

To the Honorable A. V. Barker, President Judge of
the Court of Quarter Sessions of Cambria County, Pa.

We the undersigned persons appointed by the
within order of Court to view & lay out the street therein
mentioned, Respectfully report: That having been
present at the view of the ground proposed for
such road, and having been all severally sworn,
or affirmed, according to law, we met
on the 11th day of August, A. D. 1874, & have viewed,
and laid out, and do return for public use,
the following street, to wit: Beginning in the Ehren-
feld road at a point at or near the dwelling
of A. Kerner, thence North sixty-two degrees
East one hundred and eighty-five feet to a point
on lot of Mrs. Sarah Hare on the North side and
land of the P. R. R., on the other side, thence North
six degrees West sixty-five feet to the Jackson
road at a point on line of lot of Mrs. Sarah Hare
on the one side & at a point at or near the corner
of John D. Wentroth's lot on the other side as
will appear more fully by the Draft hereto at-
tached.

In view of the advantages and disad-
vantages caused by the opening of the within named
street, the viewers are of the opinion that no damage
has been done the property of the P. R. R. Co., & John
D. Wentroth & that a damage to the amount of
fifteen dollars will be done to the property

of Mrs. Sarah Hare & for the payment of which
the following assessments have been laid.

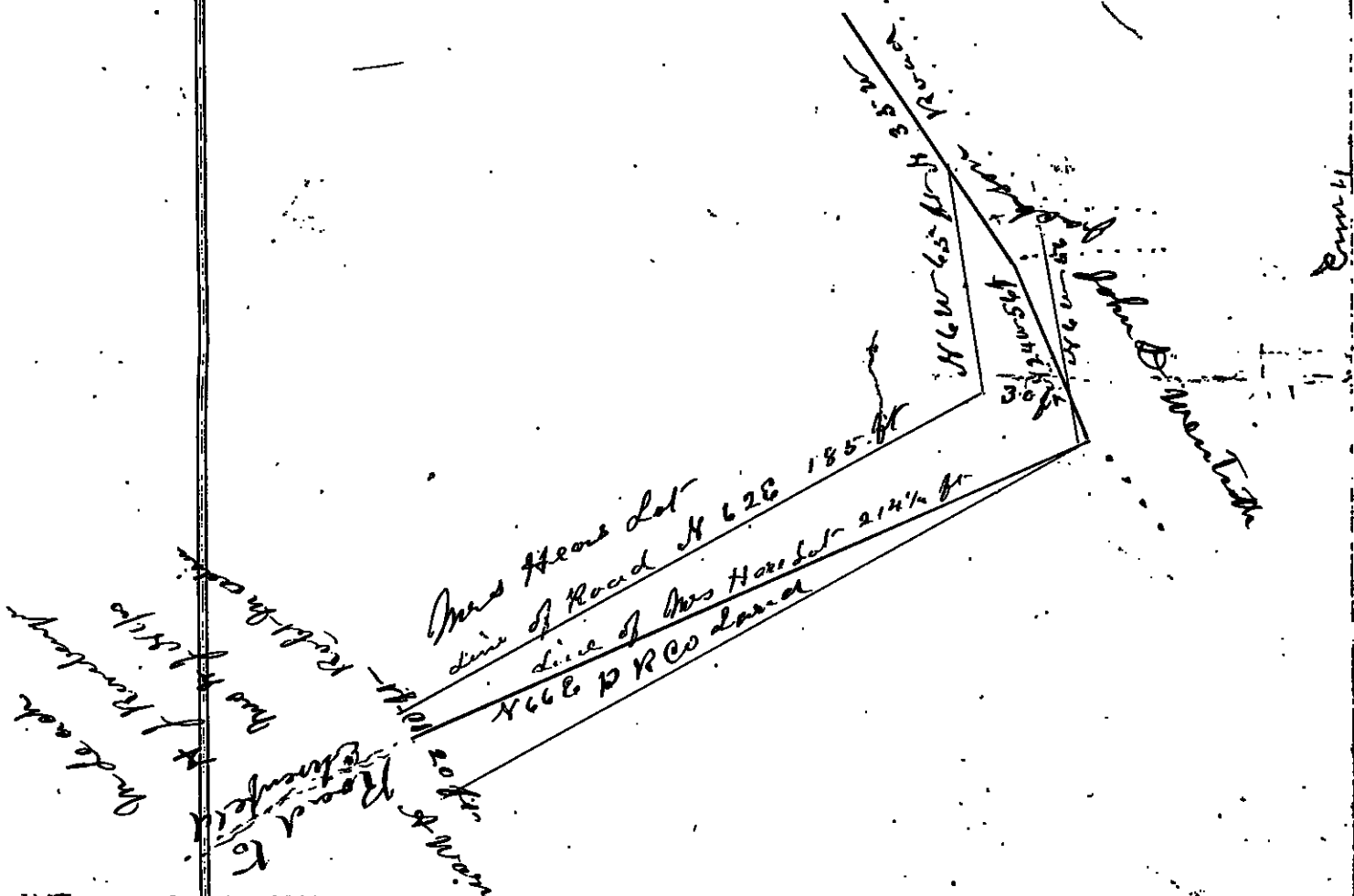

At a Court of Quarter Sessions held at Ebensburg in and for said County on Monday July 2nd 1894 before the Hon. A. V. Barker President Judge the petition of Burgers and Town Council of the Borough of Summerhill in said Co. was presented setting forth that on the 5th day of June 1894 an ordinance of the said Borough was passed reading as follows: An ordinance authorizing the naming and opening of Madison Street in the Borough of Summerhill County of Cambria and State of Pennsylvania. Be it ordained and enacted by the Burgers and Town Council of the Borough of Summerhill that a street should be opened to the width 30 feet in said Borough as a public street known and designated as Madison Street beginning in the Edenfeld road at a point at or near the dwelling of A. Warner and ending in the Jackson road at a point at or near the corner of J. W. Nuttall's Lot. All ordinances of the Borough of Summerhill in relation to streets and alleys are hereby extended to said Madison Street. Ordained and enacted into a law in Council this 18th day of June A. D. 1894. Your petitioner therefore pray the Court to appoint seven disinterested freeholders of such Borough to view the premises described in such ordinance having regard both to the advantages and disadvantages caused to the several properties along the line of and adjoining said streets and alleys for the purpose of assessing

and allowing to all persons injured thereby such damages as they shall have sustained by reason of the opening of said streets and alleys and also to make assessments or contributions upon all such properties as shall be benefitted by the opening of said streets and alleys in such sum respectively as they may have been benefitted over and above all disadvantages. The Court upon due consideration had of the premises appointed W. J. McConnell, Michael Gully, Thos Seaman, Peter Brown, Zachariah Sumner, John S. McLaughlin, Wm. W. Blawie, as viewers who after given due legal notice of the time and place of meeting shall proceed to view the premises and make a full report of their proceedings as herein prayed for to the next Court of Quarter Sessions of said County and in which report they shall state distinctly that they had been sworn or affirmed according to law.

That on the 5th day of June, 1894, an
Ordinance of the said Borough was passed
reading as follows:

An ordinance authorizing the naming
and opening of Madison Street in the Borough
of Summerhill, County of Cambria and
State of Pennsylvania.

Be it ordained & enacted by the Bur-
gess and Town Council of the Borough of
Summerhill, that a street should be opened
to the width 30 feet, in said Borough,
as a public street, known & designated
as Madison Street, beginning in the Eh-
renfeld road at a point at or near the
dwelling of A. Werner and ending in
the Jackson road at a point at or
near the corner of J. D. Kuntroth's Lot.

All ordinances of the Borough of
Summerhill in relation to streets and

alleys are hereby extended to said Madison Street.

Ordained and enacted into a law in council this 18th day of June A. D. 1894.
