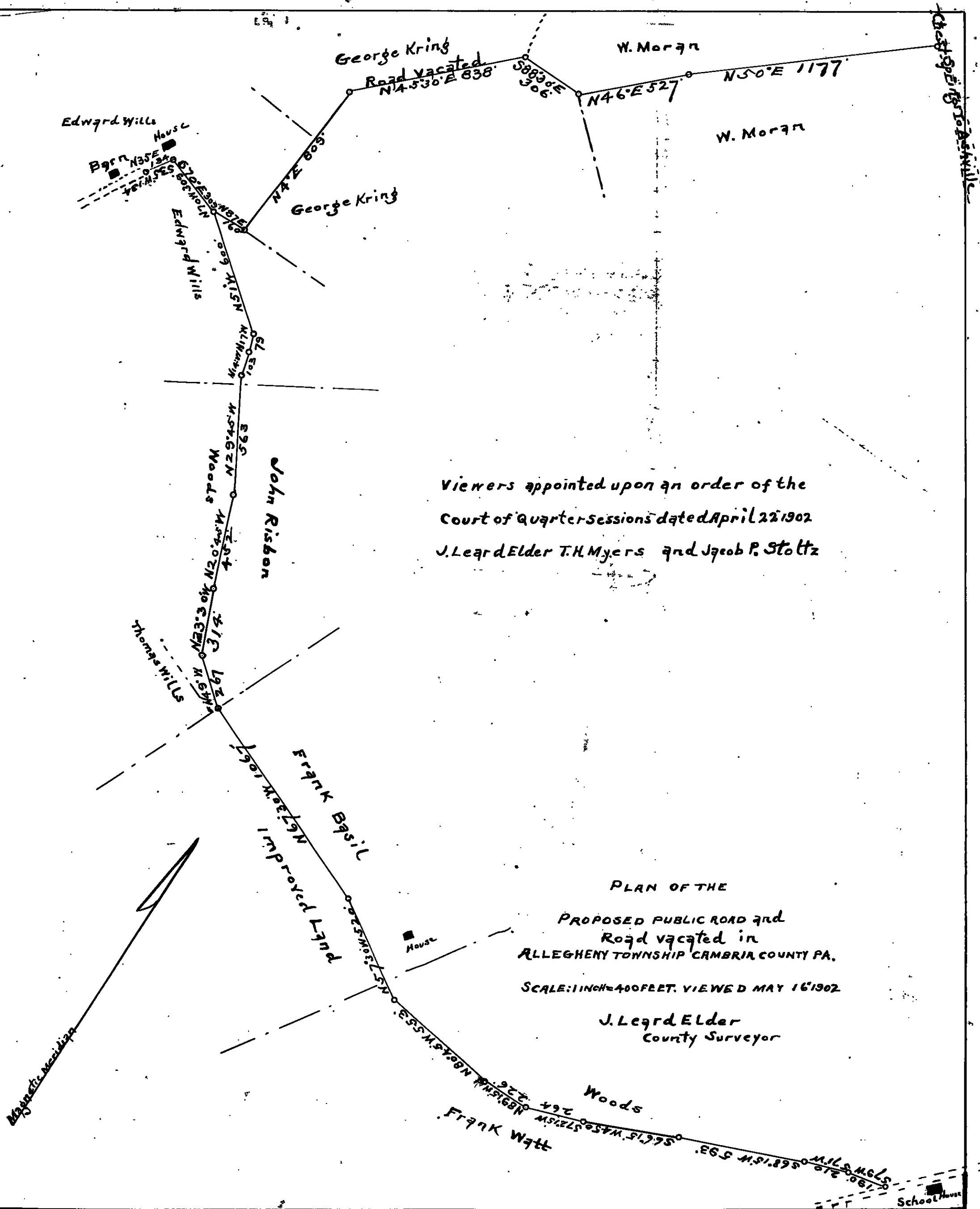

The Sisters of Mercy, a Corporation created and existing under and by virtue of the laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, of St. Aloysius' Academy, Loretto, Cambria County, Pennsylvania, appear and file the exceptions, etc., to the report of viewers in the above mentioned road proceedings and aver:

FIRST; That they are property owners residing along the route of the proposed vacation of public road and that they pay taxes in said Township.

SECOND; That the report of viewers vacating the said road is unjust, unfair and illegal.

THIRD; That the exceptants own property having as an only out-let the road which it is proposed to vacate and which is vacated in the report of the viewers. That their said property faces on said road; that a large ground is in front of said building, wherein live a number of the



members of this order, as well as a number of charity pupils, and whereupon is erected a children's home.

FOURTH; That if the proposed road is vacated, the said academy and grounds of the said Sisters of Mercy will be absolutely without a road leading from that property to the public highway.

FIFTH; That a large number of people use the said proposed road to be vacated as a highway, to come to and from the said Academy, in carriages and on foot, and that if said proposed road is vacated it will work a great hardship to the said property of the Sisters of Mercy, to the Academy and to those in connection therewith and to the pupils at the school. That it would be unjust, unfair, illegal and inequitable to vacate said public road, as recommended by the viewers in their report.

SIXTH; The report does not show that there are sufficient facts upon which the Court can approve the findings of the jury and, therefore, the report should be set aside.

SEVENTH; The report does not show that a proper notice was given to the legally authorized persons to receive said notice. The draft accompanying said report does not set forth the improvements along the route of the said proposed vacation, as well as other matters necessary for the Court to judge this case.

EIGHTH; The petition upon which the Court made the order is fatally defective, in that the termini of the road is not definitely stated. The proposed vacation is not definitely stated and sufficient facts are not set forth in the said petition for the Court to legally appoint said viewers; that the petition is incomplete, irregular and defective and the legal and requisite number of signers have not affixed their names to the petition to vacate.

NINTH; The report does not show that the viewers considered the advantages and disadvantages which would result to the several property owners living along said road.

TENTH; The report is irregular, incomplete and totally defective, being not in compliance with the requirements of law and not in accord with the requirements of reports for the vacation of public roads.
