

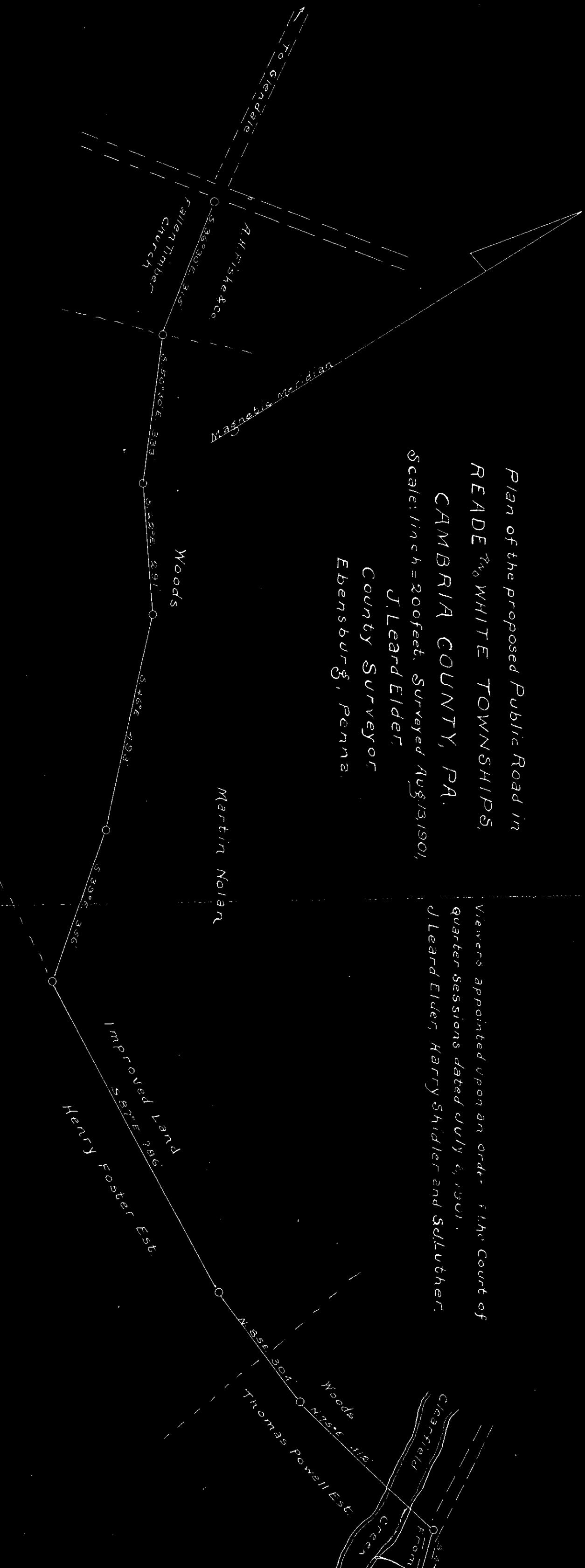
Plan of the proposed Public Road in

COMMONWEALTH OF PENNSYLVANIA, }
COUNTY OF CAMBRIA, } SS:

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Cambria held at Ebensburg in the said County, on the Eighth day of July A. D. 189¹⁹⁰¹, before the Honorable Judge of the said Court: Upon the petition of divers inhabitants of the Township of White, in the said County, setting forth that they labor under inconvenience for want of a public road or highway, to ~~begin in the public road leading from Fallen Timber to John C. Kessler's at a point at or near where the public road leading from Glendale intersects said road in White Township, and to end at a point in the road leading from Van Ormer to Frugality in the Township of Reade where the same is intersected by a road leading from Mountindale in Reade Township~~

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law. The Court upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint J. Laird Elder SURVEYOR, and Harry Shidler and S. J. Luther

VIEWERS, to view the ground proposed for said road, and if they view the same, and shall agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desires of the petitioners, and that they make a report of their proceedings to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said County, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, and references to the improvements through which it may pass.

NOTE.—"It shall be the duty of all persons appointed in the several counties of this Commonwealth to view and review any public or private road or bridge, if they shall decide in favor of locating said road or bridge, to endeavor to procure from the person or persons over whose land such location may be made releases from all claims for damages that might arise from the opening of such road or the building of such bridge; and in every case where said viewers shall fail to procure such releases, and it shall appear to them that any damages will be sustained, it shall be their duty to assess the damages and make report thereof signed by a majority of their number, and return the same, together with all releases obtained, to the Court of Quarter Sessions, and the damages so assessed shall be conclusive, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the petitioners."

"The persons appointed as aforesaid shall view such ground, and if they shall agree that there is occasion for a road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance, and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the petitioners."

"The viewers, as aforesaid, shall make report, at the next term of said Court, and in the said report shall state particularly: first, who of them were present at the view; second, whether they were severally sworn or affirmed; third, whether the road desired be necessary for a public or private road; they shall also annex and return to the Court a plot or draft thereof, stating the courses and distances, and noting briefly the improvements through which it may pass; and, whenever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said roads at an elevation not exceeding five degrees (except at the crossing of ravines and streams,) where, by moderate filling and bridging, the declination of the road may be preserved within that limit."

The Petition of the undersigned, inhabitants of the Township of White, in the said County, respectfully represents:

That your petitioners labor under great inconveniences for want of a public road or highway, to begin in the public road leading from Fallon Timber to John C. Kessler's, at a point at or near where the public road leading from Glendale intersects said road, ^{in White Township} and to end at a point in the road leading from Van Ormer to Frugality in the Township of Reade....., where the same is intersected by a road leading from Mountaineale in Reade..... Township.

Your petitioners therefore pray the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same, according to law; and they will ever pray, etc.

We, the undersigned viewers, appointed
by the annexed order, do report:

That, in pursuance thereof, after
having been severally duly sworn
or affirmed to perform our duties
impartially and to the best of our
judgment, and having given due
public notice, as required by law,
and having served copies of said
notice upon the Supervisors of the
territory through which such new
public road is laid out, and also
upon the County Commissioners of said
County, properly attested copies of said ^{notice},
being hereto attached, the undersigned
viewers appointed by said order viewed
the ground proposed for the within
mentioned road, and the undersigned
do agree that there is occasion for a
road as desired by the petitioners
and that the same is necessary
for a public road, and having
due respect to the shortest distance
and the best ground for such
road, we have laid it out in
such manner as shall do the

least injury to private property, and, so far as practicable agreeably to the desire of the petitioners, and do return for public use the following described road: to wit:

Beginning in the public road leading from Ralle's Timber to John C. Kessler's at a point where the public road from Glendale intersects said road in White Township, thence along line of A. H. Riske & Co. south thirty six degrees, thirty minutes east three hundred and fifteen feet, thence through Martin Nolan's land south fifty degrees, thirty minutes east three hundred and thirty three feet, thence south sixty two degrees east two hundred and ninety one feet, thence south forty six degrees east four hundred and ninety three feet, thence south thirty nine degrees east three hundred and fifty six feet, thence south eighty seven degrees east seven hundred and eighty six feet, thence north eighty five degrees east three hundred and four feet, thence through land belonging to the Thomas Powell Estate, north seventy five degrees east four hundred and twelve feet to the road leading from Van Ormer to Bugality, thence by said road south forty four degrees east two hundred and twenty one

feet to the road leading from
Mountain Dale in Reade
