TO THE HONORABLE A. V. BARKER, PRESIDNET JUDGE OF THE COURT
OF QUARTER SESSIONS OF CAMBRIA COUNTY.

The Petition of the Undersigned, citizens of Jackson Township
and vicinity, in said County, respectfully represents:

That the part of the public road long since laid out
leading from a public road which leads from Vintondale to the Stone
Pike at or near the old Thomas Rager farm to the public road at
or near Jackson Rager's house, known as the Twin Rocks road (part
to be vacated and supplied) commencing at a point on said road
near where it leaves the old State road, on the lands of Adam
Shuman, in Jackson Township, and ending on the public road at or
near Jackson Rager's dwelling house, in said Township, has become
useless, inconvenient and burdensome to the inhabitants of said
Township.

Your petitioners therefore pray the Court to appoint
viewers to vacate and supply the same by a road to lead from the
point near where the said road leaves the old state road, to the
public road leading from the Twin Rocks to the stone pike at a
point on said road near the public school house on the land of
Daniel Carr in said Township.
