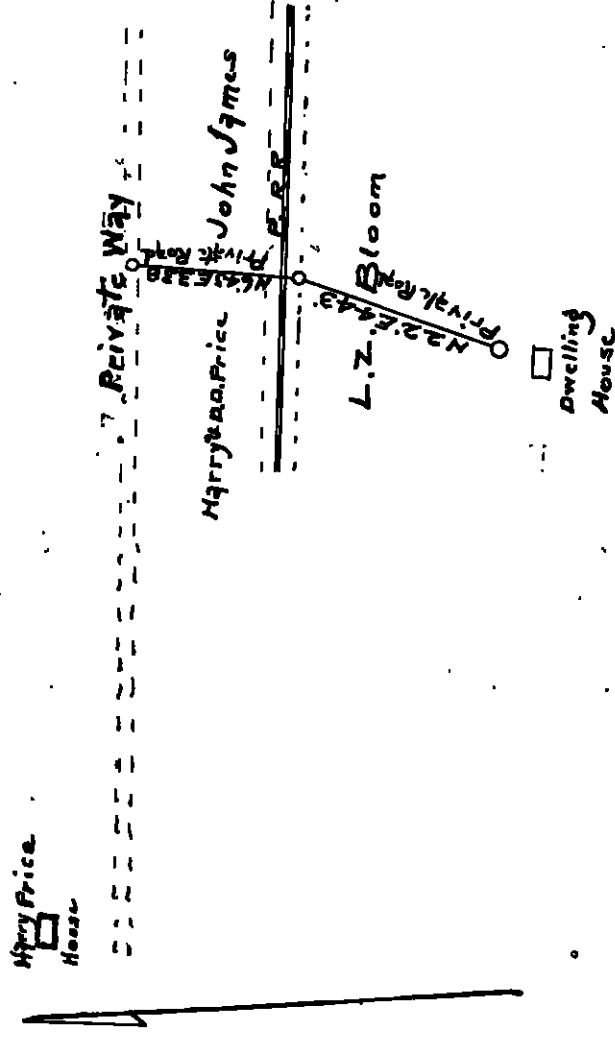


Plan of the Proposed Private Road in

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Cambria held at Ebensburg in the said County, on the Second day of June A. D. 190 2 before the Honorable Judge of the said Court: Upon the petition of L. Z. Bloom of the Township of Cambria, in the said County, setting forth that ~~he~~ labors under inconvenience for want of a private road or highway, to lead from his dwelling-house in said Township of Cambria, to a point sixty rods East from the residence of Harry Pryce, in a private way leading thence to the public highway from Ebensburg to Bradley Junction in said Township of Cambria

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law. The Court upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

J. Laird Elder SURVEYOR, and

Hon Thomas Davis and Joseph Sanders

VIEWERS, to view the ground proposed for said road, and if they view the same, and shall agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desires of the petitioner, and that they make a report of their proceedings to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said County, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, and references to the improvements through which it may pass.

NOTE. "It shall be the duty of all persons appointed in the several counties of this Commonwealth to view and review any public or private road or bridge, if they shall decide in favor of locating said road or bridge, to endeavor to procure from the person or persons over whose land such location may be made releases from all claims for damages that might arise from the opening of such road or the building of such bridge; and in every case where said viewers shall fail to procure such releases, and it shall appear to them that any damages will be sustained, it shall be their duty to assess the damages and make report thereof signed by a majority of their number, and return the same, together with all releases obtained, to the Court of Quarter Sessions, and the damages so assessed shall be conclusive, or may be subject to appeal, review or modification, as may be provided by existing laws in the different counties of this Commonwealth."

"The persons appointed as aforesaid shall view such ground, and if they shall agree that there is occasion for a road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance, and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the petitioners."

"The viewers, as aforesaid, shall make report, at the next term of said Court, and in the said report shall state particularly: first, who of them were present at the view; second, whether they were severally sworn or affirmed; third, whether the road desired be necessary for a public or private road; they shall also annex and return to the Court a plot or draft thereof, stating the courses and distances, and noting briefly the improvements through which it may pass; and, whenever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said roads at an elevation not exceeding five degrees (except at the crossing of ravines and streams), where, by moderate filling and bridging, the declination of the road may be preserved within that limit."

To the Honorable Francis J. O'Connor, President Judge of  
the Court of Quarter Sessions of Cambria County;

We, the undersigned, viewers appointed by the pro-  
posed order, report:

That having first been <sup>severally</sup> duly sworn, <sup>and</sup> all  
being present, we viewed the ground pro-  
posed for the private road therein mentioned,  
and do agree that the same is necessary  
for a private road <sup>and do return</sup>  
for the use of the petitioner, D. G. Bloom,  
the following private road: Beginning  
at the dwelling-house of D. G. Bloom,  
in Cambria Township; thence North twenty-  
two degrees East four hundred and forty-  
three feet; thence North six degrees and  
forty-five minutes East three hundred  
and thirty-eight feet to a point in a  
private way, leading thence to the pub-  
lic highway from Chambersburg to Bradley  
Junction, in said Township.

Personal notice of the time and place of  
meeting to view said road <sup>and</sup> as-  
sess damages was given prior  
to said meeting as shown by copies  
of notices hereto attached; and we here-  
to annex a plan or draft of said road as  
laid out, stating the courses and distances, and  
noting briefly the improvements through  
which the same passes; no damages allowed.
