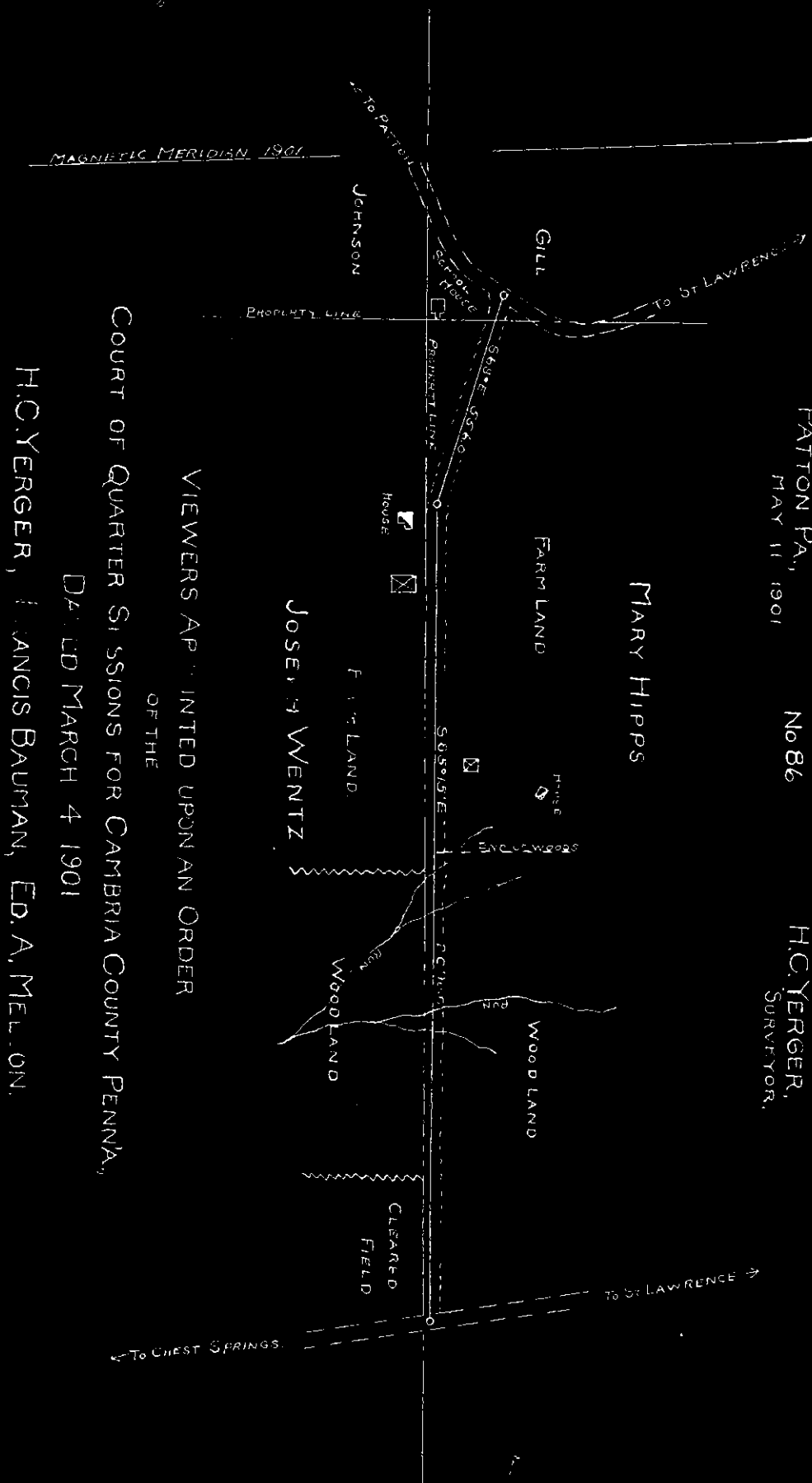

REPORT OF VIEWERS.

To the Honorable the Judge of Quarter Sessions for Cambria County, State of Penn'a.

We, the undersigned, viewers appointed by the within order of court to view and lay out a public road therein mentioned, respectfully report. That having all been present at the view of the ground proposed for such road, and having all been first severally sworn ~~and~~, in pursuance of the said order we have viewed and laid out, and do return for public use, the following road, to wit: Beginning at a point in the St. Lawrence and Patton public road about one hundred and fifty feet north of the Wentz Public School House in Chest Township; thence along the centre line of present private road South sixty eight degrees east five hundred and fifty six feet to a point in the centre of said private road opposite the West side Jos. Wentz farm house; thence along the centre of present private road south eighty five degrees fifteen minutes East two thousand and ninety feet to a point intersecting the public road that branches off the St. Lawrence and Patton road at the Daniel Warner estate, and leading to Chest Springs, and lying wholly within the Township of Chest, Cambria County, Penn'a.

This road as viewed follows the line of a present private road constructed upon the land of Esquire Gill and Mary Hipps and adjoining the land of Jos. Wentz. That portion at the beginning extending for five hundred and fifty six feet is at a greater declination than five degrees being about seven degrees or twelve feet to the hundred, but in the judgment of the undersigned viewers we deem it impracticable to view and lay out a road in any other place. A plat or draft whereof is hereto annexed. Which said road so as aforesaid laid out, we are of the opinion is necessary for a public road.

COMMONWEALTH OF PENNSYLVANIA. }
COUNTY OF CAMBRIA, } SS:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Cambria held at Ebensburg in the said County, on the fourth day of March A. D. 1901, before the Honorable Judge of the said Court: Upon the petition of divers inhabitants of the Township of Chest, in the said County, setting forth that they labor under inconvenience for want of a public road or highway; to lead from

the Hunt School house on the St. Lawrence and Patton Road to the line between land of Mary Hipps and land of Joseph Hunt on the Road that branches off the St. Lawrence and Patton road at the Samuel Warner estate and leading to Chest Springs. Said new road to be in Chest Township

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law. The Court upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

A. C. Yeager SURVEYOR, and Francis
Parrish, Fred A. Mellon

VIEWERS, to view the ground proposed for said road, and if they view the same, and shall agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desires of the petitioners, and that they make a report of their proceedings to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said County, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, and references to the improvements through which it may pass.

NOTE.—It shall be the duty of all persons appointed in the several counties of this Commonwealth to view and review any public or private road or bridge, if they shall decide in favor of locating said road or bridge, to endeavor to procure from the person or persons over whose land such location may be made releases from all claims for damages that might arise from the opening of such road or the building of such bridge; and in every case where said viewers shall fail to procure such releases, and it shall appear to them that any damages will be sustained, it shall be their duty to assess the damages and make report thereof signed by a majority of their number, and return the same, together with all releases obtained, to the Court of Quarter Sessions, and the damages so assessed shall be conclusive, or may be subject to appeal, review or modification, as may be provided by existing laws in the different counties of this Commonwealth.

"The persons appointed as aforesaid shall view such ground, and if they shall agree that there is occasion for a road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance, and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the petitioners."

"The viewers, as aforesaid, shall make report, at the next term of said Court, and in the said report shall state particularly: first, who of them were present at the view; second, whether they were severally sworn or affirmed; third, whether the road desired be necessary for a public or private road; they shall also annex and return to the Court a plot or draft thereof, stating the courses and distances, and nothing briefly the improvements through which it may pass; and, whenever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said roads at an elevation not exceeding two degrees (except at the crossing of ravines and streams) where, by moderate filling and bridging, the declination of the road may be preserved within that limit."
