Be it ordained and enacted by the Burgers and Town Council of the Borough of East Crennough and it is hereby ordained and enacted by authority of the same That Locust Street in the said Borough of Crennough be and hereby is extended from its present termination on Alley to Rail Road Street the Westerly line of said extension of Street to be a continuation of the western line of said Locust Street as at present established and the Easterly line of said extension to be a continuation of the Easterly line of said Street as at present established

Sec 11. That all ordinances relating to Streets in said Borough, be extended to and over said Locust Street as extended

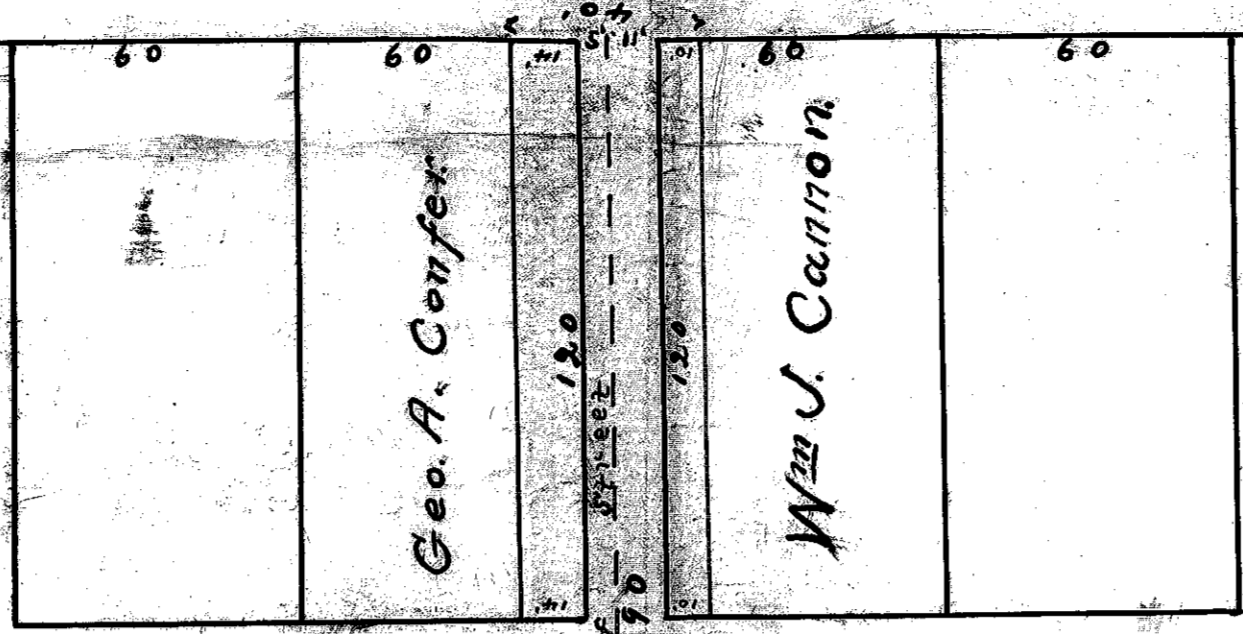

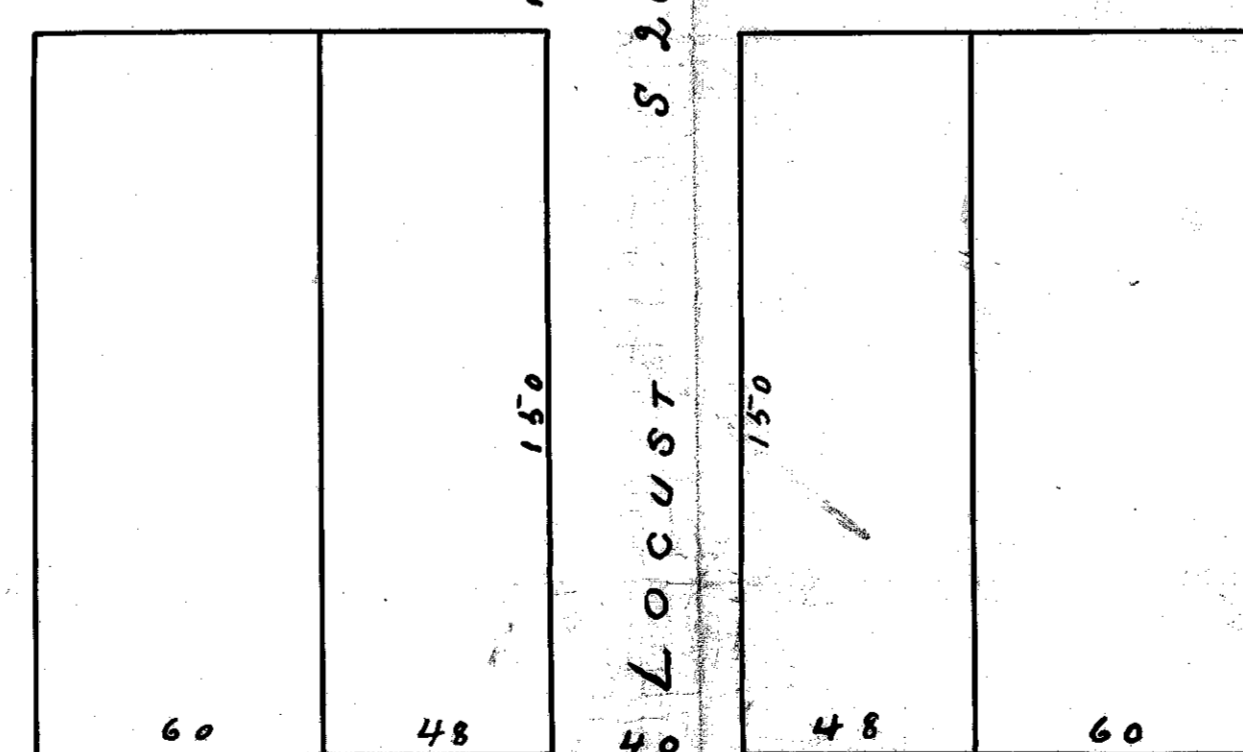
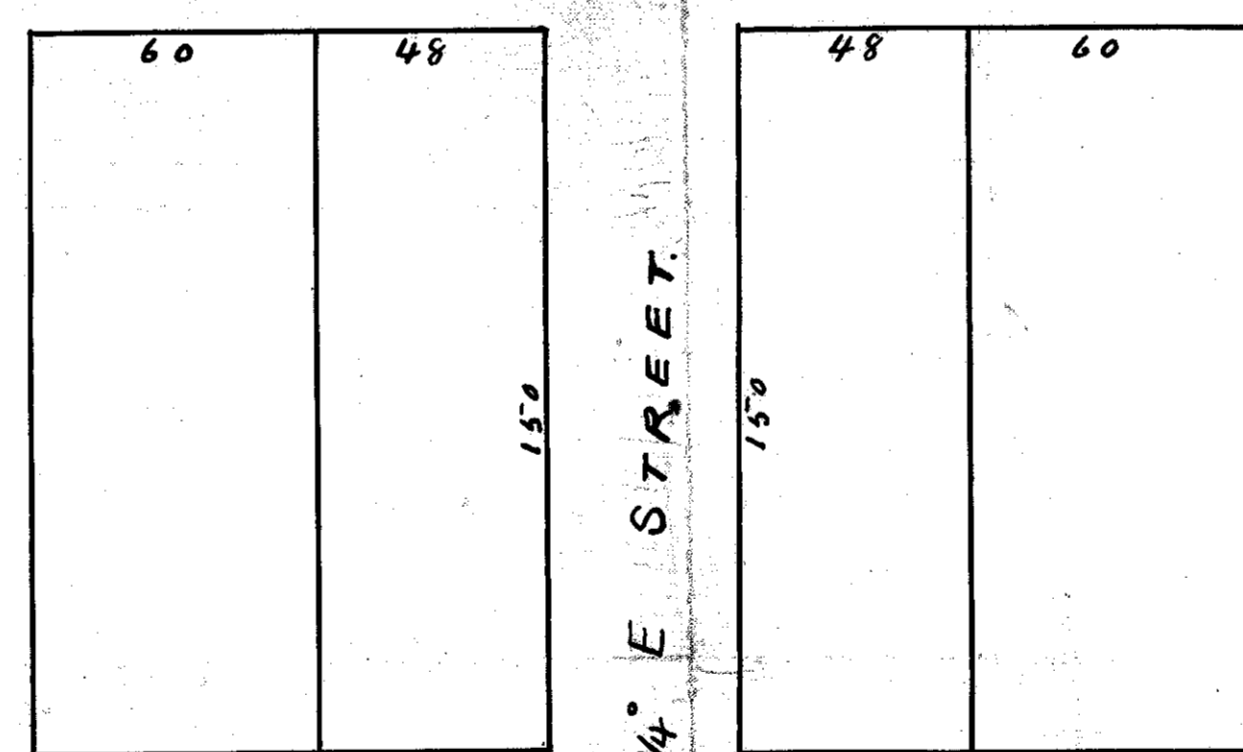
RAIL ROAD STREET.
