

To the Honorable the Judge

Be the under-
signed Viewers appointed by the
within order of Court to view
a road or public highway to lead
from a point on a public road
near Adam Varner's in Jackson
Township to intersect the road from
Hennsville to the Meeting Chapel on
the road to Ebersburg in East
Taylor Township, And that in
pursuance of said order, we gave
due notice of the time we would
meet on the ground, to fulfil the duties
of our appointment, We also met
on Friday 30th day of May A.D. 1890
according to appointment, And after
being duly sworn & affirmed, we
proceeded to view the ground
proposed for said road, and
after viewing the same have agreed
that there is occasion for such a
road, And do report that we have
laid out and do return for public
use a Road according to the following
Course & distance, A draft whereof
is hereto annexed, Beginning at a
post,

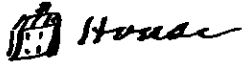
on a public road leading from Minn-
ville to Westley Chapel, thence North
Twenty eight degrees east five perches to
a post, thence across Hinckston Run
North thirty five degrees west six perches
to a post on John S. S. Hunt's land thence through
his lands North ten degrees west ten perches
to a post, thence North four degrees east
twenty three & a half perches to a Spruce
thence North twenty degrees east six-
teen perches to a post, North fifteen
degrees east nine perches to post, thence
North twenty two degrees east twenty six
perches to a post, thence North four degrees
east twenty two perches to a post, thence
North ten & four tenths perches to a Beech
below John S. S. Hunt's Barn, thence through
same lands North seven ten degrees west
eleven perches to a post, thence North thirteen
degrees west four perches to a post, North
twenty five degrees west six & eight tenths
perches to a post, thence through one corner
of J. S. Hunt's land North thirteen degrees
west eight & eight tenths perches to a post
on line of George Varner's land, thence through
his land North twenty degrees west twenty eight
perches to a post, thence North six degrees east
ten perches to post, thence North sixty three degrees

West four & a half perches to a stone, thence
North thirty degrees east eighteen perches
to a post near George Varners old barn
thence North twenty two degrees east twenty
seven perches to a post on line of Henry
Varners land, thence through Henry Varners land
North forty seven degrees east twelve
perches to a post, thence North twenty eight
degrees east thirty four perches to a post
on line of Adam Varners, thence through
his land due North twelve perches
to a post on Public road near Adams
Varners. We have obtained releases
from all the owners of lands through which
the Road goes through (except J. J. Hunt) we intend
to see him

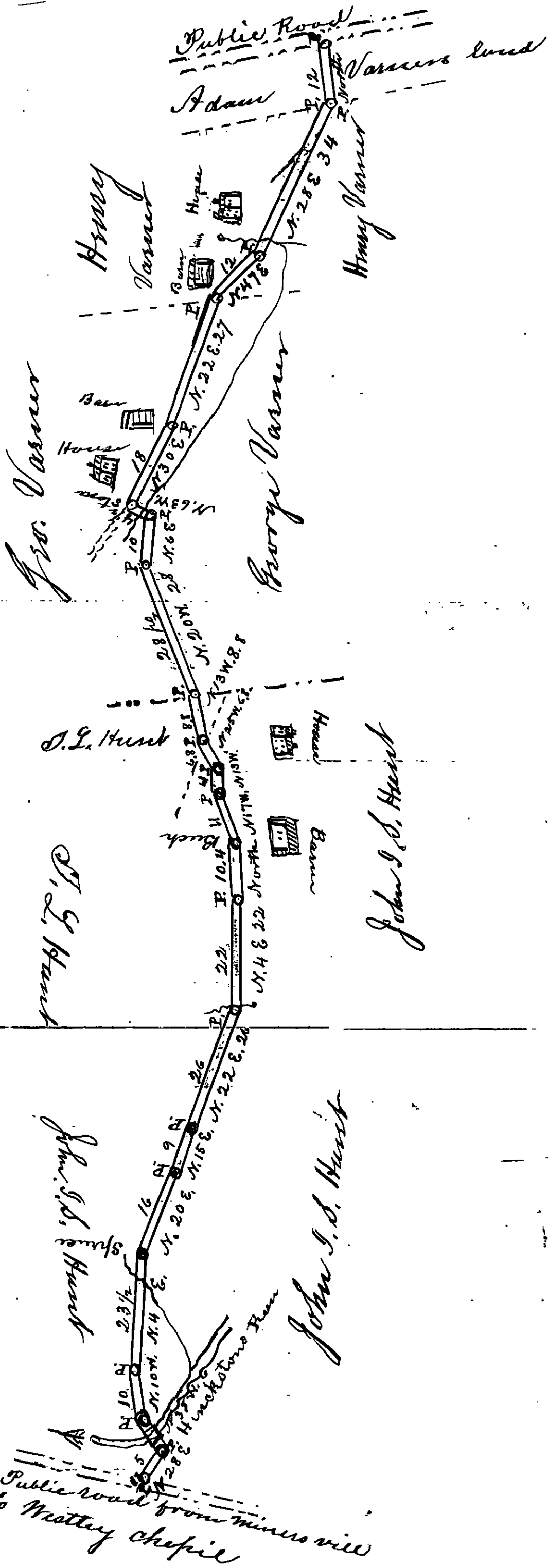

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Cambria
held at Chesham in the the said County, on the Thurs day of
March A. D. 1890, before the Honorable the Judges of the same
Court: Upon the petition of divers inhabitants of the township of Jackson West Taylor
in the said County, setting forth that they labor under inconvenience for want of a
public road or highway, to lead from
a point on public road at Adam Eames in Jackson
Township to intersect the road from Lewisville to the
Weekly Chapel on the Road to Elmington in West
Taylor Township

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the
same according to law. The Court upon due consideration had of the premises, do
order and appoint William Shick SURVEYOR,
and John L. S. Hunt & Jacob Angus

VIEWERS, to view the ground proposed for said
road, and if they view the same, and shall agree that there is occasion for such
road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance
and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to
private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the
petitioners, and that they make a report of their proceedings to the next Court
of Quarter Sessions to be held for said County, stating particularly whether they
judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft
thereof, and the courses and distances, and references to the improvements through
which it may pass.

NOTE.—"It shall be the duty of all persons appointed in the several counties of this Commonwealth to view and review any public or private road or bridge, if they shall decide in favor of locating said road or bridge, to endeavor to procure from the persons over whose land such location may be made releases from all claims for damages that might arise from the opening of such road or the building of such bridge; and in every case where said viewers shall fail to procure such releases, and it shall appear to them that any damages will be sustained, it shall be their duty to assess the damages and make report thereof signed by a majority of their number, and return the same, together with all releases obtained, to the Court of Quarter Sessions, and the damages so assessed shall be conclusive, or may be subject to appeal, review or modification, as may be provided by existing laws in the different counties of this Commonwealth."

"The persons appointed as aforesaid shall view such ground, and if they shall agree that there is occasion for a road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance, and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the petitioners."

"The viewers, as aforesaid, shall make report, at the next term of said Court, and in the said report shall state particularly: first, who of them were present at the view; second, whether they were severally sworn or affirmed; third, whether the road desired be necessary for a public or private road; they shall also annex and return to the Court a plot or draft thereof, stating the courses and distances, and noting briefly the improvements through which it may pass; and, whenever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said roads at an elevation not exceeding five degrees (except at the crossing of ravines and streams), where, by moderate filling and bridging, the declination of the road may be preserved within that limit."
