Note.—"It shall be the duty of all persons appointed in the several counties of this Commonwealth to view and review any public or private road or bridge, if they shall decide in favor of locating said road or bridge, to endeavor to procure from the person or persons over whoseland such location may be made releases from all claims for damages that might arise from the opening of such road or the building of such bridge; and in every case where said viewers shall fail to procure such releases, and it shall appear to them that any damages will be sustained, it shall be their duty to assess the damages and make report thereof signed by a majority of their number, and return the same, together with all releases obtained, to the Court of Quarter Sessions, and the damages so assessed shall be conclusive, or may be subject to appeal, review or modification, as may be provided by existing laws in the different counties of this Commonwealth."

"The persons appointed as aforesaid shall view such ground, and if they shall agree that there is occasion for a road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance, and the best ground for a road, and it such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the petitioners."

"The viewers, as aforesaid, shall make report, at the next term of said Court, and in the said report shall state particularly: first, who of them were present at the view; second, whether they were severally sworn or affirmed; third, whether the road desired be necessary for a public or private road; they shall also annex and return to the Court a plot or draft thereof, stating the courses and distances, and noting briefly the improvements through which it may pass; and, whenever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said roads at an elevation not exceeding five degrees (except at the crossing of rayines and streams.) where, by moderate filling and bridging, the declination of the road may be prese

To the Honorable, the Judge of the Court of Quarter Sessions of Cambria County.

We the subscribers, persons appointed by the Court to view the place proposed for the bridge in the within order mentioned, respectfully report: That all of said viewers appointed, having been present at the view of the place proposed for the bridge within mentioned, and having all been first severally sworn, in pursuance of said order, we have viewed the premises aforesaid, and are of opinion that a bridge over Little Chest Creek, at the place where Fifth Avenue, in the Borough of Patton, crosses the said Creek, is necessary, and that the erection of such a bridge would be attended with more expense than it is reasonable that the Borough of Patton should bear.

of Patton, in the said County, respectfully showeth, that a bridge is much wanted over Little Chest Creek, at the place where the public street or highway known as Fifth Avanue crosses the said creek, in the Borough sforesaid, that the bridge now being used is only a temporary structure, built by the Borough of Patton, and is degred and damaged to such an extent that it is unsafe for public travel and a new bridge is necessary to meet the accommodation of the public travel; and that the expense of erecting said bridge would be too heavy and burthensome upon the inhabitants of the said Borough.

To the Honorable A. V. Barker, Judge of the Court of Quarter Sessions, Cambria County, Pennsylvania.

We the undersigned, viewers appointed by an order of Court dated October 23rd, 1900, do report that in pursuance with the order we met at the location of the acid bridge on Fifth Avenue in the Borough of Patton, Cambria County, Pennsylvania November 2, 1900, and after having been severally and duly sworn to perform the duties of our appointment impartially and according to the best of our judgment. All the viewers being present, viewed the said bridge, its substructure and superstructure and the work thereof, and do agree that the plans and specifications have been followed out in the construction of the bridge, with the following exceptions.

First. The plans call for six lines of 3" X 6" oak spiking pieces to run lengthwise with the bridge, on which the floor plank are to be bolted. We find that in some places there are but four lines of these spiking pieces, therefore we recommend that these additional spiking pieces be added according to the plans and specifications.

Second. The plans and specifications indicate that the floor plank will splice over the center joists. We find, however, that they splice, in some cases, over other joists in addition to the center joists. We therefore recommend that the floor be laid according to the plans and specifications.

Third. We are of the opinion that the masonry work is according to the plans and specifications, and that the bridge is built, according to the best of our knowledge and judgment, according to the plans and specifications, with the exceptions noted above.

We are of the opinion, however, that it is a mistake to lay the floor plank as they are now being laid, and as shown by the plans and specifications. We recommend that the plank be laid parallel to the line of the abutments, and that they splice in two places on the width of the bridge. We also find that the floor plank on the sidewalks do not extend to meet the plank of the main driveway, leaving a space of one foot open on each side, that is dangerous. We therefore recommend that the floor plank on the sidewalk extend out to meet the floor plank of the main driveway, and also that a 6" X 8" oak piece be bolted along the out-

side edges of the main driveway, in order to protect the main trusses so that the hubs of wagons cannot strike the same.

We further find that at least part of the material that was excavated for the abutment foundations, was put in the Creek Charnel and left there, thereby reducing the distance from the Creek hed to the under side of the bridge girders so much that the bridge will be in constart danger from high water, and we recommend that some of the material in the Creek charnel, between the abutments, be removed by the Borough at once, to ensure the safety of the hridge:
