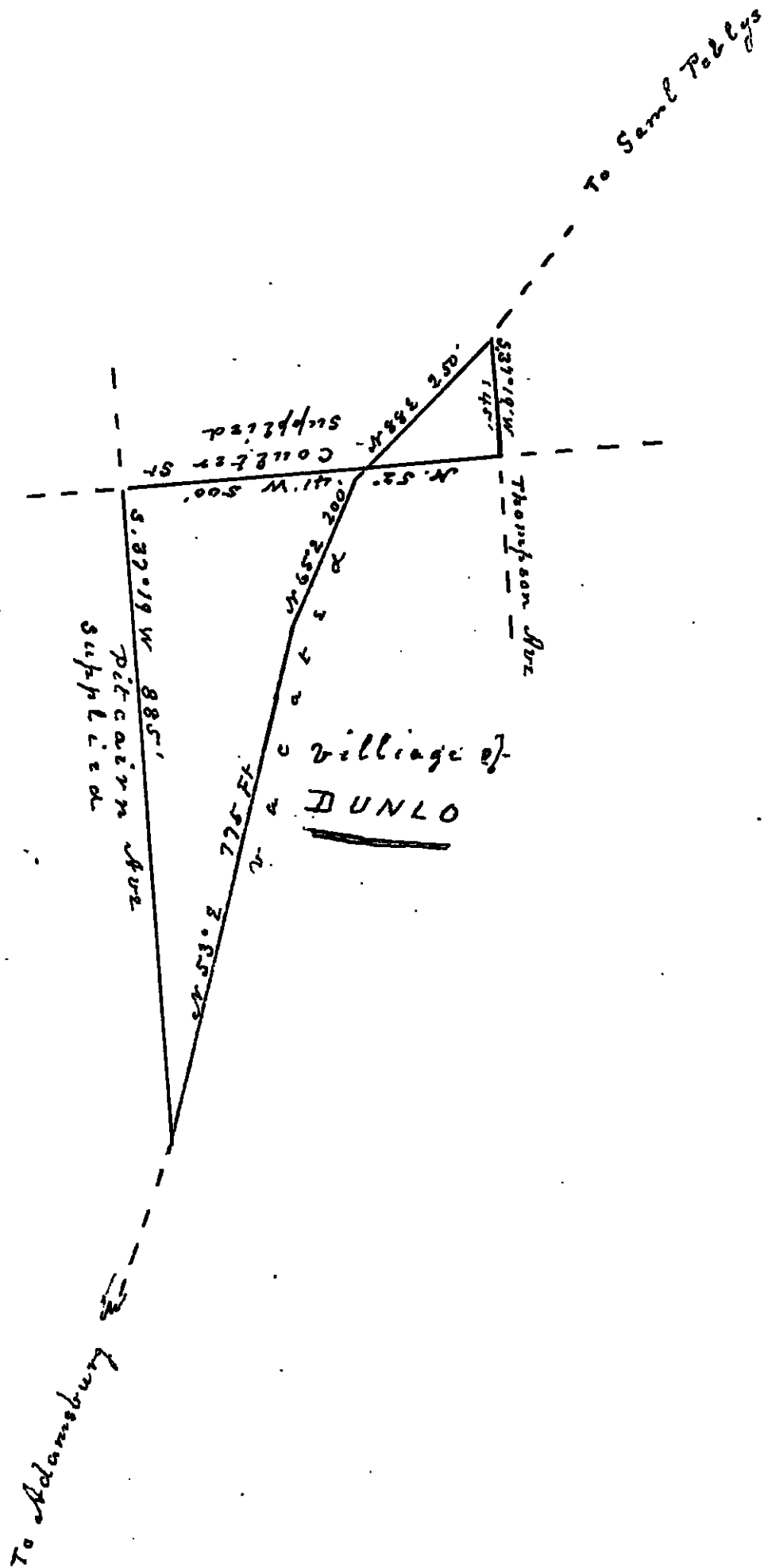
We The undersigned viewers appointed

Village of Dunlo - thence  $N 53^{\circ} E$  775 ft thence  
 $N 65^{\circ} E$  200 ft. thence  $N 88^{\circ} E$  250 ft to a  
point on road leading to Saml Pebleys - then  
supplied it running  $S 37^{\circ} 19' W$  along Thompson  
Ave 145' to Coulter St. Thence along Coulter  
St  $S 52^{\circ} 41'$  500 ft to Pitcairn Ave - Thence  
along Pitcairn Ave  $S. 37^{\circ} 19' W$  885 ft to place  
of beginning - 'All in The village of Dunlo'  
Believing this change necessary - We reco-  
mend the opening it up for a public  
road as laid out for public travel

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Dauphin  
held at Shrewsbury in the said County, on the Fifth day of  
October A. D. 1891, before the Honorable the Judges of the same  
Court: Upon the petition of divers inhabitants of the township of Adams  
in the said County, setting forth that they labor under inconvenience for want of a

Public road or highway, to lead from  
Long Pine Lick out leading from the Village of Adamsburg to  
the residence of Samuel Celly in said Township of Adams to wit:  
That portion of said Road commencing at a point where the  
South Fork Railroad crosses said public road to a point on  
Shompson Avenue at the West end of the Town Plot of the  
Mountain Road Company has become useless inconvenient  
and burdensome and they therefore pray the Court the said  
part of said road may be vacated and supplanted by  
another and more suitable route.

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to <sup>view and supply</sup> ~~view and lay out~~ the  
same according to law. The Court upon due consideration had of the premises, do  
order and appoint J. A. Shoemaker SURVEYOR,  
and John Lovett J. A. Hildebrand

<sup>vacate & supply in said</sup> ~~vacate & supply~~ VIEWERS, to view the ground proposed for said  
road, and if they view the same, and shall agree that there is occasion for such  
<sup>vacate & supply</sup> ~~vacate & supply~~ road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance  
and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to  
private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the  
petitioners, and that they make a report of their proceedings to the next Court  
of Quarter Sessions to be held for said County, stating particularly whether they  
judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft  
thereof, and the courses and distances, and references to the improvements through  
which it may pass.
