


To the honorable the Judge within named.

We the undersigned persons appointed by the within order of Court, to view the bridge therein mentioned, respectfully report: That having been present at the bridge, and having all been first been duly sworn in pursuance of the said order we have viewed the premises, (a plot whereof is hereto attached) and after due examination we find that some of the main timbers of said bridge are badly decayed, and one of the abutments is somewhat wrecked <sup>as the old one was</sup>. Therefore we are of opinion that a new bridge is necessary; and that the erecting of such bridge would be attended with more expense than the Townships of Chest and Elder (which are connected by said bridge) could reasonably bear.

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Cambria, held at Olcoville in the said County, on the 23rd day of May, A. D. 1892, before the Honorable the Judges of the same Court: Upon the petition of divers inhabitants of the townships of Chest & Elder in the said County, setting forth that they labor under inconvenience for want of a road or highway, to lead from the bridge over Cheat Creek at Thomas' Mills is unsafe and that a new bridge is much wanted where the highway crosses Cheat Creek, at that point and that the expense of erecting said bridge would be too burdensome upon the inhabitants of said Townships.

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law. The Court upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint Paul Maher SURVEYOR, and Henry Leiden & Anthony Anna

Bridg <sup>etc.</sup> VIEWERS, to view the ground proposed for said road, and if they view the same, and shall agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, and that they make a report of their proceedings to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said County, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, and references to the improvements through which it may pass.
