Barker, President Judge of the Court of Quarter Sessions of Cambria County: -We, the undersigned viewers, appointed by the annexed order, doreport, That in pursuance thereof, after having bern secrally duly swow or affirmed to perform our duties impartially and to the best of our judgment, and having give du public notice, as required bylaw, and having served copier of said notice unpor the Supervisors of the territory, through which such new public road is laid out, and alsoupon the County Commissioners of said County properly lattested copies of said notice being hereto attached, all the vinuers appointed by said order virued the ground proposed for the within mentioned road, and the undersigned do agree that there is occasion for a road, as desired by the petitioners, and that the same is becersory for a public road. and having dur respect to the shortest distance and the best ground for such road me han laid it out in such a manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and, so far as practicable, agreeably to the desire

of the petitiours, and do return for public use the following described road to vit: Beginning near the old Bruscreek Station and neal the house now occupied by William Cotten near Busorek in Bortage Pourship, Theuce south sixty six degrees, thirty minutes east, two hundred and eighty fin feet South forty nine degrus rast eighty one feet, South eighty degrees east two hundred and fifty firefact, South security four degrees rast eighty two feet, South secuty degree rast, ne hundresand twenty sense feet, South eighty fin degrus rast one hundred feet. | Quarter Sessions to be held for said County, stating particularly whether they judge the same |
| necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, and references to the improvements through which it may pass. |

Note.—"It shall be the duty of all persons appointed in the several countics of this Commonwealth to view and review any public or private road or bridge, if they shall decide in favor of locating said road or bridge, to endeavor to procure from the person or persons over whose land such location may be made releases from all claims for damages that might arise from the opening of such road or the building of such bridge; and in every case where said viewers shall fail to procure such releases, and it shall appear to them that any damages will be sustained, it shall be their duty to assess the damages and make report thereof signed by a majority of their number, and return the same, together with all releases obtained, to the Court of Quarter Sessions, and the damages so assessed shall be conclusive, or may be subject to appeal, review or modification, as may be provided by existing laws in the different counties of this Commonwealth."

"The persons appointed as aforesaid shall view such ground, and if they shall agree that there is occasion for a road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance, and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the petitioners."

"The viewers, as aforesaid, shall make report, at the next term of said Court, and in the said report shall state particularly: first, who of them were present at the view; second, whether they were severally sworn or affirmed; third, whether the road desired be necessary for a public or private road: they shall also annex and return to the Court a plot or draft thereof, stating the courses and distances, and noting briefly the improvements through which it may pass; and, whenever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said roads at an elevation not exceeding five degrees (except at the crossing of ravines and streams.) where, by moderate filling and bridging, the declination of the road may be pres
