all been first severally sworn
or affirmed, in pursuance of
said order, we have viewed the
premises aforesaid, and
are of opinion that a Bridge
over Stony creek, at the
mouth of a 40 ft. street that is
laid out & near where a public
road leading from Red bridge
over Hog Back to intersect the
Valley Pike, is necessary and
that the erecting of such a bridge
would be attended with more
expence than it is reasonable .

that the said Townships
should bear, and recommend
that most of the means to build
the same be furnished by the County
And ^{do} report for public use
according to the following courses
& distances, Beginning at a post
at the edge of Stonycreek, and
at end of Goder Street, thence
across said Stonycreek North
forty five degrees east two hun-
dred & twenty five feet to the edge
of Valley Turnpike, in Upper Goder
Township. A draft or plot
whereof is hereto annexed



Court: Upon the petition of divers inhabitants of the townships of Stony Creek & Upper Coal
in the said County, setting forth that they labor under inconvenience for want of a
bridge ~~over the Stony Creek Run~~ to connect the Township road which
leads from the Red Bridge across what is known as the Key
Rock creek or Valley Run, there connecting the Townships
aforesaid and that the expense of erecting said bridge
would be too burdensome upon the inhabitants of said Town-
ships,

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to ~~do~~ ^{view and lay out the} same according to law. The Court upon due consideration had of the premises, do
order and appoint P. Slick SURVEYOR,
and John J. Daugherty & Geo. Woods

~~Bridge~~ VIEWERS, to view the ground proposed for said
road, and if they view the same, and shall agree that there is occasion for such
~~bridge~~ road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance
and the best ground for a ~~bridge~~ road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to
private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the
petitioners, and that they make a report of their proceedings to the next Court
of Quarter Sessions to be held for said County, stating particularly whether they
judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft
thereof, and the courses and distances, and references to the improvements through
which it may pass.
