

Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, }

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Cambria held at Ebensburg in the said County, on the Third day of June A. D. 1895, before the Honorable Judge of the said Court: Upon the petition of divers inhabitants of the township of Stony Creek in the said County, setting forth that they labor under inconvenience for want of a public road or highway, to lead from old public road on land of Samuel Deaugh near the end of said road leading from the old red bridge to a point at the Stony Creek River in said Township and extending thence to the South End of Central Avenue at line of the City of Johnstown in the Seventeenth Ward of said City

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law. The Court upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint J. W. Miller SURVEYOR and James J. Gader and Christopher C. Deaugh

VIEWERS, to view the ground proposed for said road, and if they view the same, and shall agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, and that they make a report of their proceedings to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said County, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances; and references to the improvements through which it may pass.

NOTE.—"It shall be the duty of all persons appointed in the several counties of this Commonwealth to view and review any public or private road or bridge, if they shall decide in favor of locating said road or bridge, to endeavor to procure from the persons over whose land such location may be made releases from all claims for damages that might arise from the opening of such road or the building of such bridge; and in every case where said viewers shall fail to procure such releases, and it shall appear to them that any damages will be sustained, it shall be their duty to assess the damages and make report thereof signed by a majority of their number, and return the same, together with all releases obtained, to the Court of Quarter Sessions, and the damages so assessed shall be conclusive, or may be subject to appeal, review or modification, as may be provided by existing laws in the different counties of this Commonwealth."

"The persons appointed as aforesaid shall view such ground, and if they shall agree that there is occasion for a road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance, and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the petitioners."

"The viewers, as aforesaid, shall make report, at the next term of said Court, and in the said report shall state particularly: first, who of them were present at the view; second, whether they were severally sworn or affirmed; third, whether the road desired be necessary for a public or private road; they shall also annex and return to the Court a plot or draft thereof, stating the courses and distances, and noting briefly the improvements through which it may pass; and, whenever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said roads at an elevation not exceeding five degrees (except at the crossing of ravines and streams), where, by moderate filling and bridging, the declination of the road may be preserved within that limit."

To the judge of the Court of quarter Sessions of Cambria County

The undersigned Viewers appointed to view the ground proposed for said Road in the annexed order mentioned and to lay out the said Road if they agree there is occasion for the same Respectfully Report That they caused notice of the time and place of their meeting to be given to the persons and in the manner ~~directed by said order~~ as directed by Law

That in accordance with said notice all the viewers met for the purpose of their appointment at nine O'clock on Thursday the twenty second day of August 1895 at the Point designated for the beginning of the proposed Road: That all of the viewers ^{first severally} ~~were~~ duly Affirmed according to Law: That after being thus affirmed they all proceed to view the ground proposed for said Road and agreed that there was occasion for the same and that the same is necessary for Public use: They therefore proceeded to lay out said Road in the manner directed by said Order as follows
Beginning at an old Public Road near the end, ^{orally} on land of Samuel W. Blough in Strong-creek township, Cambria County

Penna thence down along the bank of the
 Stony Creek River, South eighty three and three
 fourth degrees East Eight and one-tenth perches
 South Sixty Six degrees East fifteen and four-
 tenth perches to line of Andrew Blough, ^{thence on arable land} South
 fifty degrees East nineteen and six-tenth — ^{thence on arable land of J. J. Yoder}
 perches to line of J. J. Yoder, South forty six
 degrees East nineteen and eight tenth perches
 to line of Emma Blough, ^{thence on arable land of said Emma Blough} South forty four
 and one half degrees East, nineteen and
 six-tenth perches to line of Mary Blough. —
^{thence on arable land of Mary Blough} South forty degrees East twenty perches to line
 Samuel W. Blough, ^{thence on arable land of Samuel W. Blough} South forty one and one
 half degrees East twenty two and seven-tenth
 degrees to a post. North fifty nine and one
 half degrees East four and one half perches
 to a post 15 ft from the abutment of the B & O
 Rail Road ^{thence on wooded land of Samuel W. Blough} Bridge, South forty seven degrees
 East nine and four-tenth perches to a post
 South fifty six and three-fourth degrees East
 forty four perches. South Seventy four degrees
 East fifteen and one-tenth perches South Seventy
 nine and one half degrees East nine and
 five-tenth perches to a Post near a stump at
 coal Bank. North Sixty seven and three fourth
 degrees East Seventeen and six-tenth perches —
 North fifty five and one-fourth degrees East

Six and Eight-tenth perches north forty three—
and one half degrees East. fourteen and three-
tenth perches north forty one degrees East twelve
and six-tenth perches north twenty degrees

said Road noting thereon the improvement
through which it passes and which they —
submit as a part of this report

They further Report that they have
endeavored to procure from the respective
owners of land through which said road
will pass releases in writing of all claims to
damages that may arise from the opening
of the same, and have procured releases
from Samuel W. Blough, Andrew Blough,
J. J. Goder Emma Blough, Mary
Blough.

But have failed to procure release
from Charles von Lünen

and have taken into consideration
the advantages as well as the disadvantages
devolved to the said Charles von Lünen

from the said Road passing through their
lands respectively. They sustain no
damages. Thereby

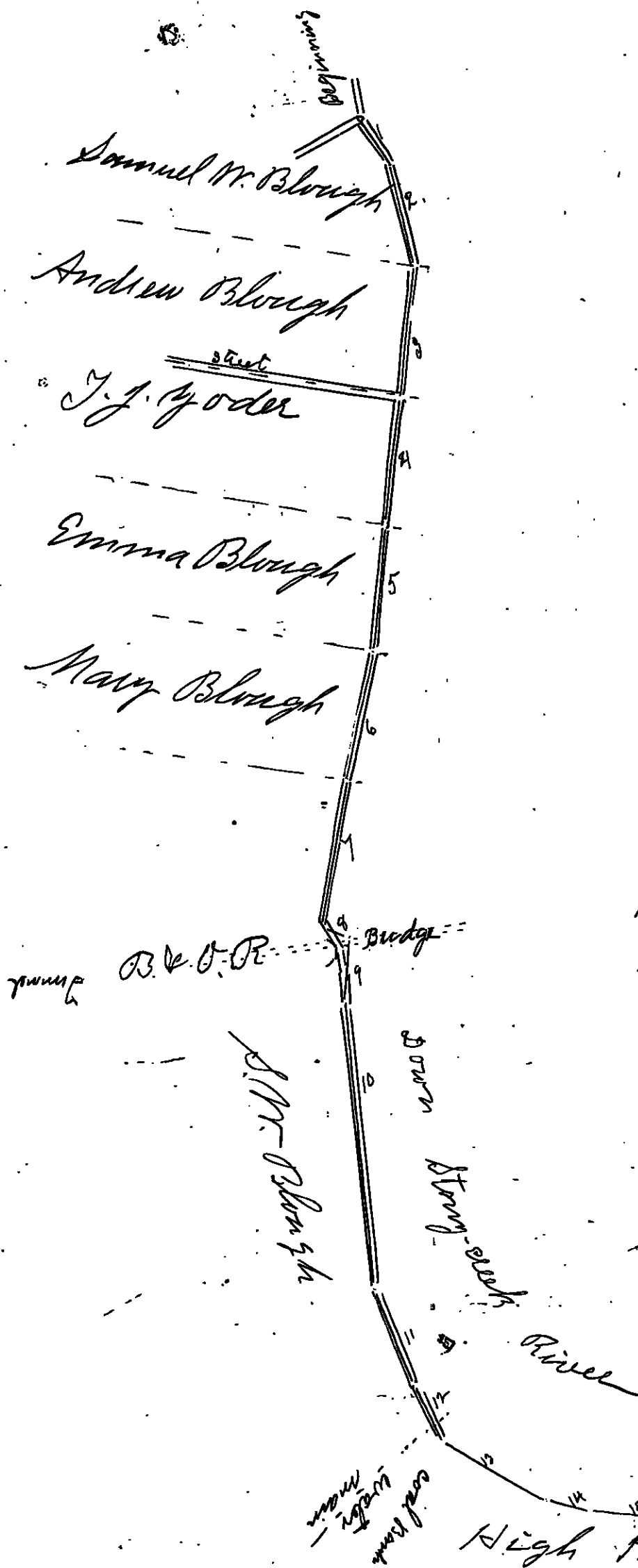
