The undersigned, the viewers named in the within and annexed order of your honorable court, respectfully report:

- 1.- That we met at the time and place specified in the notices, to wit; on the fourteenth day of July, A.D., 1900, at ten o'clock in the forencon, at the house of Michael Beck in Washington Township, said county, as required in said notices.
- 2.- That the notices required by law were duly given, that is to say ten days' public notice by not less than six typewritten posters placed in as many public places in the vicinity of the road to be viewed, also written notices to the county commissioners of said county, as will appear from the acceptance of the clerk of said commissioners hereto attached, and also written notices to the supervisors of said Township, as will appear from their acceptance of service of said notice hereto attached, the said notice to the county commissioners and to the supervisors being given more than ten days before the time of said view, stating the time and place at which said viewers should meet to discharge the duties of their appointment.
- 3.- That we were severally sworn according to law, before proceeding to discharge our duties, as will appear from certificate of the Justice of the Peace hereto attached.
- 4.- That we viewed the site and locality of the road proposed to be vacated and laid out, making a personal inspection of the ground

5.- We are of the opinion and agree that the public road commencing at the point opposite that elephone pole along what is commonly known as the Old Portage, where the new road constructed by The Pennsylvania Railroad Company to take the place of the road proposed to be vacated intersects said Old Portage, to a point in the public road of posite the corner of the house occupied by Michael Beck should be vacated for the reason that the same has been cut away and changed by the Pennsylvania Railroad Company in the work of straightening its main line of tracks, and that a public road between said points is necessary. Note.—"It shall be the duty of all persons appointed in the several counties of this Commonwealth to view and review any public or private road or bridge, if they shall decide in favor of locating said road or bridge, to endeavor to procure from the person or persons over whose land such location may be made releases from all claims for damages that might arise from the opening of such road or the building of such bridge; and in every case where said viewers shall fail to procure such releases, and it shall appear to them that any damages will be sustained, it shall be their duty to assess the damages and make report thereof signed by a majority of their number, and return the same, together with all releases obtained, to the Court of Quarter Sessions, and the damages so assessed shall be conclusive, or may be subject to appeal, review or modification, as may be provided by existing laws in the different counties of this Commonwealth."

"The persons appointed as aforesaid shall view such ground, and if they shall agree that there is occasion for a road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance, and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the potitioners."
