The petition of the undersigned, inhabitants of the Township of Carroll, in said county, respectfully represents:

That a public road has been long since laid out from Schettig's Mill in said fownship to the Borough of Carrolltown; a portion of this road was laid out from the residence of Michael Flannigan to the Borough of Carrolltown by proceedings of record in the Road Docket of said county, No. 2, pages 38 and 455; and the record of the laying out and erecting of the other portion of said road is to be found in the Road Docket of said county, No. _____, page ____.

(A diligent search of the records has failed to disclose the proceedings referred to, and the petitioners pray the Court for permission to file this petition omitting the reference to the Road Docket and page, as required by rule of Court.)

The petition further represents that four portions of the said existing road from Schettig's Mill to the Borough of Carrolltown have become inconvenient and burdensome to the inhabitants of said Township on account of the steep grades therein. The portions of the said road which have become inconvenient and burdensome as aforesaid are as follows:

First. Beginning at a point in said road about 100 yards North of Cain's Run and ending in said road at a point about 125 yards South of the residence of Peter Farabaugh.

Second. Beginning at a point in said road near the northwest corner of John Farabaugh's orchard and ending in the public road leading from Chest Creek to Carrolltown about 125 yards southeast of Eckenrode's school house.

Third.- Beginning at a point in said public road leading from Schettig's Mill to Carrolltown opposite said Eckenrode's school house and ending in the said public road at a point about 150 yards west of the said school house.

And that said portions of the public road are frequently and for long periods in the winter season blockeded with snow-drifts

so as to be impassible, and that it is altogether practicable by a change in the course of the road between the points mentioned to overcome the steep grade and lay out the road in such a manner as to avoid both the steep grade and the annoyance from snow-drifts.

Your petitioners therefore pray the Court to appoint three persons qualified under the law to view, vacate and supply the portions of the said existing road, agreeable to the Acts of the General Assembly in such cases made and provided. And they will ever pray, &c.



"It shall be the duty of all persons appointed in the several counties of this Commonwealth to view and review any public or private read or bridge, if they shall decide in favor of locating said read or bridge, to endeavor to procure from the person or persons over whose land such location may be made releases from all claims for damages that might arise from the opening of such read or the building of such bridge; and in every case where said viewers shall fail to procure such releases, and it shall appear to them that any damages will be sustained, it shall be their duty to assess the damages and make report thereof signed by a majority of their number, and return the same, together with all releases obtained, to the Court of Quarter Sessions, and the damages so assessed shall be conclusive, or may be subject to appeal, review or modification, as may be provided by existing laws in the different countres of this Commonwealth."
