the petition of James Herrington Burgess of the Borough of Morrillville respectfully represents That by Ordinance of said Borough duly passed and approved by the Burgess and Town Council of said Borough Maple Avenue a Street in said Borough was declared a public Street to the width of 30 feet as per survey and report of viewers to the Court in 1876 fixing width of said Street at thirty feet between Chandler St. and Laurel Hill St.

Therefore your petitioner prays the Court to appoint seven disinterested freeholders of said Borough who after first being duly sworn or affirmed to perform their duties under the Act of Assembly in such case made and provided shall go upon the ground and view the premises described in this petition having regard to both advantage and disadvantage caused to the several properties along the line of and adjoining said Maple Avenue between Chandler Street and Laurel Hill St. and shall allow to all persons injured thereby such damages as they shall have sustained respectively over and above all advantages and shall also make assessments for contribution upon all property as shall be benefitted over and above all disadvantages.

To the Honorable A. V. Barker, Judge of the Court of Quarter Sessions of
Cambria County.

We the undersigned persons appointed by the within order of Court to view, lay out and widen Maple Avenue, a Street in the Borough of Morrellville as per ~~view~~ view, survey and report of viewers to the Court in 1876, fixing the width of said Street at Thirty Feet between Chandler Street and Laurel Hill Street, do respectfully report that after giving due legal notice by hand-bills posted in said Borough, and by personal notice served upon land owners whose land adjoin or abut upon said Maple Avenue, did meet at the Municipal Building in the Borough of Morrellville on the 6th day of March, 1894, at 10 o'clock, A. M. the following named viewers as appointed by the Court, D. W. Young, A. S. Fitchner, David D. James, R. H. Briney, W. A. Palmer, Darwin Cassatt, and Simon Overdorff, all of which are free holders, and having all been severally sworn or affirmed in pursuance of said order we have viewed, laid out, and do return for public use to the full width of Thirty Feet the following Street. Beginning at the intersection of Maple Avenue with Chandler Street, thence on the one side by land of Gale Heslop, William C. Rhodes, J. J. Strayer, G. C. Tomb to an Alley, thence by John A. Thomas, George Ross, and Jacob Bowers, on the other side by land of J. J. Strayer, Stephens Heirs, Aaron Strayer, Thomas Leadbeter, Levi Edwards, Anna Rogers, and Joseph Stibick, North Thirty-five (35) Degrees, and Ten (10) Minutes East, Eight Hundred and Five (805) Feet, having the width of Thirty Feet to Laurel Hill Street, a plot or draft whereof is hereto annexed. And we do further represent that in viewing said Street that we took into consideration both the advantages and disadvantages caused to the several property owners whose lands adjoin said Street, and we do respectfully report that the advantages to the property owners along said Street by the widening of said Street is equal to any damages which

any of said property owners may have sustained by reason of the widening of the said Maple Avenue, and we do further specifically report that we find that the widening of said Street only effects the property of Joseph Stibick in any way, that all the other property owners along said Street have set their fences back so that none of said fences are on the line of said Street except the fence of Joseph Stibick which is shown in said draft attached, and we are of the opinion that Joseph Stibick will receive advantages by the widening of said Street equal to any damages he may have sustained, and therefore we find that none of said property owners along said Maple Avenue are entitled to damages nor liable to the assessment for benefits, which said Street so as aforesaid laid out and widened we are of the opinion is necessary for a public Street of said Borough to the full width of Thirty Feet as shown by said draft.
