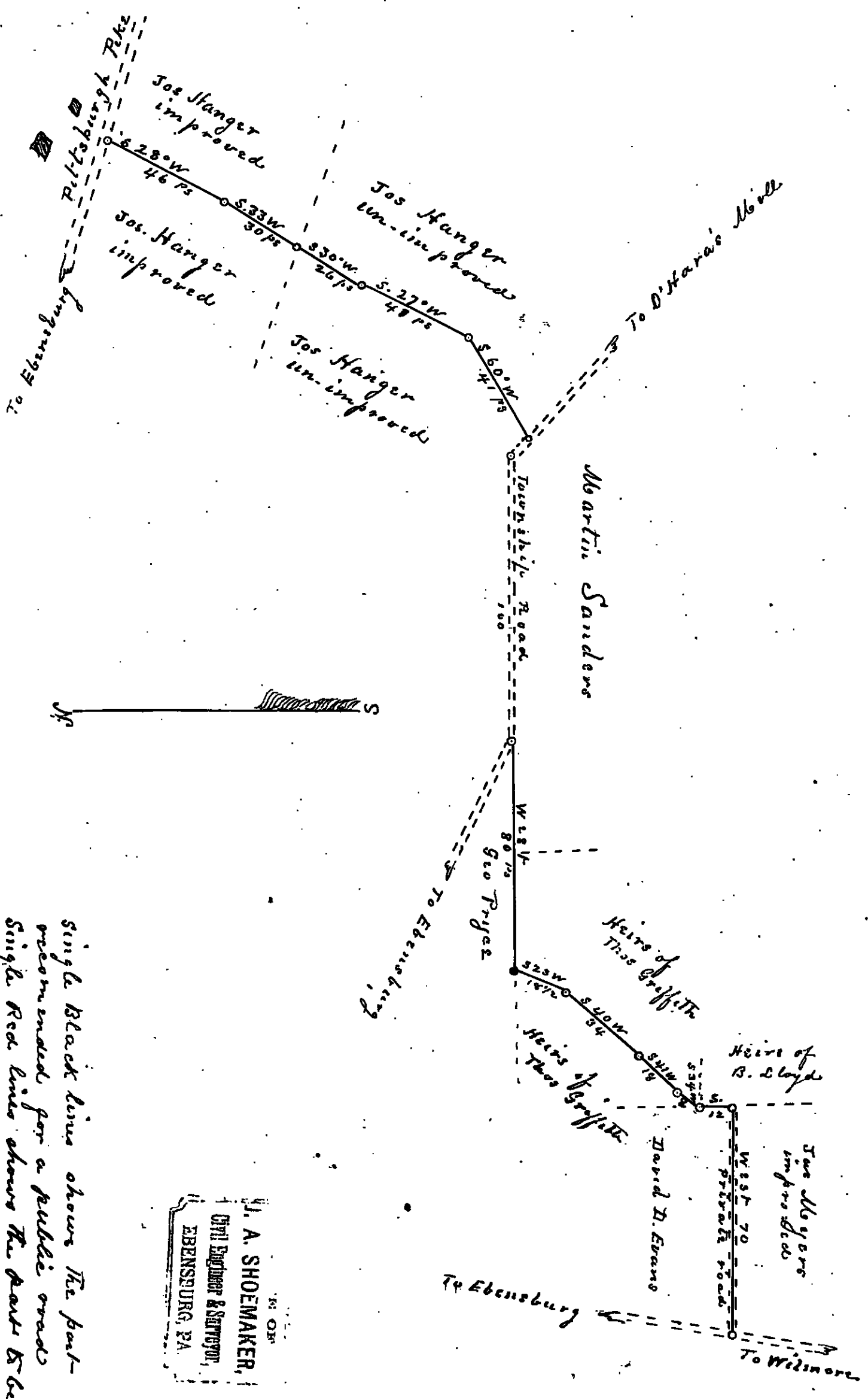
Many of the petitioners being present and

to Joseph Hanger for the sum of
one hundred dollars.

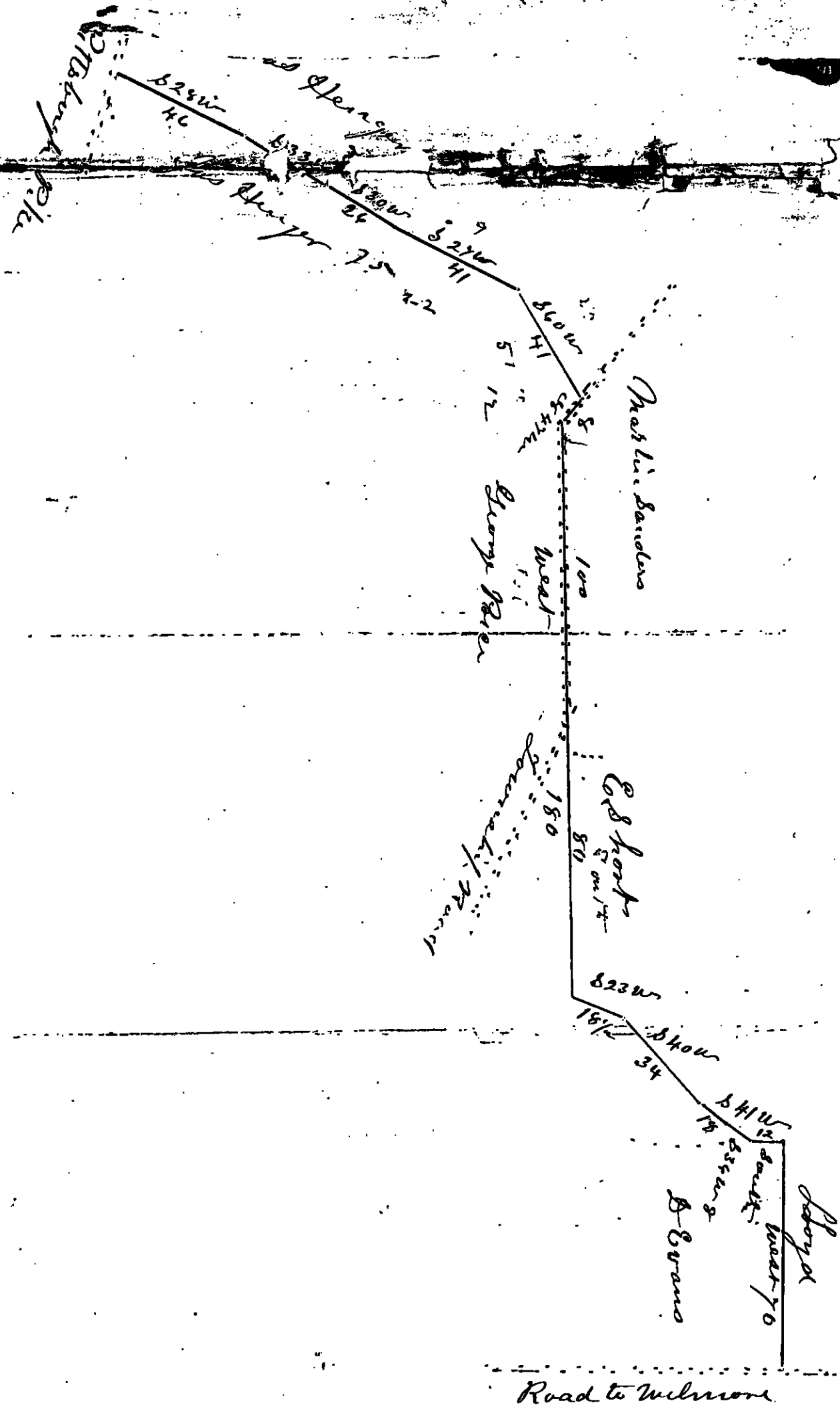
We the persons appointed by the within order of Court
viz W^m J. McConnell M^r J. Tierney and Adam Schetting
do report that we gave due public Notice of the time
and place of meeting, Nov^r 9th 1888, and having met
pursuant to said notice and after being duly sworn
we viewed the ground for the proposed road and
believing there is occasion for such road, we adjourned
until Nov^r 10, when we proceeded to lay out the following
road for Public use Beginning at a post on the Pittsburgh
Pike on the Farm of Joseph Henger thence through his Land
South twenty eight degrees west forty six perches thence
thirty three degrees west thirty perches South thirty degrees
west twenty six perches to a walnut thence South twenty
seven degrees west forty one perches thence South sixty
degrees west forty one perches to Township Road on
Land of Martin Sanders thence by said Township
road North forty seven degrees west eight perches thence
by the same road west one hundred perches thence
leaving Township Road and following the line between
Martin Sanders & Geo Price west eighty perches thence through
Land of E Short South twenty three degrees west
Eighteen perches, South forty degrees west thirty four
perches South forty one degrees west Eighteen perches to
a Maple then South thirty six degrees west Eight perches
to line between E Short and E Evans thence by said
line South twelve perches thence by line of D
Evans & Lloyd west seventy perches to the
