

TO THE HONORABLE FRANCIS J. O'CONNOR, PRESIDENT JUDGE OF THE COURT OF
QUARTER SESSIONS OF CAMBRIA COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA.

The undersigned viewers appointed by your Honor as shown by the annexed order, to view a road in the Township of Allegheny, in said County of Cambria leading from a point near Beaver Dam Bridge on the road leading from Chest Springs to Gallitzin, to a point near the residence of George Biller on road leading from Chest Springs to Loretto, and to report to the Court upon the matter of widening the same, respectfully represents:

That having given due notice of the time and place of meeting by posting at least ten hand bills in public places in the vicinity of said road for ten days prior to the time of their meeting, they met first in the office of B. W. Litzinger in the Borough of Loretto, in said County of Cambria on Monday the 28th day of November 1904 at 9 o'clock A.M. to enter upon the performance of their duties, and having each been sworn to perform the duties of his appointment impartially and according to the best of his judgment, they then proceeded to view the said road, and having given said road a careful examination and investigation, and finding the same encroached upon at certain places, as shown on a draft hereto attached, they are of the opinion that the said road should be widened so that it will be of the width of thirty feet at all points along the said road, which road as shown on said draft is described as follows:

~~Beginning at a point near Beaver Dam Bridge on the road leading~~
from Chest Springs to Gallitzin, and running thence North twenty-one degrees thirty minutes West one hundred and fifty feet; thence North thirty-three degrees thirty minutes West three hundred feet; thence North forty-five degrees forty-five minutes West five hundred feet; thence North twenty-nine degrees thirty minutes West five hundred feet thence North twenty-four degrees thirty minutes West three hundred

feet;thence North twenty-eight degrees fifteen minutes West eight hundred feet;thence North thirteen degrees West seven hundred feet; thence North seventeen degrees West one hundred feet; thence North forty-seven degrees thirty minutes West one hundred feet;thence North sixty-seven degrees West three hundred and fourteen feet;thence North eighty-eight degrees thirty minutes West five hundred feet;thence North eighty-nine degrees thirty minutes West three hundred and eighty four feet;thence North eighty-six degrees forty-five minutes West four hundred feet;thence North eighty-two degrees fifteen minutes West one hundred feet;thence North sixty-eight degrees fifteen minutes West three hundred feet;thence North seventy-one degrees West three hundred feet;thence North seventy-two degrees fifteen minutes West two hundred feet;thence North seventy-four degrees West two hundred and forty-five feet;thence South eighty-three degrees fifteen minutes West four hundred feet;thence North seventy-one degrees West two hundred feet;thence North fifty degrees West six hundred feet;thence North forty-three degrees fifteen minutes West six hundred and four feet;thence South eighty-one degrees West three hundred feet;thence South eighty-four degrees West three hundred and twenty-eight feet; thence North seventy-six degrees thirty minutes West four hundred feet,and thence North eighty-nine degrees thirty minutes West four hundred and twenty-two feet to a point near the residence of George Biller on the road leading from Chest Springs to Loretto.

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Cambria held at Ebensburg in the said County, on the Nineteenth day of September A. D. 1904, before the Honorable Judge of the said Court: Upon the petition of divers inhabitants of the Township of Allegheny; in the said County, setting forth that they labor under inconvenience ~~for want of a~~ ~~road or highway to lead from~~ by reason of a public road long since laid out in said Township being ~~too narrow in places, the same having been encroached upon and~~ rendering the same too narrow for the proper travel of the public, said road leading from a point near Beaver Dam bridge on the road leading from Chest Springs to Gallitzin, to a point near the residence of George Biller on road leading from Chest Springs to Loretto.

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to ^{widen} view and ~~lay out~~ the same according to law. The Court upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint J. L. Elder, B. W. Litwinger, W. A. B. ~~Stewart~~ Little, F. C. O'Hara, John Phelan, John A. Schwab and J. E. Shields

VIEWERS, to view the ground proposed for said road, and if they ^{widen} view the same, and shall agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to ~~lay out~~ the same, having respect to the shortest distance and the best ground for a road; and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desires of the petitioners, and that they make a report of their proceedings to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said County, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, and references to the improvements through which it may pass.

NOTE. "It shall be the duty of all persons appointed in the several counties of this Commonwealth to view and review any public or private road or bridge, if they shall decide in favor of locating said road or bridge, to endeavor to procure from the person or persons over whose land such location may be made releases from all claims for damages that might arise from the opening of such road or the building of such bridge; and in every case where said viewers shall fail to procure such releases, and it shall appear to them that any damages will be sustained, it shall be their duty to assess the damages and make report thereof signed by a majority of their number, and return the same, together with all releases obtained, to the Court of Quarter Sessions, and the damages so assessed shall be conclusive, or may be subject to appeal, review or modification, as may be provided by existing laws in the different counties of this Commonwealth."

"The persons appointed as aforesaid shall view such ground, and if they shall agree that there is occasion for a road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance, and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the petitioners."

"The viewers, as aforesaid, shall make report, at the next term of said Court, and in the said report shall state particularly: first, who of them were present at the view; second, whether they were severally sworn or affirmed; third, whether the road desired be necessary for a public or private road; they shall also annex and return to the Court a plot or draft thereof, stating the courses and distances, and noting briefly the improvements through which it may pass; and, whenever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said roads at an elevation not exceeding five degrees (except at the crossing of ravines and streams), where, by moderate filling and bridging, the declination of the road may be preserved within that limit."

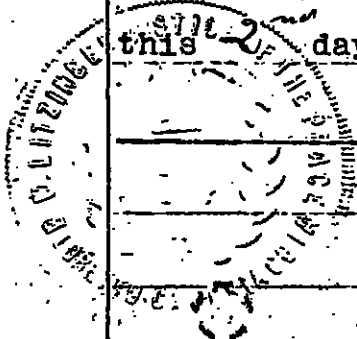

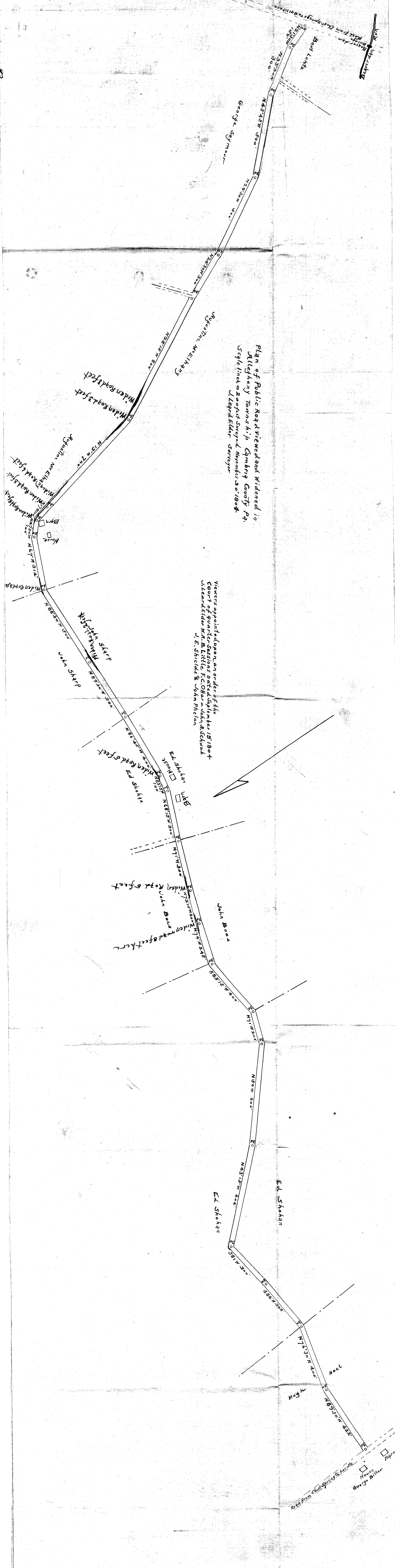
