Motion to strike Conformation absolute of review

Upon examination of the question presented in this application we are of the opinion that the Court has no power to grant the application however meritorious. The confirmation absolute was made as of the December Sep 1890, upon the 23 Jany 1891. The hearing been had at the argument court fixed for the hearing of cases coming up regularly at the December term 1890. The term has elapsed since the order was made, and under the authority of Hunter's Rulad 16 Pa 250, the court can not strike off this order, even though it be error to have entered it.

In justification of the action of the court in entering a decree of Conformation absolute we may be permitted to say that Counsel for the respective view & review agreed that the court should finally confirm one or the other of the reports, if in so doing the order is irregular, we think it must be corrected by the Supreme Court. Or proceedings instituted to get rid of this road now entered of record under the 18+19 sections of the Act of 12 Jne 1836. or the 1st section.





NOTE.—“It shall be the duty of all persons appointed in the several counties of this Commonwealth to view and review any public or private road or bridge, if they shall decide in favor of locating said road or bridge, to endeavor to procure from the persons over whose land such location may be made releases from all claims for damages that might arise from the opening of such road or the building of such bridge; and in every case where said viewers shall fail to procure such releases, and it shall appear to them that any damages will be sustained, it shall be their duty to assess the damages and make report thereon signed by a majority of their number, and return the same, together with all releases obtained, to the Court of Quarter Sessions, and the damages so assessed shall be conclusive, or may be subject to appeal, review or modification, as may be provided by existing laws in the different counties of this Commonwealth.”

“The persons appointed as aforesaid shall view such ground, and if they shall agree that there is occasion for a road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance, and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the petitioners.”

“The viewers, as aforesaid, shall make report, at the next term of said Court, and in the said report shall state particularly: first, who of them were present at the view; second, whether they were severally sworn or affirmed; third, whether the road desired be necessary for a public or private road; they shall also annex and return to the Court a plot or draft thereof, stating the courses and distances, and noting briefly the improvements through which it may pass; and, whenever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said roads at an elevation not exceeding five degrees (except at the crossing of ravines and streams), where, by moderate filling and bridging, the declination of the road may be preserved within that limit.”
