We the undersigned Viewers appointed by said Court do report that having duly and timely  
notice of time and place of View in three public places in the  
Township of Susquehanna by written notices a copy is herewith  
attached And we do further report that having met at time  
and place designated by said notices and after first being  
all first sworn according to law to perform the duties  
required as we proceeded to our duties and did View  
and locate the following parts of Road mentioned in order  
of Court viz Beginning at Post near Salt Well School House  
an public road leading from Conners Mills to Cherry Tree  
thence North seventy nine degrees East twelve perches thence North  
Eighty seven and one half degrees East twenty four perches thence  
South sixty six degrees East twenty perches thence South seventy  
Eight degrees East eight perches thence South fifty two degrees  
East twelve perches thence South twenty seven degrees East forty=  
Eight perches thence South forty four degrees East twenty two perches  
thence South seventy six and one half degrees East forty six  
perches thence South eighty six and one half degrees East twenty  
five perches to Post in line of land of George Gooderham and  
Alexander Dauphant which said parts in our opinion is un-  
lawful and burdensome to the inhabitants thereof  
and we do hereby certify the parts located  
and supply the same as follows for a Public Road

 thirty five perches to Point in public road leading from  
 Webster Smiths to Pleasant hill which in our opinion is  
 necessary to accommodate the public travel see draft the  
 supplied for in red line also over the release of  
 George Gooderham as to damages all of which is  
 respectfully submitted

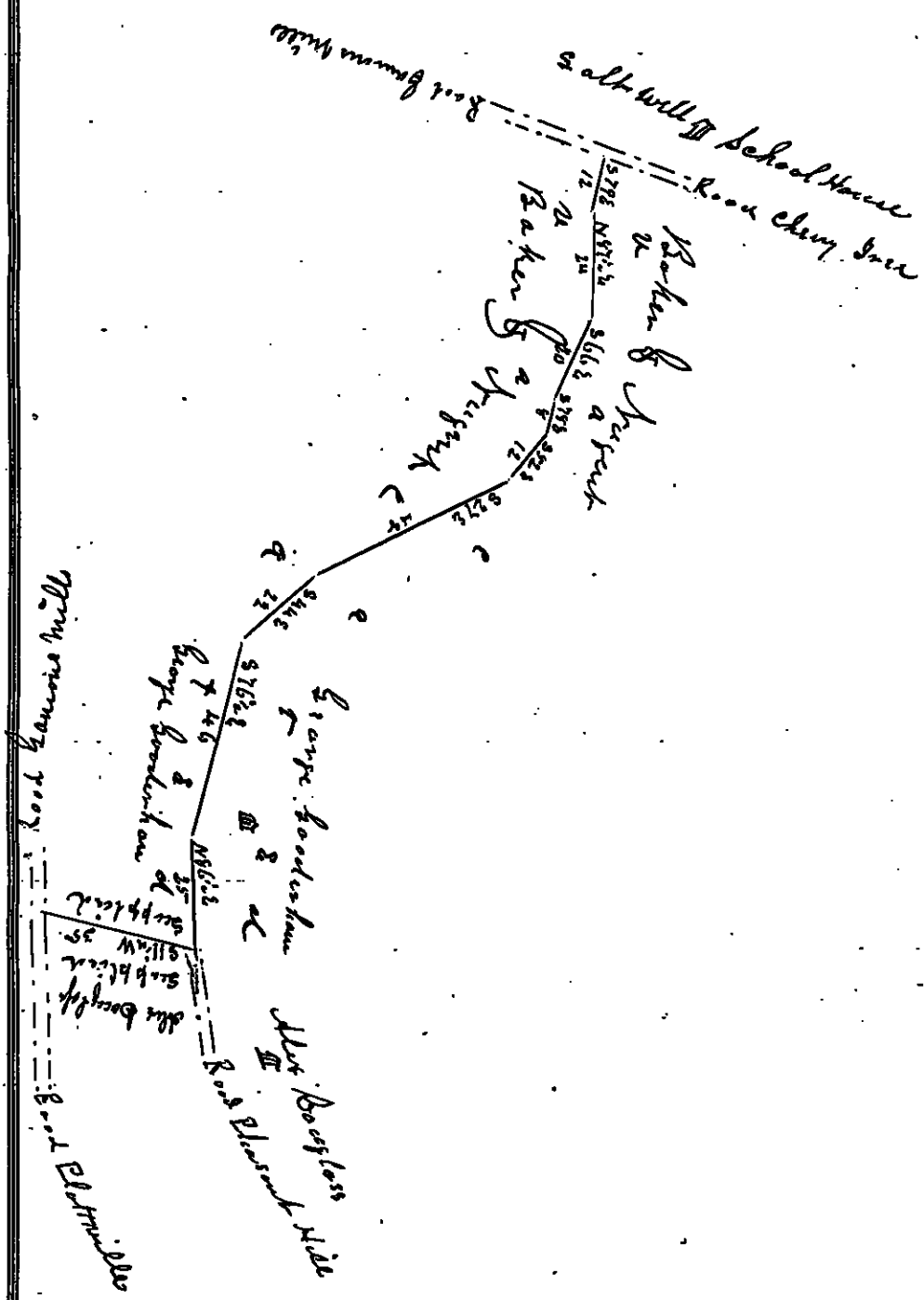

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Cambria  
held at Clearburg in the said County, on the 15 day of  
April A. D. 1879, before the Honorable the Judges of the same  
Court: Upon the petition of divers inhabitants of the township of Susquehanna  
in the said County, setting forth that ~~they labor under inconvenience for want of a~~  
~~a road now formerly laid out by~~ road or highway, to lead from  
corner of the Church from the Saltwell School House to  
the meeting house at Pleasant Hill in Susquehanna  
Township in said County viz that part of said road be-  
gunning at Saltwell School house to point at or near  
Alexander Douglass which said part of said road has  
become inconvenient and troublesome to your petitioners  
and desire that the same might be viewed and established  
agreeably to the act of Assembly in such case made  
and provided,

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to <sup>view</sup> view and lay out the  
same according to law. The Court upon due consideration had of the premises, do  
order and appoint Henry Seaman SURVEYOR,  
and John H. Somerville & H. G. Gellies

<sup>view</sup> VIEWERS, to <sup>view</sup> view the ground proposed for said  
road, and if they <sup>view</sup> view the same, and shall agree that there is occasion for such  
road, <sup>creation</sup> they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance  
and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to  
private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the  
petitioners, and that they make a report of their proceedings to the next Court  
of Quarter Sessions to be held for said County, stating particularly whether they  
judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft  
thereof, and the courses and distances, and references to the improvements through  
which it may pass.

NOTE.—"It shall be the duty of all persons appointed in the several counties of this Commonwealth to view and review any public or private road or bridge, if they shall decide in favor of locating said road or bridge, to endeavor to procure from the persons over whose land such location may be made releases from all claims for damages that might arise from the opening of such road or the building of such bridge; and in every case where said viewers shall fail to procure such releases, and it shall appear to them that any damages will be sustained, it shall be their duty to assess the damages and make report thereof signed by a majority of their number, and return the same, together with all releases obtained, to the Court of Quarter Sessions, and the damages so assessed shall be conclusive, or may be subject to appeal, review or modification, as may be provided by existing laws in the different counties of this Commonwealth."

"The persons appointed as aforesaid shall view such ground, and if they shall agree that there is occasion for a road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance, and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the petitioners."

"The viewers, as aforesaid, shall make report, at the next term of said Court, and in the said report shall state particularly: first, who of them were present at the view; second, whether they were severally sworn or affirmed; third, whether the road desired be necessary for a public or private road; they shall also annex and return to the Court a plot or draft thereof, stating the courses and distances, and noting briefly the improvements through which it may pass; and, whenever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said roads at an elevation not exceeding five degrees (except at the crossing of ravines and streams), where, by moderate filling and bridging, the declination of the road may be preserved within that limit."
