VIEWERS, to review the ground proposed for said road, and if they view the same, and shall agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the petitioners, and that they make a report of their proceedings to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said County, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, and references to the improvements through which it may pass.





Millman in Susquehanna Township. The undersigned Supervisor of Elder Township to wit George Simmlybarger and Harry Fahner and citizens of said township respectfully remonstrate against the confirmation of the said road. For the reasons set forth

(1st) first, That there is no necessity for said road for the accommodation of the public or the citizens of either Elder or Susquehanna Township, that the application made by a citizen of Susquehanna Township is only for his own use as there are no other parties along the said proposed road that would be benefited or reside along the line of the proposed road.
