Defendant

Geo. M. Tropell being produced, sworn and examined on the part of the plaintiff, doth depose and say:

My name is Geo. M. Tropell; am years of age;

This man is location the road. I own land with Jacob Tropell the applicant. My land joins the outlet of the private road where it intersects the road to Walker Mill. The land of Geo. Kuhn is on the opposite side of the road from mine. The public road to Walker mill is a Trk road. This private road asked for is located on the line between Geo. M. Kuhn & myself. My land lies between that of Jacob Tropell and the Walker Mill road. From Jacob Tropell out to the Fallen Timber road along the right hand side of the new road Thad. Kuhn & his wife, Adam Enoch, & John G. Gates on both sides. On the left hand

sides, Alex Troxell, he adjoins Geo. H. Kuhns,
Adam Cash, John C. Gates & Jas. L. Glass,
Paper shown witness and he is asked to state if
he is acquainted with the handwriting of any
of the parties whose names are signed thereon
and which of them he has seen write.

I have seen that Eakins, Hannah Ash, H.
Gates, Alex Troxell, Jasab Troxell, Jos. L. Glass
write and the names signed here are in
the handwriting of the persons whose names
they are.

Paper offered as evidence and marked Ex-
hibit A and identified by signature of witness
Jasab Troxell has no outlet to either of these
public roads except by this private road.
It passes along the land of G.H. Kuhn I
suppose about 40 rod. It passes along my
land about the distance of 12 barrel officers
It passes along the line of Jasab Troxell about
25 rod or a little more. I think this road
is necessary for Jasab Troxell to get out. Its
the only road he had to go to mill or any place
His main mill road, that Eakins, Mrs. Eakins,
Hannah Cash, Jos. L. Glass J.C. Gates
Alex Troxell struck Troxell would use this road
if a found out. I use it a good bit. Its my
main road to go to Fallen Timber or, G.H.
Kuhn would use it also. Has used it a
good many years. I never met any one
road in going to Glasgow. To go to Glasgow
I would use the Walker mill road. It
would be Jasab Troxell main mill road
to go to Glasgow & Coalport and the other



The proposed road was laid on the division
line between me and Kuhn opposite my
house. Jacob Hevell

and wanted her to meet road to go to
Fallen Timber or to Shirley or any place in
that section of the Country. I knew of G.
W. Kuhn moving his division fence out to
the line between himself and Jacob Trox-
ell and myself. His moving out his
fence obstructed Jacob Troxell and my
self from getting out to the public road.
The principle part of this new road lies
on land of Jacob Troxell and myself I
give about twelve feet of my land.
Jacob Troxell gave a little over twelve feet
along his land. It's about 1/2 mile this Spring
says Kuhn moved out his fence, and
obstructed this road. He & Jacob Troxell
had no way of getting out then except
to go around Mr. Miller to his mill road.
I refer to Walter's mill.

Cross examined by F. A. Shumaker,
'Exhibit A' objected to not having been
fixed as required by law.

M. L. George does not live on this private
road neither does, David Mulhallen, Joe
Dunn, P. F. Myers, H. Mulhallen, Jas. Matthews
J. G. Hallen, Geo. C. Davis, Jacob Gean, Tom Gallagher
Mark Dunn, G. F. Miller, S. H. Turner, C. C. Mulhallen
John C. Gates, (Kraus land there) This road
between Kuhn & myself as now accusses
and used has been used for about 12 yrs.
They could not wagon it that long.

Dear Scandur once ran the division
line between me and Kuhn on the line
of the road as now used. The fence Kuhn
moved run from the Walker Mill road
to my garden fence about 12 feet of
fence. The people along this pasture road
have been using this road as now used
between Kuhn & myself about 8 yrs.
I made it then. The Eskins have not
used it for 2 yrs. They used a part
of it but not clear through. They used
a part from above Jacob Troxell's house to
below his house, the balance they did not
use. There was no law given by G.W. Kuhn to
Jacob Troxell for him to get out to the
public road. Troxell made a lane out
himself through his own land. Part
of it from above Jacob Troxell's house to
below his house is on the land of G.W.
Kuhn. I have lived at my present resi-
dence 24 yrs. next June. Jacob Troxell
has lived there about 12 yrs. Alex Troxell
lived where he does now something over
30 yrs. The Eskins have lived there about
17 or 18 yrs. more less. G.W. Kuhn moved
them around while before the war.

Re-examined by Mr. Read.

The person I named in my cross-examination
in our testimony for the road. Alex
Troxell to get out to Fallen Timber, Glasgow

or Cambria Mills had to go over the land of C. L. Mulhallen. This is a funeral road and between Slip Topple and Kuhns to gain this new road. The road as now used from Jacob Topple to the Hallens Mill road is very poor, it is not passable at all. It is all worked out, big gutters and the roads too narrow, and there are some stumps in it. The shrubs stand right on the line. There are stumps on the Kuhns side of this passage out. The road is very hilly, 15 rod of it is a very steep hill. The hilly on Kuhns side of the proposed road. It needs grading to make it a passable road. Mr. J. Smith used this road all the time when he goes to Fallon Smelter and Jacob Gass and Mr. Dawson and also Geo. B. Richards Henry Hallen travels the road all the time when he goes to Fallon Smelter also Mr. Smiley Derry Dyer, Thos. H. Hallen, Mr. Timmons, Sam Reiner,

Re-cross examined by Mr. Haemmerle.
I can't say whether any of the signs withhold their names from this petition or not. The hill on this road as now used is greater than the one just Geo Richards or the one from Flynn City to Land of the Tuomes.

Ques. This is not the only the only road that

is, washed out and has stumps in, in
Reads Lick.

Mr. Read objects that it is not cause enough
not relevant or material.

Sus = Then is no road in Read's Lick that
has stumps in like that road or is
as much washed out or half as narrow.
The roads in Read's Lick are all muddy
now but not worse than other roads

Mrs. Eddins & Frank Howell would use the
prepared road to go to school. It is the
main School & church rd.

J. J. Glass. (affirmed)

I live near the road to Fallen Timber about
10 or 12 rods off this road. The prepared new
road goes through part of my land. My
name is signed to "Ephelit A" I signed
it. The principal use I would make
of this prepared road would be in going
to church. After the church is finished
it is not finished yet, I would not
use the road to go to Sabbath School
where it is now. If moved to the church
when finished I would. To go out
to Walker mill or Glasgow just before
Read's Eddins, Mrs. Eddins, and I suppose

Frank Troxell would use this road.
Sly Troxell would likely use this road.
Ques - State whether or not any of the persons
residing along the road to Waller's Mill
would use the proposed road in going
to Fallen Timber & from that out,
Mr. Schaeffer objects that the question
is leading and the parties residing along
the Waller Mill road know full well
thorough fares to Fallen Timber and else-
where for 25 yrs. past the answer could
only be the result of the witness imagination
and therefore irrelevant and misleading.
Ans - If the road were passable I think
that G. H. Troxell, Jacob Troxell, J. W. Kuhn
W. Smith, W. Timmers, David Reffner would
use it, that is all that it would be most
convenient for.

Ques - State whether or not Duy Oyer, Mr. Haller
the Haller, Jacob Glass, Henry Kottel, A. G. Gray
Peter Reffner or either of them would use this
proposed road in going to Fallen Timber and
place beyond of in a passable condition.
Mr. Schaeffer objects that it is leading.
Ans - Thos. Haller & Harry Kottel might
use this road. The balance I don't know
about. This road would be an economi-
cal to the people living on it to go to Waller
Mill or to the school. To commence at
the end of the road as now used at

my place part of it is filled with
logs, some very large mud holes in
it, narrow and washed out at the
further end. I believe there is a stream
at two or three lots of the hills by Mr. Kuhns
house opposite G. H. Troxell's garden.
At the end next Walter's Mill road the ground
is steep. I am not able to say whether the
road needs grading or filling; It needs
some fixing.

Cross-examined by Mr. Schaeffer.

I am not able to say who hauled these
logs on the road. They were hauled off
Mr. Cash's land for her. She is the wife
of Adam Cash.

Ques = If the road as at present used
was put in proper repair would it not
accommodate all the neighbors residing
along it?

Mr. Read objects that it is not relevant or
material, that the petitioners desire a road
established by law which would be per-
manent and not subject to the will of
others.

Ans = I think it would. If they had
had the authority to put it in proper re-
pair it would then accommodate them.
I don't know whether they have authority
or not. I know, on the right hand side
of the road leading from Fallen Timber to

Decree on the South side

Rev. Troxell (affirmed)

I live near the Mahanoy river road. Jacob Troxell, Thos Ecker, Culhem Ecker, Geo. H. Troxell myself live along this road. Geo. H. Kuhn lives on the public road coming out between himself and Troxell. It is a necessary road for these people to get out to public places. Its a direct line for to get out to Fisher Twp and to Walker Mill. Mr. Jacob Troxell sends his children over this road to the Walker Mill road to school. This road, if put in a passable condition, would be used by Mr. H. Dauman, Jacob Glass, D. F. Dyer, Thos Haller, Alon Repner, Henry Kuhn, Dan Glass, C. C. Mulhallen, Wm. Smiley, Jr., John Johnsen, Thos Danner, D. F. Dosek, Geo. J. Richards, Wm. Dyer, John Kuhn, Harry Kuhn, Harry Troxell, Ed. Troxell, Melvin Kuhn, Samuel Troxell, C. J. Troxell, Calais J. Troxell, Tony Troxell and others I don't now recollect. Geo. H. Kuhn moved his fence out on this road about 13 or 14 yrs. ago. I suppose he obstructed the road 7 or 8 rods. This road is on the line that belonged to my place at one time and was sold to G. H. Kuhn out of my place. and G. M. Kuhn. The portion of the road
steps at this point are the same at

Mr. Troxell has given nearly all this road
along the line between him and Kuhn
except in some places where it is
run a little on Kuhns land. Jacob
Troxell would need this road to go to
the Dalton Mill road, the 2 schools have

travel it with a wagon and hardly on
~~not~~ horse back. There is quite a lot of
sand along in the road, and the lower end

Milt Kuhn is married. Harry Keeley, Harry

properly repaired would it not accommodate

Mr. Read objects that the petitioners desire
a road established by order of Court and
to which they are entitled and what would
not be subject to be obstructed at the
pleasure or whim of any person.

Ans - Why certainly it would. The new
road does not occupy any of the Stuhns
land when it goes out to the Walters
Mill road. It would go on his land
if land on the hill but G. H. Troxell gave

surveyed the upper end but I don't know

Perry Troxell (affirmed)

I am acquainted with the ground of the prepared new road. It lies about a quarter or half a mile from it. I have been over the prepared road lately. It is necessary for the people along this road to get to Fallen Timber or to Walkers Mill. Its the only outlet they have.

It necessary to get out & school. They
could not get out the road to Walter
Mill as the road is made with a
wagon at all. Unless they go about one
miles around. Thus Eakin & Jacob Kuhl
have no other way of getting out to mill.

it with the expectation of getting out
of this prepared road. They have no other

Ques - Stats have much ground will be taken off the land of G.M. Troxell & Jacob Troxell and G.M. Kuhn to open the road 20 ft wide on the line laid out by the receivers. Eakins. Except G.W. Kuhn, there are
none on the road opposed to it that
I know of. I signed my name to Elizabet
A^a Jacob Troppel brought me the paper to
sign. The present road from Jacob Troppel's
down to the Walker Mill road is about 12
or 14 ft wide. The road is not in very
good condition now. It's not wide enough;
not road out like it should be to make
it passable. There are some bad spots. I
have been over the road within the last
few weeks. A. Kuhn, about the half goes
through the woods. The half toward Fallin
Timber. Through the woods the road
is hardly as wide as lawn end, hardly

I am one of the petitioners for the road. I have no other way to get out than by this road. I have been getting out by going west through the Troxells and Geo. St. Kuhns fields sometimes and sometimes through Geo. St. Kuhns. Mr. Kuhn refused to give me an outlet, I asked him to do so, I have attempted to go through his land and he forbid me to trespass on it, at the time he forbid me to go over his land I was going over the road he shut up. He shut the lower end of the road entirely up but two places wh. Right on the line

That was about 11 or 12 yrs ago now a less
He moved the fence along by my lawn
about 8 or 9 yrs ago. There was an apple tree
out on the road and he moved the fence
out-side the apple tree, I did not measure
it. He claimed he gave left. but I say
he moved it to as near the line between
me and him and the law would allow.
There is not room for a 25 ft road between
his fence and my buildings down I
don't think. I think it would take off
a corner of my lawn and blacksmith
shop. Last spring he built a stumpy
fence in front of my house. He moved
it back a little to make it straight and
that gave from 2 ft to 18 in between the line
and the fence. His old fence was a worm
fence. His fence is over the line on me
down near the corner next to Walkers
Mill road. From my house down to
the line of G. H. Troops land the road now
is about 12 or 14 ft wide, it may be 16 ft
in some places. From G.H. Troops line
to the fence stumpy is about 12 ft. wide
now or less. At the stumpy this 12 ft width
and a little the side of the stumpy is proba-
bly a foot wider. From the fence stumpy down
to the Walker Mill road is about 4 rod.
The road is a little wider below the fence
stumpy than it is at the stumpy.

I was along when the miners located the road. In some places timber fence is one side of the road or laid out, above the hill I suppose his fence is about three feet from the line or laid out. The road from my place out to the Fallen Timber road is in some places 12 to 16 ft wide out to the woods. Through the woods it's from 10 ft. to 12 ft. along. The one end of the road from the townly to the Fallen Timber road is all woods. I want to use the paved road to go to Fifeville City - Walter Mill Coalport, Church Sabbath School and for the children to go to school, and to Glasgow and any place in that direction. The paved road comes out on the Fallen Timber road at Isaac Glancey's fields. The Walter Mill road would be the nearest for me to go to Glasgow. There are a lot of logs, ^{down right way on the back piling} on the other end of the road now and plenty of places where when the road is not over 8 ft wide. I signed Exhibit A' or if I did not I might as well have. I saw all the names on that paper written. There are no persons on the line of this road that object to the road except Mr. St. Kuhn, (Paper shown witness) and he, says he signed it. Paper offered no evidence and marked Exhibit G' and identified by signature of Abingon, Cross examined by Mr. Shaeffer.

I have lived when I do now for 12 yrs next Sept. G. W. Kuhn bought a piece of land off Troxell farm on the Walker Mill road. He bought between 10 and 11 acres. The road was used more between Kuhn & G. W. Troxell has been open 8 or 9 yrs. From the lower corner of my land to the bars below the house has been opened between 10 & 11 yrs. From the bars up to the barn the road left the barn and went into the field think it run about to the rear back & forward. I don't know how long that was used. 

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law. The Court upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint J. M. Turner, H. C. Glasgow SURVEYOR,
H. H. Bees.

VIEWERS, to view the ground proposed for said road, and if they view the same, and shall agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, and that they make a report of their proceedings to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said County, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, and references to the improvements through which it may pass.

NOTE.—"It shall be the duty of all persons appointed in the several counties of this Commonwealth to view and review any public or private road or bridge, if they shall decide in favor of locating said road or bridge, to endeavor to procure from the persons over whose land such location may be made releases from all claims for damages that might arise from the opening of such road or the building of such bridge; and in every case where said viewers shall fail to procure such releases, and it shall appear to them that any damages will be sustained, it shall be their duty to assess the damages and make report thereof signed by a majority of their number, and return the same, together with all releases obtained, to the Court of Quarter Sessions, and the damages so assessed shall be conclusive, or may be subject to appeal, review or modification, as may be provided by existing laws in the different counties of this Commonwealth."

"The persons appointed as aforesaid shall view such ground, and if they shall agree that there is occasion for a road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance, and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the petitioners."

"The viewers, as aforesaid, shall make report, at the next term of said Court, and in the said report shall state particularly: first, who of them were present at the view; second, whether they were severally sworn or affirmed; third, whether the road desired be necessary for a public or private road; they shall also annex and return to the Court a plot or draft thereof, stating the courses and distances, and noting briefly the improvements through which it may pass; and, whenever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said roads at an elevation not exceeding five degrees (except at the crossing of ravines and streams), where, by moderate filling and bridging, the declination of the road may be preserved within that limit."
