Exceptives of John Ray
one of Supervisor of said Township to re-
port of road. (See Report of Commissioners April 21, 1877)
in Road Book Vol. 4, page 445. 1st June 1877.

1. The Report of Vincors, appointed to inspect the said
proposed road shows the termini of said
Road to be in Stonycreek & Richland Township
respectively.

2. Said Report shows termini to be different
from the points mentioned in petition.

3. Said Report shows termini to be indefinite
and uncertain and does not show that
same are in Cambria County.

4. Draft returned by Vincors is imperfect in
that it wrong names a bathing property own-
ers and omits names of others.

5. Vincors failed to access damages due a-
bathing property owners and failed to obtain
releases from all of the same.

6. Some of those clearing and purporting to be
owners of land are not in fact the real owners
as they say.

7. Appeals for damages have been filed by abutting property owners, to whom no damages had been assessed early, or whom were released of same.

8. No notice of proposed new wagon road County Commissioners and no bond filed by them according to law.

Road in question is unnecessary and expensive and burdensome to taxpayers.

10 less than one year has elapsed since a similar proceeding for same, so nearly same road, built. In view of foregoing, your petitioning party thereupon may be allowed to file same petition.

report that after giving notice as required
by law and J. L. Elder Thos H. Myers and
H. J. Conway viewers having all equipment

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Cambria held at Ebensburg in the said County, on the thirtieth day of August A. D. 1896, before the Honorable Judge of the said Court: Upon the petition of divers inhabitants of the township of Gallitzin in the said County, setting forth that they labor under inconvenience for want of a Poorhouse road or highway, to lead from the depot at Shawney on the Cresson and Canalport Railroad to the Township Road leading from Gallitzin to Ashville at a point about ten rods East of a Street leading from said Township road to the village of Eaton.

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law: The Court upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint J. S. Elder SURVEYOR, and Hos. H. Myron and J. N. Conway,

VIEWERS, to view the ground proposed for said road, and if they view the same, and shall agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, and that they make a report of their proceedings to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said County, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, and references to the improvements through which it may pass.

NOTE.—"It shall be the duty of all persons appointed in the several counties of this Commonwealth to view and review any public or private road or bridge, if they shall decide in favor of locating said road or bridge, to endeavor to procure from the persons over whom land such location may be made releases from all claims for damages that might arise from the opening of such road or the building of such bridge; and in every case where said viewers shall fail to procure such releases, and it shall appear to them that any such release can be obtained, it shall be their duty to assess the damages and make report thereof signed by a majority of their number, and return the same, together with all releases obtained, to the Court of Quarter Sessions, and the damages so assessed shall be conclusive, or may be subject to appeal, review or modification, as may be provided by existing laws in the different counties of this Commonwealth."

"The persons appointed as aforesaid shall view such ground, and if they shall agree that there is occasion for a road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance, and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the petitioners."

"The viewers, as aforesaid, shall make report, at the next term of said Court, and in the said report shall state particularly: first, who of them were present at the view; second, whether they were severally sworn or affirmed; third, whether the road desired be necessary for public or private road; they shall also annex and return to the Court a plot or draft thereof, stating the course and distances, and noting briefly the improvements through which it may pass; and, whenever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said road at an elevation not exceeding five degrees (except at the crossing of ravines, and streams), where, by moderate filling and bridging, the declination of the road may be preserved within that limit."
