to perform our duties impartially and to the  
best of our judgment and having given due  
public notice as required by law and having  
served copies of said notice upon the Supervisors  
of the territory through which such new road  
is laid out and also upon the County Commis-  
sioners of said County properly attested copies of  
said notice being hereto attached, all the  
viewers appointed by said order viewed the ground  
proposed for the within mentioned road and do agree  
that there is occasion for vacating and supplying part  
of the Public road leading from the Salt Well School  
House to the village of Plattville as desired by the  
petitioners. We have vacated the following road to wit



At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Cambria held at Ebensburg, in the said County, on the.. **Sixth** .....day of... **March** ..... A. D. 1905 , before the Honorable Judge of the said Court: Upon the petition of divers inhabitants of the Township of..... **Susquehanna**....., in the said County, setting forth that ~~the road from the Salt Well School House to the village of Plattville, and usually known as the Salt Well road; that a part of said road in the Township of Susquehanna, in said County, beginning at a culvert near the end of Jacob Johnston heirs, and ending at a public road in the village of Plattville at the store of G. W. and H. J. Lloyd, has become... inconvenient and burdensome, and the road would be much improved by a change of its route between said points... That if a portion of said road were vacated another road could be supplied at a better grade, on better ground, less exposed drifts in winter, a much shorter route, and more convenient to your petitioners.~~

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to <sup>vacate</sup> view and lay out the same according to law. The Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint ..... **J. L. Elder** ..... surveyor, and ..... **W. E. Weaver and William E. Lantzy** ..... viewers, to view the ground proposed for said road, and if they view the same, and shall agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be as far as practicable, agreeable to the desires of the petitioners, and that they make a report of their proceedings to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said County, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, and references to the improvements through which it may pass.

NOTE. "It shall be the duty of all persons appointed in the several counties of this Commonwealth to view and review any public or private road or bridge, if they shall decide in favor of locating said road or bridge, to endeavor to procure from the person or persons over whose land such location may be made releases from all claims for damages that might arise from the opening of such road or the building of such bridge; and in every case where said viewers shall fail to procure such releases, and it shall appear to them that any damages will be sustained, it shall be their duty to assess the damages and make report thereof signed by a majority of their number, and return the same, together with all releases obtained, to the Court of Quarter Sessions, and the damages so assessed shall be conclusive, or may be subject to appeal, review or modification, as may be provided by existing laws in the different counties of this Commonwealth."

"The persons appointed as aforesaid shall view such ground, and if they shall agree that there is occasion for a road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance, and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the petitioners."

"The viewers, as aforesaid, shall make report at the next term of said Court, and in the said report shall state particularly: First, who of them were present at the view, second, whether they were severally sworn or affirmed; third, whether the road desired be necessary for a public or private road; they shall also annex and return to the Court a plot or draft thereof, stating the courses and distances, and noting briefly the improvements through which it may pass; and, whenever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said roads at an elevation not exceeding five degrees (except at the crossing of ravines and streams), where, by moderate filling and bridging, the declination of the road may be preserved within that limit."

To the Honorable Francis J. O'Connor, Judge of the Court of Quarter Sessions of Cambria County.

The petition of the undersigned citizens of Susquehanna Township Cambria County, respectfully represents:

That a public road was long since laid out and opened, leading from the Salt Well School House to the village of Plattville, and usually known as the Salt Well road; that a part of said road in the Township of Susquehanna, in said County, beginning at a culvert near the end of a long curve south west of the Pleasant Hill Church, on land of Jacob Johnston heirs, and ending at a public road in the village of Plattville at the store of G.W. and H.J. Lloyd, has become inconvenient and burdensome, and the road would be much improved by a change of its route between said points. That if a portion of said road were vacated another road could be supplied at a better grade, on better ground, less exposed drifts in winter, a much shorter route, and more convenient to your petitioners.

Your petitioners therefore pray the court to appoint qualified persons to view the premises and to inquire into the expediency of making such change, and otherwise proceed as directed by the Act of Assembly in such cases made and provided.
