An Ordinance

Relating to the extension of Hemlock street:  
Be it ordained and enacted by the Burgess and  
Council of the Borough of Gallitzin, and it is  
hereby ordained and enacted by the authority of  
the same, that the following shall be an ordi-  
nance relating to the extension of Hemlock St.,  
in said Borough of Gallitzin to Church St.

Article 1.—Section 1.—That the Street of Hem-  
lock from its present terminus, in a Southerly  
direction to intersect and connect with Church  
street; running through the property of F. P.  
Gillen and Fred Ehrenfeld, shall be made a street  
in the Borough of Gallitzin, to be opened Twenty-  
one (21) feet wide, from its present terminus,  
until it intersects Church street.

Passed finally in Council on the Twentieth day  
of May, One Thousand Eight hundred and  
Eighty-nine.

An Ordinance

Relating to the extension of Jackson street:  
Be it ordained and enacted by the Burgess and  
Council of the Borough of Gallitzin, and it is  
hereby ordained and enacted by the authority of  
the same, that the following shall be an ordinance  
relating to the extension of Jackson street, in  
said Borough of Gallitzin to Church street.

Article 1.—Section 1.—That the Street of Jack-  
son from its present terminus, in a Northerly dir-  
ection to intersect and connect with Church St.,  
shall be made a street in the Borough of Gallit-  
zin, to be opened Forty (40) feet wide from its  
present terminus, until it intersects with Church  
street.

Passed finally in Council on the Twentieth day  
of May One Thousand Eight hundred and Eighty-  
Nine.

Speaker of the Burgess and Town Council of the Borough  
of Gallitzin was presented setting forth, That the  
Town Council of said Borough on the Twentieth day of  
May A.D. 1859 passed the following Ordinance:

An ordinance relating to the extension of Hemlock Street.

Be it ordained and enacted by the Burgess and Council of  
the Borough of Gallitzin and it is hereby ordained and  
enacted by the authority of the same, that the following  
shall be an ordinance relating to the extension of Hemlock  
St. in said Borough of Gallitzin to Church St. Article 1.

Section 1. That the Street of Hemlock from its present terminus  
in a southerly direction to intersect and connect with  
Church Street running through the property of F. R. Gillies  
and Fred Ebenfeld, shall be made a street in the Bor-  
ough of Gallitzin to be opened twenty (20) feet wide  
from its present terminus until it intersects Church Street.

An ordinance, relating to the extension of Jackson Street

Be it ordained and enacted by the Burgess and Town  
Council of the Borough of Gallitzin and it is hereby ordin-  
ed and enacted by the authority of the same, that the  
following shall be an ordinance relating to the extension  
of Jackson Street in the Borough of Gallitzin to Church Street.

Article 1 - Section 1 - That the Street of Jackson from its present  
terminus in a northerly direction to intersect and connect  
with Church St. shall be made a street in the Borough  
of Gallitzin to be opened forty (40) feet wide from its

present terminus, until it intersects with Church  
Street' Your Petitioners therefore pray your Honor to  
appoint seven distinguished freeholders of said  
Borough to view said Streets and premises effect-  
ed by the opening thereof having due regard to and  
making just allowance for the advantages which may  
have resulted or which seem likely to result to the owners  
of property abutting thereon for which damages ex-  
may be allowed or claimed, and to assess damages  
and award contributions according to the Act of  
Assembly in such case made and provided, and  
to make a report of their proceedings to next Session  
of the Court" The Court upon due consideration had  
of the premises appointed H. Scanlon, M. Bracken,  
Frankell Ley, John Doppel, S. C. Burke Thomas Brad-  
ley & J. J. McGeary as members who after viewing the  
and legal nature of the time and place of meeting  
shall proceed to view the premises and make a  
full report of their proceedings as herein required  
to the next Court of Quarter Sessions of said County  
and in which report they shall distinctly state  
that they have been sworn or affirmed according  
to law.



We Michael Bracken Frank McCay John J. Troxell  
Thomas Bradley J. J. McGarry and Harry Scallan  
do report first that having gave due and timely  
Notice of the time and place of meeting by three written  
notices posted in three public places adjacent  
to view a copy of Notice is hereto attached Second  
we report that having met at time and place  
designated by said notices and all being first  
Sworn according to law did view mark and lay  
out the following for a Public Road or highway viz  
Beginning at South end of Hemlock Street in Borough of  
Goldsboro thence through lots of Frederick Enfieldt and  
J. P. Gillow South twenty four and one half degrees West  
one hundred and thirty four feet to Church Street in  
said Borough of the width of twenty one feet which  
said road or street is in our opinion necessary for  
the accommodation of public travel we also further  
award a damage of two hundred dollars to Mr.  
Edreck Enfieldt also a damage of Sixty do-  
llars to J. P. Gillow

Also further report that we  
have viewed marked and laid out the following  
for a Public Road or highway in Borough of Golds-  
boro viz Beginning at a Post on Church Street thence

by line of land of J.H. Gilson and Pennsylvania Rail  
Road South Eighteen degrees West three hundred feet  
to Tunnel Street and cross the same at forty feet to  
North end of Bridge cross the Bridge at Ninety feet  
in all at four hundred and thirty feet we connect  
with Jackson Street in Borough of Hollidaysburg which  
in our opinion is necessary for public travel and  
safety of person and property all of which  
is respectfully submitted &c and we do  
further report that in our opinion that the opening  
of this thoroughfare on line of lands of J.H. Gilson  
and Pennsylvania Rail Road enhances the value of  
their properties more than it injures the same and  
therefore award them no damages
