The report of viewers sets forth that notice was given to the Supervisors as required by law. The exception filed to this branch of the proceedings states that a copy of such notice is not returned with the report. It will be noticed that no exception is filed denying that such notice was given and the only question before the Court is, was it necessary, in order to sustain the proceeding that a copy of such notice be filed. In view of the uncontradicted allegation that notice was given as required by law the filing of a copy of such notice is immaterial.

OPINION OF THE COURT.

To the report of Viewers in the above stated proceeding, T. J. Itell, Esq., Counsel for exceptants, filed in writing, three exceptions. Exception Nos. "1" & "2" are as follows:

No. "1" The report of Viewers does not state that any attempt was made to obtain releases from the property owners through whose land the road lies."

No. "2". The report of Viewers does not state that in determining the question as to what damages were sustained by the property owners, they took into consideration the advantages and disadvantages to said properties by the laying out and opening of said proposed road."

As we read the decisions in the case of road in South Abington Township, 109 Pa. 118 and in re Mellon street, 182 Pa. 398 - 496, it is not required that reports should so state.

Exception No. "3" is as follows:

" No copy of the written notice, properly attested, as required to be served upon the supervisors of the territory through which the said road is laid out, is attached to the report or filed among the records of the Court having cognizance of the matter."

In answer to this exception we may state that there is no allegation that notice was not given and the report sets forth that such notice was given. In the case of the Townmencin road 9 D.R. 850 and in Sewickley Township Road 33 Sup. Ct. 170, it is

decided that where there is an uncontradicted allegation that notice was given as required by law, the failure to attach a copy of the notice is not fatal.

Having disposed of the three exceptions filed to the conclusions above indicated, there is nothing further before us at this time and we enter the following order:

And now, February 7th, 1905, the three exceptions filed to the report of Viewers in the above stated proceeding are overruled at cost of exceptants.

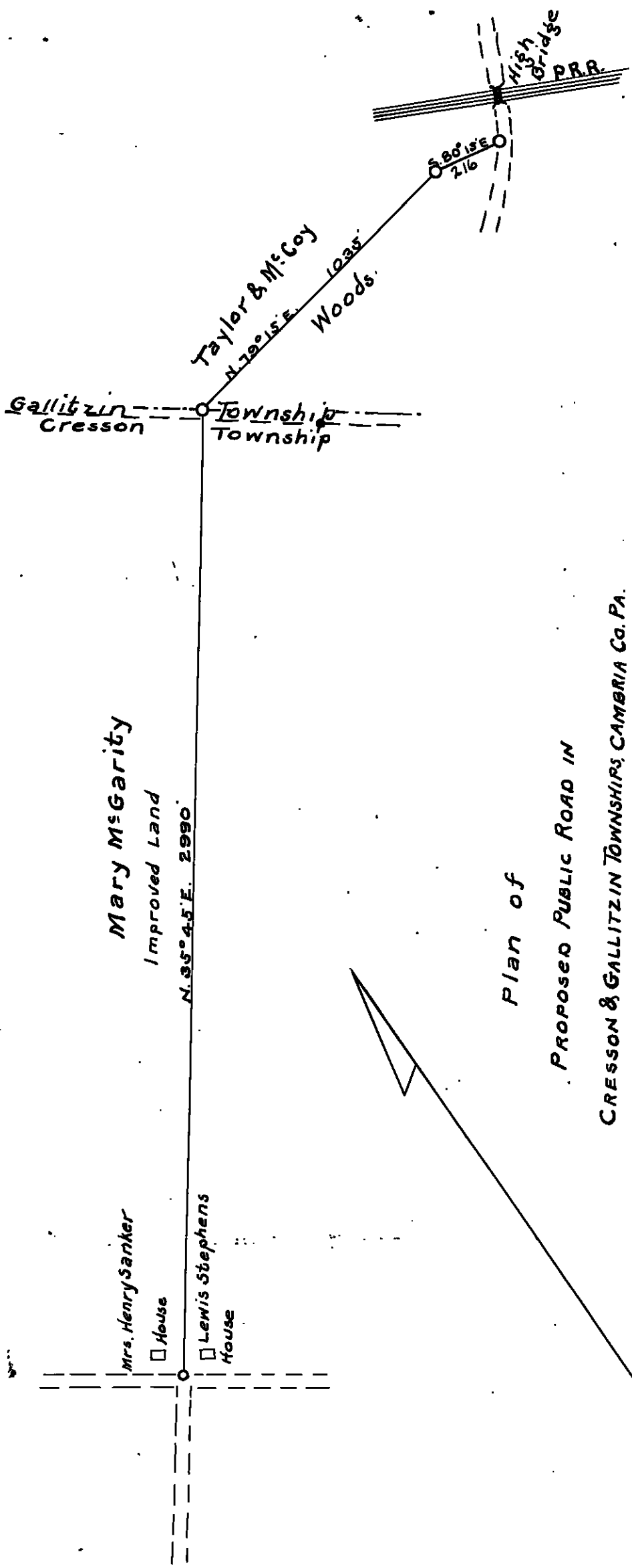

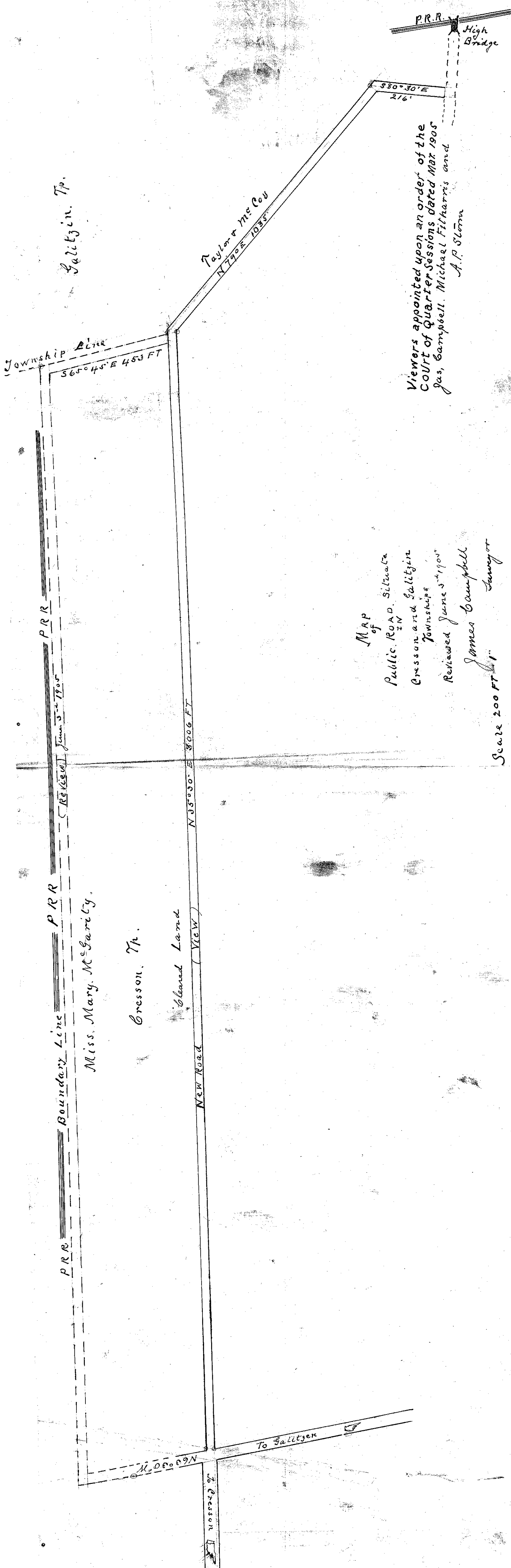
