mencing at the Balltown road near the house of Timothy
Sheehan and ending at the house of Andrew Mc. Boy. The
petitioner further represents that said road principally
used by Andrew Mc. Boy and those residing along the road
that your petitioner suffers great damage and loss by
reason of not having the right to erect swinging gates
at the points where said road crosses the exterior lines
of his land. That is where the said road crosses the line
dividing the lands of Timothy Sheehan and the petitioner.
Your petitioner therefore prays the Court to appoint viewers
to inquire and report whether the gate or gates as prayed
for may be erected without much inconvenience to the
persons using such road. The Court upon due con-
sideration had of the premises appointed Thomas
Hagan John Barnard and Anthony Conrad viewers
to inquire and report whether the prayer of the petitioner may
be granted without much inconvenience to the persons

using such road.
