The Undersigned Viewers. Appointed by your Honorable Court to View a Public road, from the rail road crossing on Main street on the Southern end of Hastings Boro. to ~~point on~~ the Hastings and Patton road at a point opposite the House of August Colin. Respectfully submit that we have made the View as directed and recommend that such road should be granted, as we deem the same to be a great Convenience and — a necessity (see draft annexed, stating courses and distances, and noting improvements) No evidence of this we found over the route viewed a travelled road for the entire distance. which travelled road we adhered to in the Main only deviating therefrom in easing angles and reducing grades We therefore pray your Honorable Court to grant the above named road.

We find by reason of a permanent location of road that Archibald Kirkpatrick will sustain damages to the Amount of Twenty dollars and that August Colin will be damaged to the Amount of Thirty dollars

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Cambria held at Ebensburg in the said County, on the Third day of March A. D. 190 2, before the Honorable Judge of the said Court: Upon the petition of divers inhabitants of the Township of Elder, in the said County, setting forth that they labor under inconvenience for want of a public road or highway, to lead from a point at or near the Borough Line of Hastings Pa. near Main Street to a Point at or near line of Charles Huber or Public Road leading from Mitchells Mines to St. Boniface from said Road at or near Collins' house on the Patton and Hastings Road in Elder Township in Cambria County

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to— view and lay out the same according to law. The Court upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

James Campbell SURVEYOR, and Andrew Strittmatter and Joseph A. Gray

VIEWS, to — view the ground proposed for said road, and if they — view the same, and shall agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desires of the petitioners, and that they make a report of their proceedings to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said County, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, and references to the improvements through which it may pass.

NOTE. "It shall be the duty of all persons appointed in the several counties of this Commonwealth to view and review any public or private road or bridge, if they shall decide in favor of locating said road or bridge, to endeavor to procure from the person or persons over whose land such location may be made releases from all claims for damages that might arise from the opening of such road or the building of such bridge; and in every case where said viewers shall fail to procure such releases, and it shall appear to them that any damages will be sustained, it shall be their duty to assess the damages and make report thereof signed by a majority of their number, and return the same, together with all releases obtained, to the Court of Quarter Sessions, and the damages so assessed shall be conclusive, or may be subject to appeal, review or modification, as may be provided by existing laws in the different counties of this Commonwealth."

"The persons appointed as aforesaid shall view such ground, and if they shall agree that there is occasion for a road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance, and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the petitioners."

"The viewers, as aforesaid, shall make report, at the next term of said Court, and in the said report shall state particularly: first, who of them were present at the view; second, whether they were severally sworn or affirmed; third, whether the road desired be necessary for a public or private road; they shall also annex and return to the Court a plot or draft thereof, stating the courses and distances, and noting briefly the improvements through which it may pass; and, whenever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said roads at an elevation not exceeding five degrees (except at the crossing of ravines and streams), where, by moderate filling and bridging, the declination of the road may be preserved within that limit."
