

It shall, be their duty to assess the damages and make report thereof signed by a majority of their number, and return the same, toxether with all releases obtained, to the Court of Quarter Sessions, and the damages so assessed shall be conclusive, or may be subject to appeal, review or modification, as may be provided by existing laws in the different counties of this Commonwealth."
