To the honorable A. V. Barker, President
Judge of the Court of Quarter Sessions of Leam-
burgh County,

The petition of the undersigned residents of
the Boroughs of East Leamburgh and Franklin,
in said County, humbly sheweth.

That a petition was presented to your Honore-
able Court at March Sessions, 1891, by certain
residents of said boroughs, praying the Court
to appoint persons to view and designate a
site for a bridge across the Leamburgh River
at said boroughs, which was done accordingly,
and the persons so appointed did view,
designate and return for approval, a site
for such bridge, commencing at the south-
ern terminus of Main Street in East
Leamburgh, and running in a southerly
direction across said river to Franklin; that
said location is not a suitable one, and
would be inconvenient for the citizens of said
boroughs as well as for the general public;
that the approach to the bridge on the East
Leamburgh side will run through or over
the yards of the Pennsylvania Railroad
Company, and, as your petitioners verily
believe will subject the said Company
and its employees to great inconvenience;
that it will be difficult to locate a street

from the main struts in Franklin to connect with the bridge; that a bridge can be located at a point much more convenient for the residents of the two boroughs and vicinity, and which can be constructed at less cost and will not be so expensive to keep in repair.

Your petitioners, therefore, do most respectfully remonstrate against the confirmation of said report, and humbly pray that the same may not be confirmed, and they, as in duty bound, will ever pray, &c.

petitioners present -


Said bridge as located being entirely too



At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Darby,
held at Darby in the said County, on the 26th day of
Decemr, A. D. 1801, before the Honorable the Judges of the same
Court: Upon the petition of divers inhabitants of the Borough of Darby, and
in the said County, setting forth that they labor under inconvenience for want of a
road or highway, to lead from Bridgeton mounted over the Darby river being the
line of Darby Borough and that of the Borough of Franklin in
the place where Main Street (in East Darby) extends
crosses the Darby river into the Borough of Franklin and that the
construction of such bridge will require more expence than it is
reasonable the Darby Borough should bear.

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to ^{it etc} view and lay out the
same according to law. The Court upon due consideration had of the premises, do
order and appoint John J. Bondy Surveyor,
and John J. Bondy Viewer.

Bondy VIEWERS, to view the ground proposed for said
road, and if they view the same, and shall agree that there is occasion for such
Bondy, road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance
and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to
private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the
petitioners, and that they make a report of their proceedings to the next Court
of Quarter Sessions to be held for said County, stating particularly whether they
judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft
thereof, and the courses and distances, and references to the improvements through
which it may pass.

NOTE.—"It shall be the duty of all persons appointed in the several counties of this Commonwealth to view and review any public or private road or bridge, if they shall decide in favor of locating said road or bridge, to endeavor to procure from the persons over whose land such location may be made releases from all claims for damages that might arise from the opening of such road or the building of such bridge; and in every case where said viewers shall fail to procure such releases, and it shall appear to them that any damages will be sustained, it shall be their duty to assess the damages and make report thereof signed by a majority of their number, and return the same, together with all releases obtained, to the Court of Quarter Sessions, and the damages so assessed shall be conclusive, or may be subject to appeal, review or modification, as may be provided by existing laws in the different counties of this Commonwealth."

"The persons appointed as aforesaid shall view such ground, and if they shall agree that there is occasion for a road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance, and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the petitioners."

"The viewers as aforesaid, shall make report, at the next term of said Court, and in the said report shall state particularly: first, who of them were present at the view; second, whether they were severally sworn or affirmed; third, whether the road desired be necessary for a public or private road; they shall also annex and return to the Court a plot or draft thereof, stating the courses and distances, and noting briefly the improvements through which it may pass; and, whenever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said roads at an elevation not exceeding five degrees (except at the crossing of ravines and streams), where, by moderateilling and bridging, the declination of the road may be preserved within that limit."
