At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Cambria held at Ebensburg, in the said County, on the.....17th.....day of.....April.....A. D. 190 6 , before the Honorable Judge of the said Court: Upon the petition of divers inhabitants of the Township of....Conemaugh....., in the said County, setting forth that they labor under inconvenience for want of a.....public.....road or highway, to lead from a point on a public road or highway at or near the Gossard School House in said township, to a point at or near a blazed sugar tree about one-fourth of a mile east of the watering trough on public road leading from Mineral Point to Franklin Borough, in the township aforesaid on the land of the Cambria Steel Co.....

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law. The Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appointR. H. Shaffer.....surveyor, and.....Anthony Koehler and R. C. Wilson.....viewers, to view the ground proposed for said road, and if they view the same, and shall agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be as far as practicable, agreeable to the desires of the petitioners, and that they make a report of their proceedings to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said County, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, and references to the improvements through which it may pass.

NOTE. "It shall be the duty of all persons appointed in the several counties of this Commonwealth to view and review any public or private road or bridge, if they shall decide in favor of locating said road or bridge, to endeavor to procure from the person or persons over whose land such location may be made releases from all claims for damages that might arise from the opening of such road or the building of such bridge; and in every case where said viewers shall fail to procure such releases, and it shall appear to them that any damages will be sustained, it shall be their duty to assess the damages and make report thereof signed by a majority of their number, and return the same, together with all releases obtained, to the Court of Quarter Sessions, and the damages so assessed shall be conclusive, or may be subject to appeal, review or modification, as may be provided by existing laws in the different counties of this Commonwealth."

"The persons appointed as aforesaid shall view such ground, and if they shall agree that there is occasion for a road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance, and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the petitioners."

"The viewers, as aforesaid, shall make report at the next term of said Court, and in the said report shall state particularly: First, who of them were present at the view, second, whether they were severally sworn or affirmed; third, whether the road desired be necessary for a public or private road; they shall also annex and return to the Court a plot or draft thereof, stating the courses and distances, and noting briefly the improvements through which it may pass; and, whenever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said roads at an elevation not exceeding five degrees (except at the crossing of ravines and streams), where, by moderate filling and bridging, the declination of the road may be preserved within that limit."

To the Honorable Francis J. O'Connor, President of above-named court;

We, the undersigned, persons appointed by the within order of court to view and lay out the road therein mentioned, respectfully report: That in pursuance thereof, after having been severally duly sworn, all the viewers appointed by said order viewed the ground proposed for the within-mentioned road, and the undersigned, all of said viewers, do agree that there is occasion for a road, as desired by the petitioners, and that the same is necessary for a public road. And having had respect to the shortest distance and the best ground for such road, we have laid it out in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and, as far as practicable, agreeably to the desire of the petitioners, and do return for public use the following described road, to-wit: Beginning at a point on a public road at or near the Gossard School House, in the Township of Conemaugh; thence north sixty-four degrees fifteen minutes west, six hundred and thirteen feet; thence north eighty-two degrees fifty-five minutes west, four hundred and fifty-eight feet; thence north seventy-degrees fifty-five minutes west, six hundred and seventy-two feet; thence south eighty-four degrees thirty-five minutes west, one thousand one hundred and seventy-seven feet; thence north eighty-one degrees fifty minutes west, eight hundred and twenty-six feet; thence west six hundred and seventy-nine feet; thence south fifty-five degrees fifteen minutes west, six hundred and ninety-nine feet; thence south sixty-four degrees west, eleven hundred and eighty-four feet; thence on a sixty degrees left curve, two hundred and thirty-eight feet; thence on a thirty-four^{degree} twenty minute right curve, one hundred

and seventy feet; thence on a twelve degree left curve; two hundred and forty-four feet; thence south forty-nine degrees fifteen minutes east one hundred and seventy-two feet; thence south fifty-two degrees forty-five minutes east, two hundred and five feet; thence south forty-eight degrees, fifteen minutes east, two hundred and sixty-five feet; thence south forty-one degrees fifteen minutes east; one hundred and thirty-six feet; thence on a twenty-eight degree right curve, two hundred and eight feet to a point near a blazed sugar tree about one-fourth of a mile east of the watering trough on public road leading from Mineral Point to Franklin Borough, in the township aforesaid, on land of Cambria Steel Company. Said road being at an elevation not exceeding five degrees, except from station 24 to station 44 +, 25 indicated on map hereto attached, where it was not practicable to preserve it within that limit.

The undersigned further report that they endeavored to procure releases from all the owners of the lands over which said road passes, releasing in writing all claims to damages that may arise from opening said road, and did procure releases from P.S. Haney, Christian Gossard, Osoar Yarnick, Jacob Zimmerman, Admr. of Dr., C. Emerson Estate, and Samuel B. Ribblet; but failed to procure such releases from the School District of Conemaugh Township and the Cambria Steel Company; and therefore having taken into consideration the advantages to be derived to the said School District of Conemaugh Township and the Cambria Steel Company from the road passing through their lands, they have assessed no damages, none having been or will be sustained by said parties.

We further report that before the said view public notice of the time and place of meeting of the viewers was given by advertisements put at Mt. Carmel Church, Gossard School House and at the forks of the road leading from Mineral Point to Franklin Borough and to Union Valley, three of the most public places in the vicinity, as well as other points along said road, ten days before said meeting;

printed notice of said meeting was given to Carson Batt, Ephriam Reighard, and J. Earl McCleester, supervisors of Conemaugh Township, and to the county commissioners, ten days before said meeting.

We have hereunto annexed a plot or draft of said road as laid out, stating the courses and distances, and noting briefly the improvements through which the same passes, and herewith return the releases obtained, and a copy of said notices.
