We the Subscribers the persons appointed
by said Court to view and lay out the Road -
herein named or mentioned

Report that Public notice having been given
by written advertisements of the time and where and
when they would meet for the purpose of discharging
their duties according to law and that having
been first affirmed severally in the manner
and form prescribed by the said order that
all of us J.W. Miller Phinehas Rhodes and
George Gramling met at the time and place
advertised and having viewed the ground for
the proposed Road and all of us concurring and
agreeing that same is necessary for public use
and now did lay out and return the same for
a public Road. Beginning at a public Road
at Pitcairn Avenue thence North twenty four
and one half degrees West twenty three and one
half perches to a post in Road thence North thirty


