

To the Honorable, the Judge of the Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace in and for Cambris County:

The undersigned viewers appointed as per annexed order to view the premises and assess the advantages and damages arising from the opening of a certain alley in the First Ward of the Borough of Millville, ordained and enacted by the BURGESS and Town Council of said Borough, to be called Rail Road Alley, having given due notice by hand-bills posted on the line of said Alley, ten days previous to the time of making said view, of the time of meeting, and the viewers having first been duly sworn and affirmed according to law, did, on the First day of February, A.D. 1889, meet upon the line of said Alley, and having viewed the premises, did award damages to the School District of the Borough of Millville in the sum of Four Hundred Dollars-\$400.00-and assess advantages to the Borough of Millville in the sum of Four Hundred Dollars-\$400.00.

None of the other property holders or owners on the line of said Alley are damaged and none are advantaged.

A correct map or plan of the said Alley is hereto annexed showing the route of the said Alley and the names of the owners of the lots or properties abutting thereon.

None of the viewers have any interest in the damages or advantages caused or incurred in the opening of said Alley.

President Judge the Petition of Thos P. Keedy
Burgess of the Borough of Millville was presented
setting forth "That on August 14. 1878 the Burgess and
Town Council duly passed an Ordinance to open
a certain Alley way in the First Ward of said Borough
said Alley to be fifteen and four tenths feet in
width and to be called Railroad Alley: due no-
tice of the time for consideration and adoption of
said ordinance, as required by law, was given
to the owners of abutting and adjoining lots and
property, and the same has been duly published
in the newspapers and by handbills pasted as
required by law

Copy of Ordinance.

Be it ordained and enacted by the Burgess and
Town Council of the Borough of Millville, and it
is hereby ordained and enacted by the authority
of the same. Sec. 1. That an alley-way to be called
Railroad Alley, shall be opened and adapted
as a publick alley as follows viz; The Northwesterly
line thereof beginning at a point on the Southewesterly
line of Spruce Alley, in the First Ward of the Borough
of Millville, distant 164 7/10 feet Northerly from
the Northerly line of Main or Bon Street: Then
extending Northwest by a line curving toward the
North with a radius of 2,677-100 feet, thence South

80 degrees and 34 minutes West 21 and 59-100 feet, and
there North 42 degrees and 56 Minutes West 82 and
9-100 feet to a point in the Northwestly line of School
Alley distant 174 and 1-10 feet Northeastly from
the Northeastly line of main or Old Street, the South-
westerly line of said Alley to be distant 16 and 5-10
feet Southwardly from and parallel with the
Northeastly line thereof. Sec. 2. All ordinances of
the Borough of Millville relating to public alleys be
and the same are hereby extended to and over said
Railroad Alley."

Your Petitioners therefore pray, your Honor
to appoint several disinterested freeholders of
the said Borough to view the premises and
assess the advantages and disadvantages of
any to the proprietors on the lines of said alley.

The Court upon due consideration had of the
premises appointed John R. Reiss, H. H. Gwinne -
Chas. Antine, Francis J. James, Louis R. Louris, Maria
Lewis and Richd. Daingerfield as members who
after giving due and legal notice of the time and
place of meeting shall proceed to view the
premises and make report of their proceed-
ings as hereinafter set forth to the next Court
of Quarter Session of said County, and
in which report they shall state distinctly
that they have been sworn or affirmed ac-
cording to law.

To the Honorable Robert L. Johnston, President Judge of the Court of Quarter Session of Cambria County:

The petition of the Burgess and Town Council of the Borough of Millville respectfully represents, --

That on August fourteenth, A.D. 1888, the Burgess and Town Council duly passed an Ordinance to open a certain Alley way in the First Ward of the said Borough--said Alley to be sixteen and five tenth feet in width, and to be called Railroad Alley. Due notice of the time for consideration and adoption of said Ordinance, as required by law, was given to the owners of abutting and adjoining lots and property; and the same has been duly published in the Newspaper and by handbills posted as required by law.

A copy of said Ordinance, and map of the Alley showing the adjoining property is hereto attached.

10 An Ordinance to open Railroad Alley in the Borough of Millville.

Be it ordained and enacted by the Burgess and Town Council of the Borough of Millville, and it is hereby ordained and enacted by the authority of the same:

Section 1: That an alley-way, to be called Railroad alley, shall be opened and adopted as a public alley as follows, viz: The northeasterly line thereof beginning at a point on the southeasterly of Spruce alley, in the First Ward of the Borough of Millville, distant 164 7-10 feet northeasterly from the northeasterly line of Main or Iron Street; thence extending northwesterly by a line curving toward the north, with a radius of 2,677.58-100 feet; thence south 80 degrees and 34 minutes west 21 and 59-100 feet; and thence north 42 degrees and 56 minutes west 21 and 9-100 feet to a point in the northwesterly line of School alley, distant 174 and 1-10 feet northeasterly from the northeasterly line of Main or Iron street; the southwesterly line of said alley to be distant 16 and 5-10 feet southwestwardly from and parallel with the northeasterly line thereof.

Sec. 2. All ordinances of the Borough of Millville relating to public alleys be and the same are hereby extended to and over said Railroad alley.

RAIL-ROAD ALLEY


MILLVILLE BOROUGH.
