The petition of the undersigned  
citizens of Riade Township respectfully  
represents, that, that part of the public  
road leading from Altoona to Helen  
Zimber, beginning where said road  
crosses the Cresson Clearfield Rail  
Road to a point intersecting with  
the street in Arugality leading  
from the saw mill of the Cresson  
Clearfield Rail Road Coal & Coke  
Company, a distance of about  
four hundred feet, has been sup-  
plied by a public street in the  
village of Arugality, running  
parallel with said road for  
said distance - that said street  
has been dedicated to public use  
by said Coal & Coke Co - That  
the aforesaid road is no longer  
used by the public and has  
become useless inconvenient &  
burdensome -

Further that part of a public  
road leading from Altoona to  
St. Augustine from where it crosses

the Cresson Clearfied Rail Road to the saw Mill of the Cresson & Clearfied Coal & Coke Company a distance of about six hundred feet has been supplied by a public street in the aforesaid village of Angality running parallel with said ~~street~~ road for said distance about 150 feet from it, which said street has been dedicated to public use by the aforesaid Coal & Coke Company - that so much of the aforesaid road has been abandoned for travel by the public and has become inconvenient useless & burdensome -

Your petitioners therefore pray the Court to appoint viewers to view and report at the next Court of Quarter Session, and if they find the facts as set out by your petitioners, that a decree may be made vacating so much of the aforesaid public roads as is supplied by the aforesaid streets -

We the undersigned Viewers appointed  
by the Court to view and report  
upon the propriety of vacating certain  
portions of two roads at Irons Valley  
Road Township in said County as  
more particularly set out in the  
annexed order - do report that after  
first being duly sworn, we did  
on the 17th day of August view  
that portions of the roads de-  
scribed in said order - all parties  
interested having been first duly  
notified. And we are of the opinion  
that so much of said roads as are  
supplied by street dedicated by the  
Commonwealth Clearfield Coal Co. to  
public use, should be vacated -  
the portions vacated being now useless  
inconvenient and burdensome -  
We annex a plat or draft of that  
part which has become useless  
inconvenient and recommend  
that it be vacated as follows.  
from a point where the Road  
leading from Altoona to Fallers  
Gimber crosses the Commonwealth  
Clearfield Rail Road to a point  
in the street in Irons Valley where  
said street intersect said Public  
Road near the Barber Shop. A  
distance of four hundred and fifty three  
feet - the same being supplied by a  
street running parallel with the  
part to be vacated about 100 feet west  
of the part to be vacated.  
Also, we recommend the vacation  
of that part of a public Road leading  
from Altoona to St. Augustine from  
a point where said road crosses  
the Commonwealth Clearfield Rail Road

to the Saw Mill of the Linnson "Schar-  
fied Coal" & back to the port so  
vacated being supplied by a street  
dedicated to public use and  
nearly parallel with it, from said  
Saw Mill to a point where said  
street intersect the Fallon Timber  
road near the Barber Shop. The  
port so vacated being in distance  
seven hundred & fifty feet.

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Cambria  
held at Chesham in the said County, on the 3 day of  
June A. D. 1887, before the Honorable the Judges of the same  
Court: Upon the petition of divers inhabitants of the township of Reade  
in the said County, setting forth that they labor under inconvenience for want of a  
part of the public road leading from Albion road or highway, to lead from  
to Fallen Timber beginning where said road crosses the Casson Telephone Rail  
Road to a point intersecting with the street in Pengelly leading from the same mill  
of the Casson Telephone Coal & Coke Co. a distance of about four hundred feet has been  
supplied by a public street in the village of Pengelly running parallel with  
said road for said distance that said street has been dedicated to public use by  
said Coal & Coke Co. that the aforesaid road is no longer used by the public  
which has become inconvenient and dangerous. Further that part of a pub-  
lic road leading from Albion to St. Augustine from where it crosses the Casson  
Telephone Rail Road to the same mill of the Casson Telephone Coal & Coke Co. a dis-  
tance of about six hundred feet has been supplied by a public street in  
the aforesaid village of Pengelly running parallel with said road for said distance  
about 100 feet from it, which said street has been dedicated to public use by the  
aforesaid Coal & Coke Co. that most of the aforesaid road has been abandoned  
for want of the public which has become inconvenient and dangerous. Therefore  
petitioners therefore pray the Court to appoint

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the  
same according to law. The Court upon due consideration had of the premises, do  
order and appoint Mrs. J. Mitchell SURVEYOR,

and M. M. Moor George Smith

VIEWERS, to view the ground proposed for said  
road, and if they view the same, and shall agree that there is occasion for such  
road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance  
and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to  
private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the  
petitioners, and that they make a report of their proceedings to the next Court  
of Quarter Sessions to be held for said County, stating particularly whether they  
judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft  
thereof, and the courses and distances, and references to the improvements through  
which it may pass.

NOTE.—"It shall be the duty of all persons appointed in the several counties of this Commonwealth to view and review any public or private road or bridge, if they shall decide in favor of locating said road or bridge, to endeavor to procure from the persons over whose land such location may be made releases from all claims for damages that might arise from the opening of such road or the building of such bridge; and in every case where said viewers shall fail to procure such releases, and it shall appear to them that any damages will be sustained, it shall be their duty to assess the damages and make report thereof signed by a majority of their number, and return the same, together with all releases obtained, to the Court of Quarter Sessions, and the damages so assessed shall be conclusive, or may be subject to appeal, review or modification, as may be provided by existing laws in the different counties of this Commonwealth."

"The persons appointed as aforesaid shall view such ground, and if they shall agree that there is occasion for a road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance, and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the petitioners."

"The viewers, as aforesaid, shall make report, at the next term of said Court, and in the said report shall state particularly: first, who of them were present at the view; second, whether they were severally sworn or affirmed; third, whether the road desired be necessary for a public or private road; they shall also annex and return to the Court a plot or draft thereof, stating the courses and distances, and noting briefly the improvements through which it may pass; and, whenever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said roads at an elevation not exceeding five degrees (except at the crossing of ravines and streams), where, by moderate filling and bridging, the declination of the road may be preserved within that limit."
